In a case where a first offense includes substance abuse, there is a procedure, which will allow for the possibility of the suspension to be reduced upon completion of a series of counseling sessions, which are approved, in advance, by the Athletic Director.

The amount of games, which constitute the portion of the season for which the suspension will occur, will be determined by the number of games on the original schedule for that particular sport season.

If a student-athlete receives a code of conduct suspension, but does not compete in any sport for one calendar year (for each offense), that may serve as their suspension if approved, in advance, by the Athletic Director.

Penalties, regardless of the level of offense, shall be cumulative beginning with, and throughout, a student's participation in athletics at Alton High School. Penalties shall be based on the most recent level of offense.
