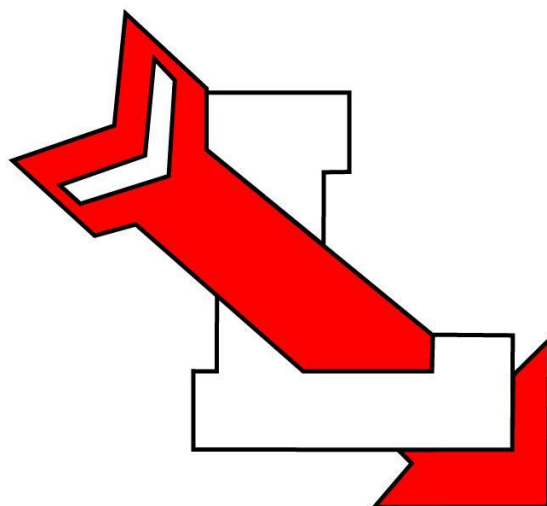

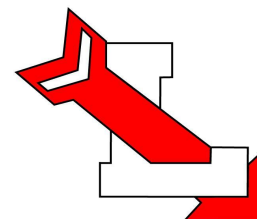

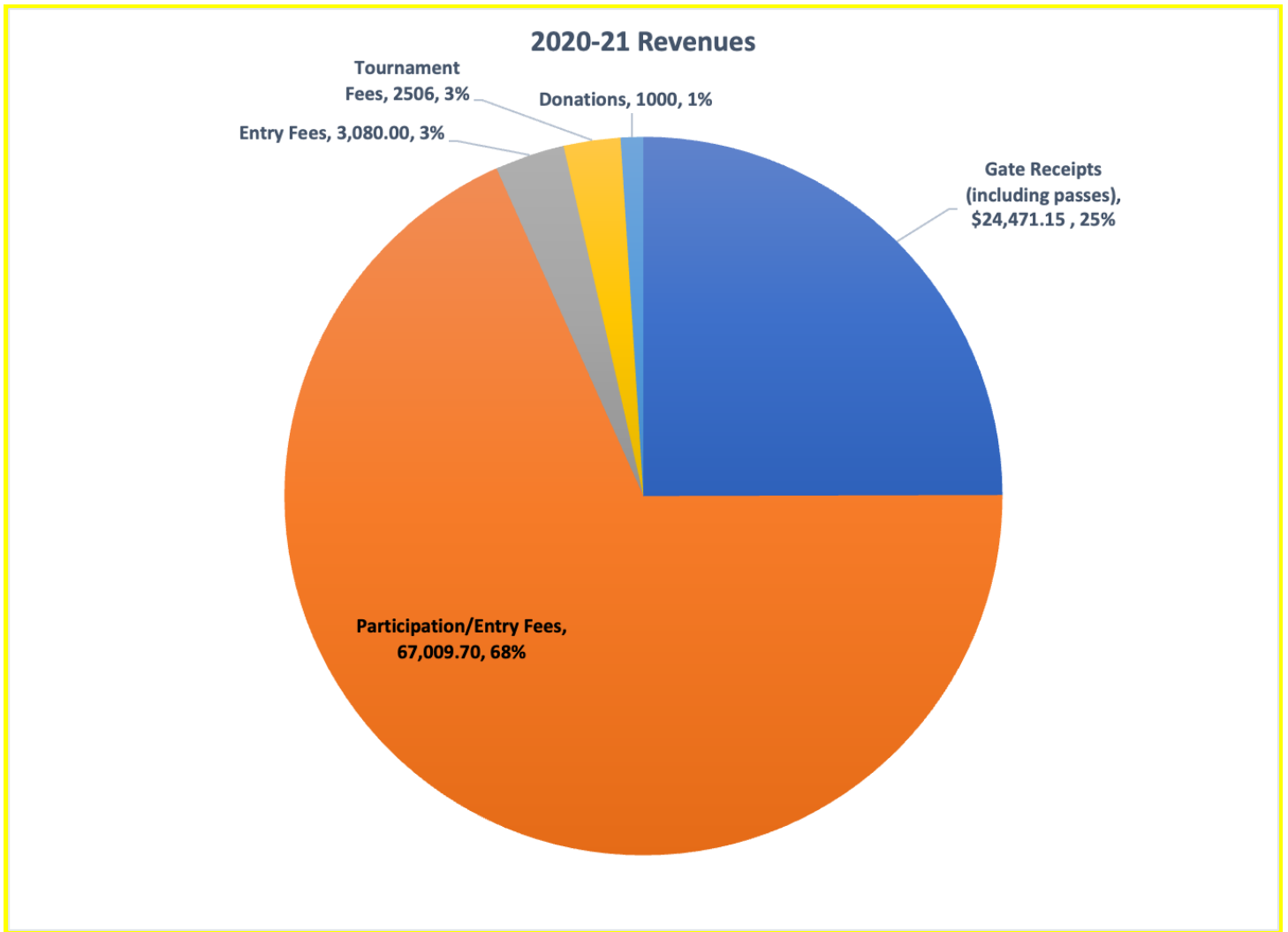

