Mount Carmel take two-game lead in HAC-II over Warrior Run

MOUNT CARMEL—In the first meeting between Heartland Athletic Conference Division II girls basketball heavyweights Warrior Run and Mount Carmel the Red Tornadoes, mainly in the person of Ali Varano, had beaten the Defenders on breakaways created by Warrior Run misses.

Tuesday night Warrior Run coach Jon Weaver told his team that to win the game they had to win the rebounds.

"I said if we can win the boards we can stop the turnovers"

And win the boards they did, with the Defenders col-

lecting 23 caroms to the Tornadoes 11. What Weaver didn't count on, and couldn't even conceive of, however, was that his team would repeatedly turn the ball over.

The result was a 40-31 loss to Mount Carmel which all but guaranteed the Red Tornadoes sole possession of the HAC-II regular season title.

Warrior Run dropped to 15-3, 9-3 while Mount Carmel improved to 17-3, 11-1.

"The turnovers absolutely killed us," said Weaver. "We went over it (with the team). We said, 'Don't dribble to (Varano),' but we did. She's quick and her hands are quick."

After a slow first quarter where both teams seemed to be probing each other Warrior Run led 8-6 but in the second the Red Tornadoes zone seemed to collapse on every Defenders player with the ball and the pressure created several empty possessions for Warrior Run. On the other end of the court Mount Carmel was getting its offense in gear going into the intermission with a 19-11 lead.

Despite outscoring their opponents in the third quarter the Defenders could never get over the hump coming closest in the fourth quarter when they narrowed it to three. But the Tornadoes made their foul shots in the closing minutes to put the game away.

Shining despite the loss was Madi Welliver who had a double double with 13 points and 15 rebounds.

"As a freshman to step up like that is phenomenal," said Weaver.

"She's really come along since the last time we saw her," said Mount Carmel coach Lisa Varano. "She gets after it."

Ali Varano led all scorers with 14 points and teammate Maura Fiamoncini chipped in 11.

"It was a good win," said the Red Tornadoes mentor. "It was a very good defensive effort by my girls. That's what made the difference. That and the foul shooting at the end."

"You have to give it to them," said Weaver. "They play hard."
