**Press Box Update:** Stephen talked about the booster's ability to raise money. Reviewed what we have done this year for fundraising.

Continental Paving has asked the question about naming rights. We are not sure if Continental wants to name the press box or having no name and assuring that no one will be able to name it. Brian asked what is the dollar amount continental is looking to donate, in the past the schoolboard was not in favor of naming rights but if they are looking a substantial donation it might be considered.

The conversation turned to a turf field, should this be added to the request. Having a turf field would help is getting more tournaments at the high school. Brian asked what the cost to maintain a turf field would be. We could use the field for football, soccer, lacrosse and softball if the field is big enough. Rich would like to see if the bleachers could hold 500 people (this is the number of students we have enrolled) having this many seats would allow the school to have pep rally outside and make it beneficial for outdoor graduations.

Brian suggested trying to set up a meeting with Continental prior to the next SB mtg. Run the proposal by Rick & Mark to see if Continental would be willing to take on the entire project, press-box, lights, bleachers, turf field. This may be a long shot but we will never know unless we ask. Once that is done go back to the SB with Continental's proposal, if there is one. Rich offered to go with Cara to Continental, he knows them and might have a better chance of getting a meeting.

Rich has asked if a student could create a rendering of the press box. Make the picture complete with lights and bleachers. This would be a great visual to have at the school board meeting and we could display it at all the booster events.

**Gate Receipts:** Cory is in the process of seeing if these funds can be used for projects related to the athletic department. We are looking to use some of this money for the Press-Box. Cory will get back to Jarod once he has more info.

**Sign Fundraiser**: Event will be held on Friday night April 6<sup>th</sup> 7:00pm at Talent hall. This will be a co-sponsored event with the rec commission. Having them Co-sponsor the event the boosters will not have to spend the \$104.00 on an insurance binder. Eddie has tickets printed (\$30.00 per person), Jim will send out the announcement to Cara to put on the Facebook page.

#### **New Business:**

There is going to be softball / baseball games on Saturday May 5<sup>th</sup> against Fall Mountain. There will be two games for softball 11:00 and 1:30 and two games for baseball 11:00 and 1:30. Rick has asked the boosters to have concessions for that day.

Ryan Yanuszewksi was selected to represent NH in the 65<sup>th</sup> annual Shrine Maple Sugar Bowl Game. He will be raising funds to help the children at Shriners Hospital, and is looking to see if the booster club can assist in a donation towards the Shriners Hospital. Stephen made a motion to donate \$200.00 to the Shriners in the name of Ryan Yanuszewksi. Angela seconded the motion. The motion passed, 7-0-1, Tina Y, is going to get us the information we need to make the donation.