Lowell Athletic Revenue Information as of 6/30/2021

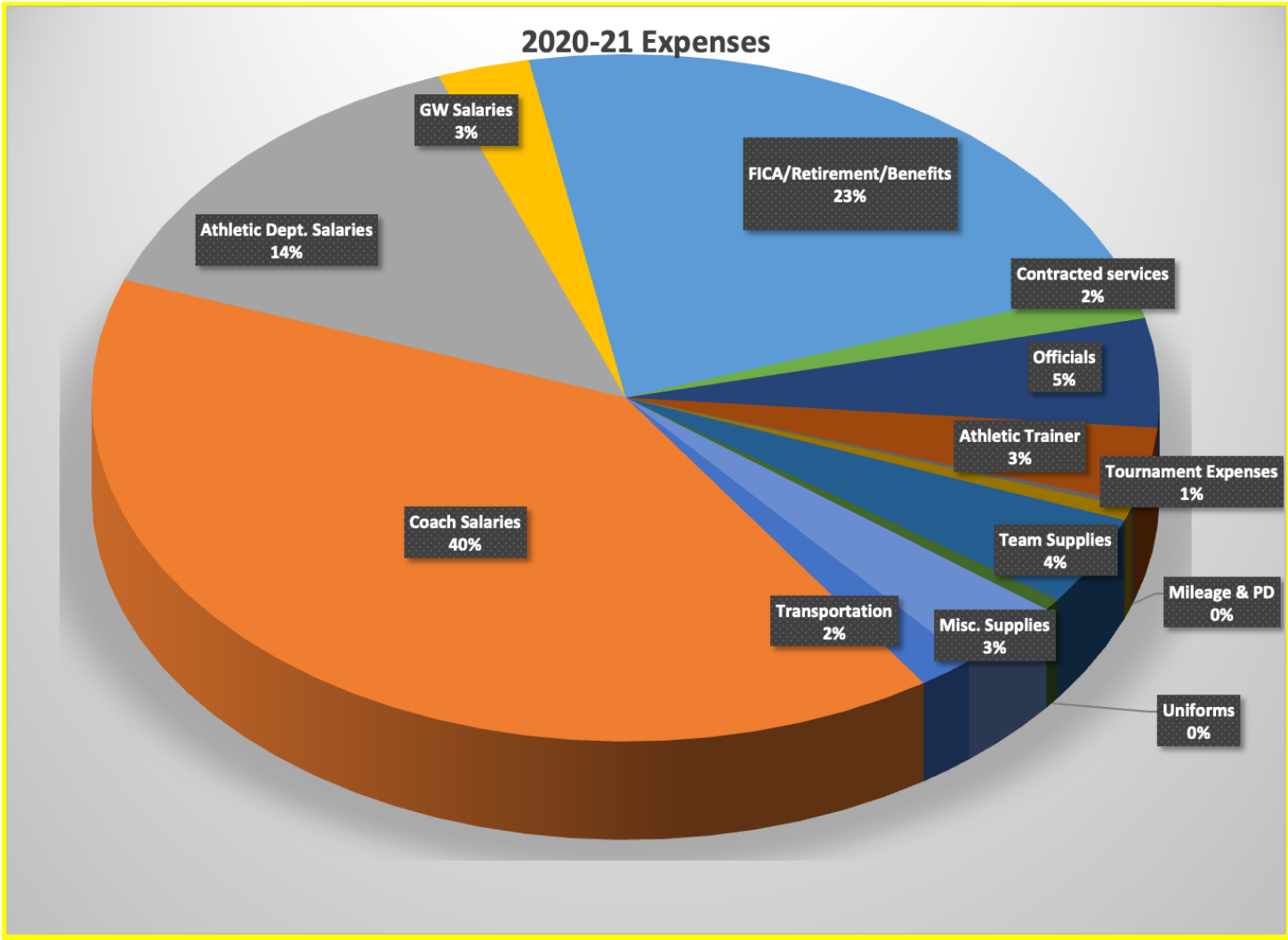
