Have a safe and wonderful summer. See you on the fields in the fall! Go Cougars!









All income for the year has been received; however, expenses for Spring Sports are still coming in. Uniforms are on a 3 year rotation. This year we purchased uniforms for volleyball, boys cross country, girls tennis, gymnastics, wrestling, hockey, swimming and one jersey each for baseball JV and softball JV. These are all teams with a small number of participants. Next year we are buying football and boys basketball uniforms so some profit must be carried over to assist in that purchase.

Another item to note is that Cougar Club has committed \$25,000 (\$5000 per year for 5 years) to the Athletic Foundation earmarked for Southview Athletic Facilities.
