Lift A Thon

This year the Penn Manor Comet Football Team participated in the first Iron Comet Lift-A-Thon to support the Four Diamonds. What is the Four Diamonds?

The Four Diamonds mission is to conquer childhood cancer by assisting children treated at Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital and their families through superior care, comprehensive support, and innovative research. Since its creation in 1972, Four Diamonds has helped more than 3,600 children and families and supported a diverse platform of childhood cancer research at Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital, seeking improved treatments and cures to benefit those around the world. Because of the community's steady and generous support, Four Diamonds has been able to assist 100% of the childhood cancer patients who have been treated at Penn State Hershey.

Each athlete lifted 70% of their body weight in 3 core lifts; Bench, Squat, and the Deadlift. The number of repetitions were counted and added together for each of the 3 lifts to determine a total. Each athlete targeted to reach 50 to 80 reps depending on their strength.

At the conclusion of the Lift A Thon, the 30 athletes completed a total of 3,262 reps, 427,055 pounds (214 tons), and raised a total of \$3,260. The top participants included Mark Yoder, Cavan Zechman, Kyle Groff, Michael Morris, Shane Shirk, and Josiah Edwards.



"We had some success," said Brubaker. "But we still have work to do."



Despite pushing out to a 13-0 advantage, the football team committed a handful of key turnovers in the second quarter and never recovered. The result was a 30-16 loss against visiting Lampeter-Strasburg Friday night.

The Comets used a pair of 29-yard field goals by Liam Hart and a 15-yard interception return by Casey McCollum to push out to a 13-0 lead midway through the second frame. Neither team broke through in the third frame and the Comets closed the gap early in the fourth when Hart converted his third field goal and cut the lead to five, 21-16, with 7:41 left to play.

Shane Lawler's 66-yard run put the Pioneers in position to extend the advantage but the Comet defense held and L-S settled for a 22-yard field goal by Denlinger.

"Our offense has yet to score," said Brubaker.
"But our offensive line (Justine Eshleman,
McCollum, Kyle Groff, Mark Yoder, Dan

more consistency.

DALLASTOWN — Penn Manor had plenty of chances to pull off an upset of unbeaten Dallastown on Friday night.

Forcing four turnovers, the Comets frustrated their across-the-river foes, particularly over the final three quarters. Unfortunately, an early two touchdown deficit was too much for Penn Manor to overcome and the Comets fell, 23-13. The loss dropped Penn Manor to 0-3, despite getting two touchdown catches from Grant Gale, the first of which made it 14-7 and the second —a brilliant snare at the goal line —closed out the scoring with 42 seconds to play.

Turning point: Trailing 14-7, Penn Manor's Cole Heckman stripped a Dallastown's Zion Devance of the ball deep in Comets territory for the third turnover of the game.

Star of the game: Comets quarterback Josiah Edwards completed 9-of-10 passes in the first half and finished with 19 completions on 29 passes and the two scores.

Penn Manor: The Comets showed they can play with a quality opponent on Friday night, forcing four turnovers in the 23-13 loss at Dallastown.


However, the Comets will need to start taking advantage of those opportunities, especially rushing the football after 30 carries yielded only 67 yards against the Wildcats.


















Penn Manor ends long drought in 48-12 win at Lebanon

LEBANON — The 707-day wait is over for Penn Manor. The Comets snapped a 16-game losing skid in a big way Friday night, thumping Lebanon 48-12 for their first football win since October 2014. "It feels great," Comets coach John Brubaker said. "I'm happy for the kids. They have worked their butts off for this, and it finally came through." The way it came through is pretty mindboggling. Penn Manor (1-0 Lancaster-Lebanon League Section One, 1-3 overall) racked up 606 yards of offense, including 459 on the ground. Coming into the section opener, the Comet offense had a combined 605 yards in their three losses and had scored only 23 total points. "We showed some signs of being good in those three games," Brubaker said. "We let some things slip away from us, so it was nice to have that all come together tonight." Theo McElheny (135 yards), Tony Dandridge (129) and Evann Jones (127) combined to rush for 391 yards and four touchdowns while guarterback Josiah Edwards completed 7 of 9 passes for 147 yards and a pair of touchdowns, both to Grant Gale.

Turning point: After missing a field goal on its first possession of the game, Penn Manor scored TDs on the final three drives of the opening quarter to take a 21-6 lead. Another score in the second quarter gave the Comets a 27-6 advantage.

Key statistic: The Penn Manor offense racked up 352 yards in the first half, including 258 on the ground. Dandridge and McElheny combined for 182 rushing yards in the opening half.

Quotable: "It was a real dominating effort," Brubaker said of the offensive explosion.



