December 3, 2018 Sports Booster Meeting - Meeting started at 6:00 pm

Attendees: Susan Anderson, Kim Douglas, Amy Emmatty, Jonathan Frohm, Dan Coghlan, Kelli Jordan, Jennifer Schoenefeldt, Iris Britt, Byron Britt,

Sports Booster President, Amy Emmatty: We have golf tournament news that we will get to later in the agenda.

Recording Secretary's Report, Susan Anderson: Printed copies of the November minutes were available for review. It was discovered that edits were not received therefore the minutes were not approved. The November minutes will be updated and sent for email approval by the Board, so they can be posted to the website prior to the next meeting.

Athletic Director, Jonathan Frohm: Winter sports are off and running. The Cheer coach position has been posted. Other than that, we are staffed for the rest of the year. Everything else is going great. End of next winter season/early spring the gym renovation will start. Jonathan has a renovation meeting this week and will ask for dimensions of the new gym, so we can determine specifications for the new scorer's table. He will also start think about other items that athletics may need after the renovations are complete to use in next year's wish list.

Wish List Update, Amy Emmatty: We have had an amazing success and lots of contributions. To date we have raised \$11,665 and running the fundraiser through the end of this year. Football is the largest benefactor. Most donations are coming from those with personal ties to specific teams – ex. Softballs donated by alumni who used to play for the team. We need to engage soccer, basketball and volleyball teams to help with fundraising for new soccer goals and the new scorer's table. See attachment for wish list details.

Membership, Stephanie Naski: We received an additional \$435 in membership this month. Our Current total is: \$28,925. We have 58 Super Hornet, 83 Hornet, 22 Solo Stinger, 13 Nest of Tickets, 18 Faculty/Coaches. The total membership count is 194

Last year we sold a total of 162 Memberships, so we are ahead. At this point last year, we sold one more regular price membership at \$150, and the remaining sales were all on discounted memberships (bringing in \$1310).

Sponsorship and Advertising, Monica Snowden: Thank you letters, Hornet item, framed picture and thank you from Sponsor Night delivered to all 4 sponsors. Tax deductible verbiage directs them to determine tax deductible amount per our conversations with Dannielle, Amy, and former Booster officers.

Thank you letters mailed to all advertisers as well in mid-October.

New letter created with wish list on back of letter for new business solicitations. Letters mailed to 9 local businesses, will follow up in person with those 9 by 12/10. Need volunteers to visit businesses; none so far after calls for help in newsletter for a few weeks I need help with visiting businesses. Do any booster board members have ideas on parents who might be in position to help or have relationships that we know of?? Please send them my way and I can connect/ask them.

Arbor Company: donating to baseball banner for \$1000. Originally, they thought they could do Booster donation as well, too but they cannot but will keep us in mind for future. How do we want to handle them as contact for future? Goes back to our last month conversation of crossover/double dipping between individual teams/booster.

Applying for donation/sponsorship with Dick's Sporting Goods and looking into a discount day for Boosters. Great Falls basketball did this recently and I got 20% off (even brand names that normally are excluded). Thinking if the discount day worked out, we should shoot for a late winter/early spring day when we can have time to push communication (we send email with Dick's pdf coupon) and good timing for spring sports purchases.

Need to follow up with Iris about revamping sponsorship package. Program advertising isn't a draw at this point. Suggestions welcome on how to revamp.

Winter program: I remember that we talked about 1 program from winter/basketball. (game on 11/27 there wasn't program) I can't remember who is handling printing of program for this?

Iris is willing to help now and with future fundraising as well as assist with revamping our sponsorship packages.

Communications Secretary Report, Susan Anderson: Discussed what the Boosters would like to see in the weekly email and how detailed we should get with specific sports and their achievements. Reminded everyone that achievements are pulled directly from the Twitter feed and we do have a link to the athletics website. Further discussion was tabled for next meeting when we have greater attendance. Jonathan will remind coaches to keep their pages updated. Jonathan will also tweet when there will be a Booster meeting to encourage attendance.

Concessions Report, Kelli Jordan: The team has been moving items from the outside stand to the inside stand to prepare for basketball and gymnastics. As of now they are only serving one hot item at the inside concession stand, pizza, due to space constraints. There is some consideration regarding bringing a popcorn machine inside, but volunteers need to clean it after each use.

After school sales are down. The stand is open until 3:30pm. Most winter sports have practice right after school, so the kids eat later and some practice off site.

Apparel, Kim Douglas & Jen Schoenfeldt: There are two home basketball games, 12/14 and 1/11. Kim will need help 12/14 because Jen will be unavailable. Kelli offered to help that day. The apparel sales will be set up in the foyer.

There are also plans to come in one day during lunch and sell to the kids, with advance notice. The date has not yet been set.

Treasurer, Danielle LaRosa: Our Core Business is \$38,633 ahead of last year. That includes the close to \$10k from the Wish List. Amy will report a higher number than I have recorded for the wish list. This is because she has checks that I have not yet received.

The tax returns were filed on time. We are in the process of loading the last five years of tax returns onto our website.

The balance sheet shows a large accounts payable of \$4,355. Most of that is owed to Gregorrio's Trattoria for concession pizzas. We have been in touch with Gregorrio's often to try to get an invoice from them to pay. We did send them a spreadsheet of what we owe them, in the hopes that they would use that to generate an invoice.

We returned the Band's \$100 security deposit, less \$23 which was the cost for us to replace the door to our popcorn machine.

We have new reimbursement procedures, which were sent to the Board last week. They will soon be added to our website.

Old Business: Golf Tournament update. There was a meeting, run by Alumni parents, held last Tuesday and it was decided to move forward with the golf tournament in the spring. The date will be June 17 and it will be held at Algonkian Golf Course. The price will be \$150 per golfer. In January a save the date will go out. There is anticipation of raising between \$4,000 -\$8,000. We will encourage every sport to have at least one foursome.

Volunteers are needed, this is an ongoing endeavor in all aspects of the Sports Boosters.

New Business: There was no new business.

Meeting adjourned at 6:40pm; next Meeting will be held on January 7, 2019.
