The 2015-2016 year has been another *great* success for the SWG Cowboys baseball program. The time and effort invested by all of the above was impressive and inspiring, to support the baseball program, show continuous improvement to facilities and ensure an enjoyable experience for the players and their families not only during the season, but during the offseason, and beyond to next year. The baseball booster club also enjoyed tremendous support of the Executive Committee and our Athletic Director.

The JV team finished with a record of 12-8. The varsity team finished with a record of 22-7 and 8-2 in conference play, first place in Piedmont Triad 4A...Conference champions!! The Cowboy baseball team also advanced to the 3rd round of the 4A state playoffs, hosting and winning their first round game, then winning on the road at #1 seed Southeast 2-1, before falling to eventual 4A State champion North Davidson, 4-2.

The team was led by 2 time captains Liam Hales and Kyle Blendinger. Although this tight knit group showed tremendous teamwork and support for each other, and every player contributed throughout the year.... there were some individual accomplishments and recognition deserved. Kyle Blendinger was named Piedmont Triad 4A conference pitcher of the year. Jacob Edwards was co-conference player of the year. Kyle and Jacob were joined in all conference recognition by Patrick Callaghan, Garrison Thornton and Tom Grose. Congratulations to these young men.

The 2015-2016 school year has been another successful year for the SWGHS Baseball Club. During this past year, through Membership, Various Fund Raisers, Donations, Annual Reverse Raffle/Silent Auction, we have generated \$30,338 in revenue (Plus \$2,000 pledged, but not received until after year in July 2016). The financial status for the booster club remains strong. We started the year with a positive balance of \$2,950.25 and ended with a positive balance of \$6,259.28 as of June 30, 2016 with a \$2,000 donation that was pledged before year end, but received after year end.