Hempfield edges Penn Manor in overtime for first win

A fourth-down pass in overtime from Penn Manor quarterback Josiah Edwards sliced through the air Friday, against a stubborn September headwind, as the denizens on the bleachers held a collective breath in Landisville. Before the pass, the Comets' final attempt to tie the game, reached tight end Ben Wright, Hempfield's David Martin-Robinson knocked the ball down, to secure a 31-24 victory. Martin-Robinson — a menace to the visiting Comets throughout their Lancaster-Lebanon League Section One clash Friday evening — shouted and charged toward the home sideline. His teammates swarmed him in euphoria. The denizens exhaled and cheered.

Before he deflected the fourth-down pass in overtime, Martin-Robinson, a 6-4, 218-pound junior, turned into a renaissance man under center for the Black Knights. He rushed for 156 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries. He completed three passes for 63 yards and caught another for 29, helping Hempfield build a 21-10 lead by halftime.

The Comets surged back in the second half. Theoren McElheny (22 carries, 147 yards) carried the ball nine times on a 12-play 73-yard scoring drive to open the third quarter. Edwards capped the drive with a 1-yard plunge and later tied the game at 24 with a 6-yard pass to Grant Gale with 5:14 left on the clock.

"That's all you can ask for," Brubaker said, "to put ourselves in a chance to win. And we did, but it

One week after suffering an overtime loss to Hempfield, the Comets hosted section leader Wilson (5-1) this past Friday night. The home field advantage, however, didn't play a role as the Bulldogs secured its 60th straight Section One game, a 42-13 victory.

"They're on quite a roll right now," said head coach John Brubaker. "I don't feel we were intimidated or that we backed down. They scored twice on special teams and had one interception for a touchdown so 21 of their points were not against our starting defense, so to speak, though special teams are indeed a part of the game."

Wilson owned the first quarter, scoring twice including a 67-yard punt return. Manor cut that lead in half when Josiah Edwards found Grant Gale for a 67-yard strike. The Bulldogs responded immediately as Mason McElroy raced 96 yards to pay dirt, pushing the lead to 28-7 at the half. The visitors, with a 155-86 advantage in rushing yards, scored twice in the third quarter before the Comets capped the scoring with a 51-yard pass from Edwards to Ben Wright in the fourth quarter.

"Grant had five receptions on the night for 121 total yards," noted Brubaker, "and Dante Jones again led the defense with tackles. He's having a good year at defensive end." The Comets host Conestoga Valley this week. "They are definitely going to provide a challenge in the air," said Brubaker. "And we need to find more consistency in sustaining drives."

PM Football Scores Homecoming Upset over CV by Mona Steinhauer

It was a memorable homecoming in Millersville this past weekend as Penn Manor upset Conestoga Valley 23-7.

"I'm happy for the kids," said head coach John Brubaker. "It was a fantastic finish and there was a lot of excitement after the game.

"They have one of the top quarterbacks in PA (Grant Stoltzfus) and a winning record (4-2 overall coming in)," he continued. "We were definitely not picked to win but my staff felt that we could possibly have some success."

The Comets got off to a good start, moving the ball 71 yards in 11 plays on the opening drive with Tony Dandridge punching it in from three yards out. Dandridge finished with 119 yards on 20 carries and added two receptions for another 40 yards.

The PAT was blocked and neither team reached the end zone in the second quarter.

CV scored its only TD of the night on their first possession of the second half. Grant Stoltzfus (22-32-2, 224 yards) tossed a 17-yard strike to Zac Mowrer and a successful PAT made it 7-6.

Manor stalled on its next possession and Zach Banta's punt was downed at the CV 3. The Bucks stalled as well and wound up punting the ball right back. Unfortunately, or fortunately for the Comets, the snap sailed out of the end zone for a safety and an 8-7 Comet advantage. They followed that up with a Dandridge 18-yard run and a PAT by Liam Hart pushing the lead to 15-7.

Then the Comets faced their biggest test of the night as the Bucks drove to fourth and inches to goal. Vinny Vozzella broke through the line, forced a fumble, recovered the ball and raced 86 yards untouched to seal the victory.

"That was the best play of the night," noted Brubaker. "If CV scores they're right back in the game." The Bucks finished with 20 first downs to Manor's 16 and passed for 224 yards to Manor's 93. The Comets out-rushed the visitors 169-108 and committed one fewer turnover.

"Dante Jones and Casey McCollum did a nice job getting in the passing lanes, trying to make it difficult for Stoltzfus," noted Brubaker. "And Tony and Grant Gale played very well at the corners holding CV's top two receivers in check. Xavier Roman chipped in with two catches for 40 yard and Mason Sottek and Cole Heckaman combined for 16 tackles.

