The Eagle's Perch

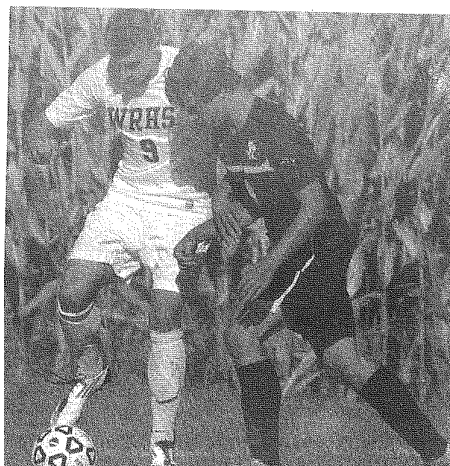
