We even dealt Raymond, the eventual state champions, their only loss (Sept 23, 1997) (Nov 3, 1997) (Nov 4, 1997). The main weakness of this team was defense. Coach Pinkham frequently mentioned to the *Monitor* that the team was making too many mistakes defensively (Oct 14, 1997) (Sept 3, 1997). Sweeper Kevin Graham was excellent, however (Aug 30, 1997) (Sept 16, 1997).

The team finished off the season well, losing just 2-0 to eventual state champion Gilford, the game also being the first matchup of Coach Pinkham and his younger brother Dave, architect of the Gilford Boys' Soccer Dynasty (Oct 21, 1999). Bow showed a lot of promise, and some talented players were about to come up.

This team was the first Bow team to be a major contender, and they won the championship. They were described as undersized in the preseason, but they had lots of talent. It was also expected that this would be a team with a lot of depth (Aug 27, 2000). Coach Pinkham expected a good season, but was surprised at how quickly the team gelled (Sept 21, 2000). There were some hiccups in the regular season, including losing both games against Hopkinton, but the team really hit their stride in the tournament. They thumped Pelham, then upset higher-seeded Inter-Lakes in overtime (Oct 23, 2000). The semifinal win against Littleton had the *Monitor* raving about Bow's skill, dribbling, speed, and ball control (Oct 24, 2000) (Oct 28, 2000). The final against Gilford was spoiled by gale-force winds. Bow kept Gilford scoreless in the first half, when the Golden Eagles had the wind. In the second half, Bow dominated and scored 2 goals. Bow was a deserving winner, and won their first championship (Oct 29, 2000). Jon Coache, probably Bow's best-ever player, had an outstanding freshman year.

This was a very strong team, losing only to a powerful Campbell team (that reached the semifinals) in the regular season (Oct 5, 2001) (Oct 24, 2000). In the semifinals against Winnisquam, Bow dominated as the Bears packed their 18-yard box with defenders. Bow had to really fight, and finally got the winning goal in overtime (Oct 24, 2000). In the final rematch with Gilford, the Golden Eagles suffocated Bow's prolific offense for most of the game and had several good chances to score. In the overtimes, Bow gradually began to get more scoring chances as both teams tired out, but couldn't capitalize (Oct 27, 2001). So, the game would be played again. Gilford's defense was again suffocating, and Bow's defense was great as well. The teams were very evenly matched, but Gilford was able to convert one of their chances and the one goal edge held up the rest of the game (Oct 30, 2001).

They plowed through all of their weaker opponents and beat the stronger ones (like Hopkinton and especially Campbell) in impressive fashion (Sept 29, 2002) (Oct 10, 2002). The offense was even better than the year before, and now they had a shutdown defense too. The final against Gilford was a tough game. The weather refused to cooperate, and it was rainy and windy. Both teams played very skilfully despite the conditions. Gilford controlled the play in the first quarter of the game, but couldn't score. Bow took control after that, and got two goals from corner kicks in the second half- the first deflected in off a Gilford player- and were able to contain Gilford's offense. The first goal (the own goal) was Gilford's undoing, and, as Coach Pinkham likes to say, the first goal is huge (Nov 2, 2002).

This team, while not as strong or as consistent as the previous year's side, was still a potent combination, and of course, they also won the championship. The regular season results seem to indicate that the team frequently did not play up to its potential during that time. I remember the tournament games clearly. Hillsboro was an easy opponent, but Gilford was getting their fair share of the play in the quarterfinal before their backs were broken by a controversial penalty kick awarded to us that we converted. It snowballed from there. The semifinal was a doozy. Both teams were very evenly matched, and after Hopkinton scored first, we equalized with a brilliant individual goal by Crisman. Hopkinton had a goal in final seconds of regulation waved off by the referee, to their dismay and bewilderment. I confess that I too was puzzled by the decision. We won on a less-controversial PK that rebounded back to the shooter (Crisman) who buried it. The final was also tense. Belmont had won every game they played, and played a physical, defensive, long-ball oriented game. Play was pretty even until Bow got its goal. After that, Belmont gradually got more and more of the attacking

pressure but couldn't get a goal, being denied by our defense and our goalkeeper (Bonifant November 4, 2012). This was Bow's first back-to-back championship. Also, this was Crisman's final season, and he repeated as the *Monitor's* Player of the Year, I think. He was a treat to watch, for sure.
