

Another Wagner no-hitter stops Cards

FLINTON — Sometime, somewhere, someone is going to get another hit off Jen Wagner — or maybe even score an earned run.

That someone most likely will not be DuBois Central Christian.

Wagner blew away the Cardinals (0-2) Thursday, firing her eighth career no-hitter as Glendale mashed DCC, 11-1, in five innings

The Vikings are now 4-0 on the season and 1-0 in the Moshannon Valley league after yesterday's

opener.

Glendale scored six times in the first inning and banged out a dozen hits against DuBois Central's Kim Taylor. Wagner rapped three hits, and Nicole Smith, Sherri Frisco, and Roxanne Jasper each hit safely twice for the Lady Vikings.

"That's the story this year — we're hitting," Glendale coach Pat Pino said of the Lady Vikings' sticks, which were spraying hard line drives all over the field

against the Cards."

"We're scoring runs," he said.
"We've scored 38 runs in four games, including three fiveinning games. As long as we hit the ball like that, it's going to be tough to beat us."

The game was ended by the ten-run rule with two out in the fifth when Jen Koteas drove in Connie Jasper with Glendale's eleventh run on an infield out.

Wagner struck out nine hitters, and missed a perfect game by

walking the game's first hitter, Kelly Sekula, who later scored on an error.

Sekula drew Wagner's first

walk of the year.

Wagner had a one-and-two count on Sekula in the first inning before letting her get away to first base with three straight balls. Sekula tried to steal second and the throw went into center field.

The DCC second-baseman raced all the way home with the Lady Cardinals' only run of the

game.

The Lady Viking junior hurler has now thrown a pair of nohitters this year, allowed only a single earned run while winning all four of her starts.

"She's starting to pick up her speed now," Pino said. "She can get faster yet, though; she threw

a lot faster last year.

Showing no ill effects from pitching seven innings just 24 hours earlier, Wagner retired most of the Cardinals with ease.

"She just gets stronger," the coach said. "If we played tomorrow, she would be even stronger tomorrow. She just doesn't get tired."

Glendale tore into Taylor for five straight hits to start its first inning, scoring six times before

an out was recorded.

Koteas led off with a bunt single, Roxanne Jasper lined a single to left, Wagner smashed one to short for a hit, and clean-up hitter Valerie Smeal clouted a fly ball over the left-fielder's head for a double.

Nicole Smith bashed a single up the middle and Nicki Turner reached base on a fielder's choice to keep the rally alive. Turner eventually scored the last run of the frame on a throwing error.

Roxanne Jasper singled to left in the next inning and came all the way around from first to score the seventh run on another throwing error by the Lady Cardinals.

The Lady Vikes added three more in the fourth inning on Sherri Frisco's triple, a double by Wagner, Smith's single, and a DuBois Central error.

DCC hitters laid down three bunts while attempting to bunt in

many more at bats.

The Lady Vikings return to action Wednesday, visiting the same Lady Cardinals from DuBois Central Christian for a Moshannon Valley League rematch.


