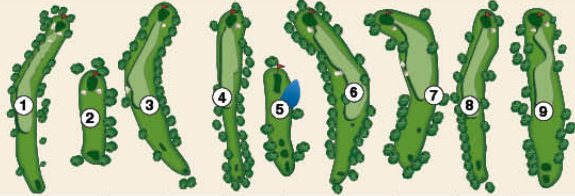

- **Water Hazards** - Defined by yellow stakes.

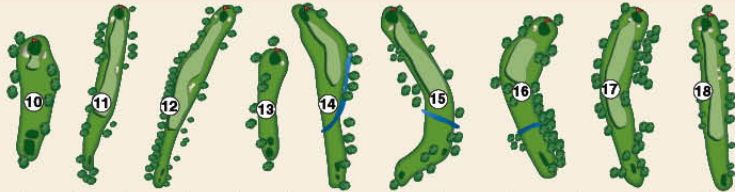
All Yardages are measured to the center of the green.

Handicap 11

The starting hole at Gustin Golf Course is a short, dogleg right par five. You will want to keep your drive up the left side to have the best angle at the green. There is a cross bunker forty yards short of the green that you will want to avoid. The very flat green is guarded by bunkers on the front right and front left. Wayward second shots left and right will be punished by large oak trees and a wooded area. This will be one of your best birdie opportunities on the golf course.

This medium length par three plays tougher than the yardage would indicate. It is normally playing into the prevailing wind and is guarded by a small bunker on the front left of the green and a large bunker on the front right. Par will be a difficult score for any shot that misses this green. Choosing the correct club is always a challenge on this hole.

Handicap 1

This is traditionally the hardest hole on the golf course and one of the toughest in Columbia. This strong par four requires a long and accurate tee shot. There are woods guarding the right side of the hole and trees and a fairway bunker protecting the left. A tee shot that finds the fairway will be left with a mid to long iron to a small, undulated green. Birdies are few and far between here.

Handicap 5



Another tough par four, this hole requires a tee shot hit through an alley of trees to a narrow fairway that slopes left to right. The hole bends slightly left to right. The second shot plays long to an elevated green. The green has a lot of contour to it. It is important to leave the ball in the correct portion of the green to avoid having to putt conservatively.

Handicap 15

Our signature par three, this hole features multiple tee boxes to two different greens. The original green is small and flat, but will require a long iron shot into. The newer green is larger with strong undulation. The hole plays much shorter to the new green. Three distinct teeing areas can provide a lot of variation in distance, angle, and look. A large pond protects the hole and comes into play using either green. The tee shot is downhill to both greens, so be careful to choose the correct club. It is critical to avoid being long or left on either shot.

Handicap 7



There is a beautiful vista on this downhill, dogleg left par four. The player can choose how much of the dogleg they wish to cut off from the tee. The tee shot can be played with a long iron up to a driver. A fairway bunker on the corner of the dogleg finds many a tee shot. Woods protect the left side of the hole, so an aggressive line can result in a trip back to the tee. The second shot plays slightly downhill and can be anywhere from a sand wedge to a five iron.

Handicap 9



This short, dogleg left par four features an artificial teeing area made especially for the University of Missouri by Field Turf. The tee shot is hit through an alley of trees from an elevated teeing area. The hole is protected by a native area and a nest of bunkers on the left side. Trees and long grass protect the right side. The player can choose to lay back off of the tee or take a rip at the green that is 327 yards from the tee. The second shot plays uphill to a green that slopes hard from back to front.

Handicap 3

This hole plays much longer than the yardage would indicate. The tee shot plays straight uphill to a narrow strip of fairway. The hole moves left to right so a long hitter must maneuver their ball appropriately to stay in the fairway. The second shot plays slightly uphill to a green that is extremely undulated, mainly from back to front. The second shot must be placed appropriately or a very difficult putt or pitch await.

If you look closely from the ninth teeing ground, you can see the dome of Jesse Hall in the distance. The tee shot on this hole is 326 yards to the front of the green. In between, though, lies out of bounds to the left along with a large area of long native grass. To the right are numerous trees. The conservative player will play a long iron or fairway wood to the bottom of the valley. From there, a short iron or wedge will be played uphill to a very fast putting surface. Keep your ball below the hole for the best putt at birdie.

The inward nine begins with a strong par three. This hole will require a long iron, hybrid club, or fairway wood to a large green. The bunkers on both sides of the green will come into play for a wayward shot. The green is fairly flat, so all putts are reasonable.

This is a very straight, long par four. The tee shot is slightly uphill and must avoid the large fairway bunker on the right. A very large tree guards the left side and any tee shot hit that direction will have to deal with it. A good tee shot will leave an approach shot of around 150 yards. The green is fairly flat but slopes hard right to left on the left side of the putting surface. Par is a good score on this hole.

Handicap 10



The second and last par five on the course. This hole requires a very accurate tee shot to reach the green in two shots. The entire left side of the hole is protected by a road and woods, which are both through the green. The right side is protected by a large fairway bunker. Any shot that can negotiate both will be rewarded with a long iron or fairway wood into this small green. The green slopes left to right, so keep that in mind when playing into it.

The last par three on the golf course is another strong one. A downhill shot of over 200 yards is played to a large, flat putting surface. Judging the distance is the toughest element of this hole. A bunker that protects the front right of this green gets a lot of use.

It is decision time on this dogleg left, uphill par four. The prudent play is a fairway wood to the fat part of the fairway. The more aggressive player can choose to hit driver and cut off part of the dogleg to get in position for a wedge approach to the green. The left side of this hole is protected by woods and the right side is guarded by a cluster of pine trees. The second shot plays much longer than the yardage to this uphill green that is extremely narrow.

Handicap 2

This dogleg left par four is the longest hole on the golf course. The amount of dogleg cut off from the tee will dictate how much club must be hit into this extremely elevated green. The corner of the dogleg is protected by large oak trees and long native grasses. A lost ball is a strong possibility for any ball straying too far left from the tee. This large, fairly flat putting surface is protected by a bunker on the front left.

Handicap 12

Many options await from the tee of this short, dogleg right par four. A tee shot of 287 yards will reach the front of the green. The tee shot can also be played 200 yards to a flat plateau that will leave a 100 yard shot. A third option is to play a 225 yard shot to the bottom of the valley. Executing that shot will leave a short pitch shot to the green. Danger awaits wayward shots from the tee. Any tee shots left or right can find long grasses and groups of trees. This green is extremely fast from back to front, so play your second shot accordingly.

This medium length par four is a dogleg right with a fairway that slopes severely left to right. Heavy woods line the right side of the hole and scattered trees line the left. The tee shot must be played to the left side of the fairway to avoid ending up in the right rough. The second shot plays downhill to a green that slopes from back to front and left to right. Any approach shot going long will find a very difficult pitch shot. Bunkers protect the front right and left of the green.

Handicap 16



Gustin Golf Course closes with a short, very straight par four. The long hitter can find himself within 30 yards of the green or chipping out from behind a tree. The hole is lined with trees the entire way and features a nest of fairway bunkers up the right side. The fairway is very generous 150 yards from the green and then gets substantially more narrow as you approach the green. You will see a variety of strategies from this tee. Bunkers protect the front right and left of this fairly large and flat green. Many a birdie and many a bogey will be made to close out this golf course.
