### Six-run inning sinks Vikings, 6-1

MOUNT UNION — For six of the seven innings in yesterday's game at Mount Union, Glendale pitcher Steve Wagner allowed no runs on only four hits. However, in the second inning, he was rocked for six runs on five hits, two walks and two errors and Mount Union cruised to a 6-1 win in District 6 AA baseball action.

Mount Union pitcher George Bilger sailed through the Glendale lineup, allowing four hits and striking out nine Glendale batters. He had a shutout going until the bottom of the seventh inning.

Each team managed just a walk in the first inning, but when Mount Union, who was designated as the visiting team for the game came up in the second the floodgates opened.

Mount Union right fielder Norm Bilger opened the inning with a walk and advanced to second on a fielder's choice. First baseman Wade Stubbs followed with a single up the middle scoring Bilger for the game's first run.

Shortstop Mark James singled between short and second and third baseman Tom Huff lined an RBI single to center, scoring Stubbs. James went to third when Glendale center fielder Rob Burmeister overran the ball. Leadoff hitter Todd Sunderland drew a walk to load the bases.

With the bases full, second baseman Lenny Leonard lined a single to left scoring James and Huff, and then Leonard came in when Glendale left fielder Dan Jasper missed the cutoff man and overthrew catcher Chip Clarkson. With runners on sec-

ond and third, Jason Heidel brought both runners home with a single to deep right field giving Mount Union a 6-0 lead.

"One bad inning killed us," said Glendale coach Jeff Wagner. "We always seem to have one. Wagner pitched a good game. He settled down after the second and shut Mount Union hitters down."

Wagner walked three and struck out three in the complete game loss.

"If we had gotten a few key hits we might have been in this ballgame," Wagner said. Glendale left seven men on base including stranding men on second and third in the fifth with one out. Bilger induced Glendale first baseman Cory Cree to ground out to second and struck out Rick Snyder to snuff out Glendale's only real threat.

Glendale managed to manufacture one run off Bilger in the bottom of the seventh inning as the wind kicked up and a storm rolled in over the field. Wagner led off the inning with a walk, stole second and went to third on a Bilger wild pitch.

The swirling winds picked up, turning the infield into a dust storm and Glendale second baseman Scott Misiura knocked in Wagner with a fielder's choice to third.

Mount Union head coach Nick Imperioli summed up the game in "two words, George Bilger." He said he considered taking Bilger out after the fifth to save him for their next game, but decided against it.

"I've seen enough high school games to know you never have enough runs," Imperioli said. "The way that dust started kicking up in the seventh

anything could've happened and I just decided to get the district win."

Imperioli thought Wagner did a good job. "Their pitcher did an excellent job, he mixed up speeds well and kept the ball in the strike zone, we just had that one offensive inning."

Bilger allowed single base runners in each of the first four innings, with Cree getting to third in the third inning on a double and a wild pitch. Bilger got out of the inning on a ground out to short. Before Cree's double Bilger had struck out five in a row.

Glendale's other three hits were singles by Mike Ninosky, Dan Jasper and Burmeister. James led Mount Union going 3-for-3 and scoring a run as Sunderland went 2-for-3 with a run scored.

Although the Vikings' playoff journey has ended, they finish out the regular season this afternoon when they host Juniata Valley.
