



- Work-a-Thon is our annual day of service in which students, staff, and parents spend the morning volunteering in the greater Lansing area




MARY FINEIS VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH



Matt's goal as a coach is to help the young men on his team to become better tennis players, but more importantly better young men, and, as a team, grow together in the way that God has intended for them.





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




