October 1, 2018 Sports Booster Meeting - Meeting started at 6:03 pm

Attendees: Susan Anderson, Jennifer Schoenfeldt, Nancy Cazenas, Danielle LaRosa, Amy Emmatty, Stephanie Naski, Rebecca Shapiro, Eileen Boone, Kim Douglas, Monica Snowden, Kelli Jordan

Sports Booster President, Amy Emmatty: We have new business to discuss tonight and will speak to that when we reach that part of the agenda.

Recording Secretary's Report, Susan Anderson: Motion made to approve September minutes (posted online), motion seconded. Minutes approved.

Athletic Director, Jonathan Frohm: Jonathan was unable to attend for personal reasons but shared that the Club is doing great.

Membership, Stephanie Naski: We have hit our peak. We have 197 members and last year the total was 162 members. So far, we have \$28,750 from membership. Last year, from this point to the end of the year we gained approximately 20. We will get more members once Winter/Spring sports start.

Apparel, Kim Douglas & Jen Schoenfeldt: Lanyards are in! A supply will be given to Monica for sponsors. We had good sales at the parade and the Homecoming game. We have discovered that the new carts are time savers and we don't need as many volunteers as we have in the past. The sale items are selling well. In the past, the last few games didn't yield as much as we've seen so far, and Winter/Spring sports are not great for sales either. We are looking into an online store using Square. Separate inventory will need to be created for the store to make it work and there will be limited offerings of popular items that can be quickly restocked. Delivery options are to be determined. Amy noted that we can also include membership, so people can purchase membership and apparel at the same time.

Sponsorship and Advertising, Monica Snowden: No new sponsors since the last meeting but we have received all the funds from those who committed. Still trying to work with Main Street Bank for their advertisement or help create one for them. Twin Creek Summer Camp is a potential sponsor. This is a camp in West Virginia that Herndon families have gone to in the past and they want to support communities. NWFCU concluded they cannot sponsor us after all since their mission is education based and not athletics. They may do an advertisement. In need of programs to give to advertisers, Cheer should still have some. Have invited sponsors to



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Sponsor Night, an announcement will be made soon. We will give them framed certificates of appreciation at Sponsor Night.

Concessions Report, Kelli Jordan: Indoor concessions are going great and running smoothly. Pizza is a hot seller but always considering other options. Having Nancy involved is a huge help as she coordinates the outside concession stand and inside sports concessions volunteer sign up genius. Sports teams are doing well with volunteers but we're still asking other sports to assist with football game concessions. It's hard to get volunteers from Winter/Spring sports since their season hasn't yet started. Learning a lot that will help with next year. It will be helpful to know if other sports have social media presence, so we can advertise there as we do with the class Facebook pages. Will continue to work on that to get a greater reach. We can also use social media to explain why it is expected that other sports volunteer and how the funds are spent. This will require more discussion with Jonathan. Another huge help is Amy Steil placing hot food orders and that we are able to delegate major tasks. Communications with the volunteers is really good and helps maintain inventory.

Treasurer, Danielle LaRosa: Profit is up \$27,000 compared to last year. Details for the different areas within Sports Boosters is included in the financial report. All areas are ahead from last year. It has become apparent that some teams are still unaware that Boosters has specific funds set aside for them. Most of the money in the team funds are from the teams' own fundraisers. Boosters holds the money for each team until the Coach is ready to spend either by transferring funds to the Herndon High School Finance Office or by submitting invoices to the Sports Boosters President to be paid. We are still in the process of understanding the various funding sources for each team: from the Athletic Director's funding, from each team's separate bank accounts (if they exist), from the Sports Boosters account and from the Herndon High School Finance Office's accounts. Concessions numbers are back to the profit percentages seen prior to the last couple of years.

Action Items: Work with Athletic Director to contact coaches whose accounts have been dormant for over two years to let them know that the amount of funds available to them.

Vice President Report, Amy Emmatty for Jill Hulnick: Jill will be focusing on Awards Nights with Eileen.

Communications Secretary Report, Susan Anderson: Members are being added the membership email list every week. If there is something that needs to be sent to the



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membership outside of the weekly email, send the request to my personal email and I will take care of it.

Social Media Report, Stephanie Naski: We are now on Twitter, Instagram, and Facebook. Facebook is now a page instead of a group and anyone can post. If there is something specific to post on Instagram or Twitter, email Stephanie exactly what you want it to say and she will post it. Sponsor posts will be per sponsor, so they can re-Tweet or share without the other sponsors being in the same post. We will do the same with restaurants that donate to the teams. Include @herndonathletics on all Tweets.

Old Business: While we have some volunteers for the Golf Tournament we do still need a chair, or co-chairs.

New Business: Concession Rental Fee. We charge \$100 for other high school organizations to use the concession stand. Would like to consider changing this \$100 to a refundable security deposit. Language to the contract will be adjusted to reflect this but also include a clause regarding responsibility for damages. This would be applied retroactively to the start of the 2018-19 year. A motion was made, and it was approved to move forward.

By Laws. Have reviewed the By Laws and we are supposed to have an annual meeting for the election of the officers and Board of Directors as well as a financial report. We are also supposed to have an audit with three people and recommend we start this after the conclusion of this school year. Amy sent pertinent sections of the By Laws for all to review so we can have a more in-depth discussion at our next meeting.
