






Meet Andrew Eshleman;




Meet Athen Vasquez;








Meet Mason Sottek 5'10; 185 pounds #59

The Penn Manor Comet Football Team participated in a community bowling day. The team socialized with each other and other friends of the Penn Manor football program.




LIFIATHON 2017

The Penn Manor Comet Football Team participated in the second annual Iron Comet Lift-A-Thon to support the Four Diamonds. The Four Diamonds mission is to conquer childhood cancer by assisting children treated at Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital and their families through superior care, comprehensive support, and innovative research. Each athlete lifted 70% of their body weight in 3 core lifts; Bench, Squat, and the Deadlift. The number of repetitions were counted and added together for each of the 3 lifts to determine a total. Each athlete targeted to reach 50 to 80 reps depending on their strength.

At the conclusion of the Lift A Thon, the 20 athletes completed a total of 2,825 reps. 

Manor capitalized on Ben Wright's fumble recovery when Edwards hit Taraje Whitfield with a 38-yard strike and Liam Hart cashed in on the PAT kick with 10:27 left. Lampeter quickly countered. Taking advantage of five Lebanon turnovers, the gridiron team ground out a 35-20 win over the visiting Cedars this past Friday night to collect their first win of the season. "I thought we played well," said head coach John Brubaker. "Lebanon is pretty talented and might have one of the best quarterbacks in the league."

The league opener featured 226 yards and three touchdowns by Ben Wright as the Comets broke a 20-20 third quarter tie with a dominating 15-0 final frame. Wright also stopped the Cedars with a goal line interception and recovered a fumble. Manor started strong, scoring first quarter TD's on short runs by Josiah Edwards and Wright and led 13-0 at the break.

The Cedars regrouped and put together a solid game plan in the third, outscoring the hosts 20-7 to tie the game heading into the fourth. "We definitely controlled the first half," said Brubaker. "But then a few errors let them back in. It was frustrating but we got a positive response to that adversity." The Comets, behind Wright's 25-yard scamper and Edwards with a 28-yard run to the end zone, capped the fourth quarter scoring.

Lebanon countered Manor's 324-yard rushing game with 310-yards in the air. Liam Hart successfully booted three field goals and Nick Baker hauled in a two-point conversion pass that put the Comets in front for good, 28-20.

"Casey McCollum had a fantastic game on the offensive line," praised Brubaker. "He's the guy we like to run behind. Josiah, Cole Heckaman, Theoren McElheny and Ben accounted for all 340 of our rushing yards so we have some diversity in our backfield.

"And we moved Evan Jones to defensive end this week and, with three sacks, he made a positive response to the move," he continued. "Mike Brown, a first year starter, added two interceptions. He's been consistent in

"We didn't generate much offense in that first half but we definitely played better after that," said head coach John Brubaker. "We had more fire in the second half but we need that for four quarters. We showed signs of doing things right. We just need more of it."

Josiah Edwards threw touchdown passes of 16 and 58 yards to Taraje Whitfield and Josh Gibson, respectively, to put the Comets in front. The Knights, however, countered with a five-play, 79-yard drive and secured the win with a 33-yard passing TD.

On the road Friday night the Comets gave up three first half touchdowns and never quite recovered, dropping a 35-12 Section One result against Wilson.

Despite the finish, the game opened in Manor's favor. After stopping the Bulldogs on their first series, a high snap on the punt gave the Comets the ball on the Wilson 9. The hosts stopped three run attempts and then not only blocked the field goal attempt but ran the ball back 89 yards for a 7-0 first quarter lead. Wilson (3-0 L-L, 4-2 overall) then ran off four unanswered touchdowns, two in the second frame, to take a commanding 28-0 lead. They were led by Iggy Reynoso and Connor Uhrig. Reynoso became the 4th player in Berks Co. history to pass the 4,000 career rushing mark, going 165-yards on 21 carries while Uhrig became the 4th Wilson QB to throw over 3,000 career yards, passing for 202 against the Comets.