"We've been preaching about finishing the season strong," he continued. "We were happy the kids came out ready to play. To hold CV to one touchdown was definitely above our expectation." The Comets travel to Warwick this Friday





Playing one of its best first halves of the season, the Comets seemed poised for an upset over Warwick this past Friday night in Millersville. They jumped out to a 21-7 lead in the first quarter and were up 21-14 at the half. The Warriors however, regrouped and scored four unanswered touchdowns in the second half and finished on top 42-27.

"We played an excellent first half of football," said head coach John Brubaker. "Then we threw an interception that they eventually converted and their quarterback had a long run. They gained some momentum and we didn't quite recover. Though the kids didn't give up either. Warwick had two late scores that extended the spread." Manor opened with an 81-yard drive that chewed up almost eight minutes and resulted in a Tony Dandridge 6 yard TD run. Liam Hart's PAT kick was good and the Comets led 7-0. Warwick knotted the score on its next possession with Tyler keeper Trimarchi's one-vard but Manor responded. This time Grant Gale snagged a 10yard toss from Josiah Edwards, avoided a couple of tackles and reached the end zone with a 31yard pass play to open the second quarter. Jonah Barley followed with a one-yard fumble recovery and Hart's two PAT's pushed the lead to 21-7. Warwick cut the lead to 21-14 with a 14-yard pass play and headed to the locker room down one touchdown.

Trimarchi started the second half momentum with a 65-yard run that set up a 6-yard pass play that knotted the score at 21-21 with 5:25 left in the third. Three minutes later, a 52-yard interception return set up their third straight TD, setting the score at 27-21. They scored twice more in the fourth before Dandridge scored on a 2-yard run. "Josiah threw that one interception but he was 16-for-18 for 171-yards," noted Brubaker. "He had a good effort. Grant Gale had a couple of dynamic plays and Jonah Barley and Cole Heckaman led the team in tackles and put some good pressure on their quarterback.

"We're certainly making strides and to have the lead against a good opponent is proof of that," he continued. "I like the direction were going. This game was definitely closer than what the score indicates."



With just two wins coming into the last game of the season, the Comets were looking to play spoiler in hosting Manheim Township this past Friday night. The Streaks needed a win, and some outside help, in order to qualify for the District Three playoffs. They did what they needed to do, handing the hosts a 55-27 defeat.

"Township is a very good football team," said head coach John Brubaker. "They have an all-state quarterback and we had trouble slowing them down.

"We recognized our seniors before the game," Brubaker continued. "Though our record might not show it, this group has been instrumental in turning the ship around and getting us going in the right direction. We still have a lot of work to do, but we're heading in the right direction."

Township (5-2 in Section One, 6-4 overall) broke in front with a 4 yard run early in the first quarter and the Comets responded, tying the score with a 2 yarder by Tony Dandridge and the PAT kick by Liam Hart. The visitors, however, gained some breathing room with three unanswered scores. They took the lead for good on a 74 yard run to the two and a TD by Matt VanGorden. And then took advantage of a snap that sailed over the



Comets punter to quickly take a 21-7 lead early in the second quarter. Grayson Sallade, who finished with three TD's on the night, scored his second straight on a 54 yard ramble to pushing the advantage to 28-7

Manor gained some momentum when Josiah Edwards hit Xaviar Roman (6 receptions for 62 yards) with a 13 yard scoring toss but again the Streaks countered, this time with an 86 yard pass from Luke Emge to Rece Bender and led 34-14 at the half.

Township picked up two more passing TD's to start the third quarter before the Comets found the end zone again as Dandridge, who rushed for 108 of Manor's 144 yards, scored on a 10 yard jaunt. He capped the scoring and matched Sallade's three scores with another 10 yard run late in the fourth quarter.

The Comets (2-8 overall) passed for 241 yards with Edwards connecting on 23 of 29 attempts. The Streaks finished with 282 yards in the air on 9 of 13 attempts and outgained the home team 276-144. Grant Gale chipped in with 44 rushing yards and grabbed 8 passes for another 92 yards. Jonah Barley and Dante Jones combined for 13 tackles.

"Dante had a great game and has been our most consistent defensive player," noted Brubaker. "He finishes the season with 21 solo tackles, 38 assists and 5 sacks.

"Grant, a four-year varsity player, was our leading receiver with 32 receptions for 465 yards. He also scored 9 touchdowns and was a great leader this year," he continued.

Also highlighting the stat sheets is Dandridge with 1138 all-purpose yards as a running back, receiver and kick returner. The senior also contributed with 9 touchdowns this year.