The Comets scored the final two TD's of the game with Josiah Edwards hitting Josh Gibson with a 55-yard strike and Zach Banta hooking up with Logan Legenstein on a 42-yard toss. Both two point conversion attempts were denied.

The Comets finished with 232 total yards while the Bulldogs piled up 395 in a game that featured zero turnovers by either team.

Friday the 13th did not cast its spell on Penn Manor's football team. The Comets rolled in to Witmer and rolled over the favored Buckskins of CV, 33-17, and spoiled their Homecoming.

"It was a fantastic night," praised head coach John Brubaker. "This was the start of a new four game season. We wanted to be physical on the offensive line and swarm the ball on defense. The guys were enthusiastic and they executed our game plan."

Manor went in front early and often in the first half and led 25-3 at the break. Taking advantage of a Tanner Schwilk interception, the Comets needed just six plays and a one-yard plunge from Ben Wright to get on board.

After blocking the extra point, CV looked to counter with Schwilk finding a couple of open receivers but the Comets not only forced but recovered a fumble and took advantage of another turnover. This one resulted in a 3-yard scamper by Wright and a 12-0 first quarter lead.

After giving up a 30 yard field goal early in the second quarter, Comet QB Josiah Edwards extended the advantage with a pair of TD's, racing 25 and two-yards to pay dirt and that commanding lead.

"Josiah ran some counter plays to open things up," said Brubaker. "He finished with 170 rushing yards and as a team, we rushed for 427, a season-high."

CV gained its footing in the second half, outscoring the visitors 14-8 but it wasn't enough.

"We had Taraje Whitfield covering Jose Barbon and he did a great job," noted Brubaker. "He tipped a pass in that first series that was a huge play. And Jake Hollinger came up with that early interception and added a first half sack as well. Evann Jones also played well, adding two sacks and a couple tackles for a loss," he continued. "Ben and Cole Heckaman ran hard and Casey McCullough dominated the offensive line. We had numerous guys step up. Everyone worked hard."



For the second time in three games the Comets rushed for over 400 yards. And for the second time in three weeks they finished on top. This past Friday night in Lancaster, the Comets, with a season-high 446 rushing yards on 61 carries, fought from behind and earned a hard-fought 31-21 win over McCaskey.

Josiah Edwards and Evann Jones, who also scored three touchdowns, both rushed for over 100 yards and the Comets picked up three interceptions to hold off the Red Tornado.

"We did a great job moving the ball," said head coach John Brubaker. "Our option game was consistent. I think we only punted once in the first half."

The hosts returned the opening kickoff 98-yards to pay dirt but the Comets responded with back-to-back touchdowns by Evann Jones and a pair of PAT kicks by Liam Hart to go in front 14-7 at the end of the first quarter.

Up to the challenge, McCaskey knotted the game at 14-14 with a 30-yard passing score early in the second frame. The Comets again jumped in front when Jones scampered 29-yards for his third TD of the night only to see the Red Tornado return the favor with an 89-yard passing TD to Isiah Speller to once again knotting the score. The visitors, however, had the last say. Edwards, who also passed for 54-yards on 4-of-6 attempts, scored on a seven-yard keeper and the Comets led 28-20 at the half. Hart booted a 30-yard field goal in the third quarter to cap the scoring.

"That first half was full of offense and the second half was full of defense," stated Brubaker, "though we did have opportunities." Manor had two touchdowns called back after holding penalties and they missed a field goal in the second half.

"We clamped down on the defense in the second half and did a better job denying the long pass," noted Brubaker. "We secured three interceptions that half.

"This was a good team effort," he continued. "A lot of guys contributed. The offensive line (Joel Stoner, Elliot Lawrence, Paisun Harris, Casey McCollum, and Ryan Mahoney) opened holes and Cole Heckaman and Theoren McElheny did a nice job running the ball. Zach Banta picked up an interception and caught three passes for first downs and Mason Sottek led the team in tackles.

"We've been competitive this year and we've been resilient," he continued. "And we have one more chance to see what we can do."

The Comets (3-3, 3-6 overall) travel to Neffsville Friday night to take on Section One leader Manheim Township.


