From the Desk of Head Coach Billy Emerson

Dear PVI Baseball Supporters,

Welcome to PVI Baseball 2012. My coaching staff and I are honored to coach at such a great school with a warm and caring community and staff. Personally I have been amazingly blessed to be a part of PVI for the last ten years and as I hand the reigns over to Coach Nolan following this season, I am looking forward to the continued success of our baseball program.

Over 10 years ago, we all set out to rebuild a great high school baseball program. Since that time, Paul VI Baseball has risen to area and national prominence. Players, parents, supporters and coaches alike have worked tirelessly to keep our dreams alive and to provide the best for our student-athletes. In less than five years we have accomplished much of what was planned and built one of the top baseball programs in the Mid-Atlantic region.

After winning our first State Championship in a decade in 2004, we have been regularly atop area rankings, nationally ranked and a staple of the Virginia State rankings over the past eight years. More recently, our 2009 Panthers became the first team ever to win the WCAC and State titles in the same season. Through 2011, PVI Baseball has won 11 championship titles in the last eight years, while reaching the conference and state semifinals (or higher) seven straight seasons. Along the way, we have played and won more games than any team in the area, having compiled an astounding record of 196-75 over the past nine seasons. Another byproduct of our progress is the collection of nearly 50 studentathletes who have continued their baseball careers in college. More will join the collegiate baseball ranks following this season and all of our alumni (college players or not) have enjoyed success in their post high school endeavors. We like to feel that we played a part in that success and that the life lessons learned on the diamond at PVI will forever be applied to our players' daily lives. We are very proud of our former players, their families and their contributions to our success.

The more we accomplish, the more driven we are to succeed. Our ultimate goal, just as it was in 2002, is to build the best high school baseball program in America with the best young men in America. Within our structure our players are held to higher standards in and out of school. One of our goals is to build quality human beings through the sport of baseball by stressing the importance of life skills.

Emerson Set for One Final Season as Paul VI Baseball Coach

Panthers have enjoyed incredible success under longtime skipper

In an emotional address to players and families Thursday, March 8 at the Paul VI High baseball team's annual `First Pitch Dinner,' Billy Emerson announced he will step down as the Panthers' head baseball coach at the end of this upcoming spring season.

Emerson, beginning his 10th season as the Panthers' baseball coach, is the longest tenured baseball coach in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC). He will continue his duties as the Paul VI High Athletic Director.

Jeff Nolan, Emerson's longtime assistant and current associate head coach, will be the Panthers' next head coach following the 2012 season.

Emerson, who also serves as an associate scout for the Detroit Tigers, indicated he may return to coaching at some point.

"I've dedicated a good part of my life to coaching," said Emerson. "I have new challenges as the A.D., I'm working on a Master's degree and most importantly I will get to spend more quality time with my family. It's time to step away, but I wouldn't say I'm out of coaching forever."

Emerson has coached at the high school and collegiate levels for nearly 20 years. As a high school head coach he holds a career record of 217-114 (196-75 in 9 seasons at PVI) and is the winningest coach in PVI history. He has been named Coach of the Year on eight occasions, including honors from the WCAC and the Virginia independent Schools Athletic Association (VISAA). He was also a finalist for `Baseball America' National High School Coach of the Year in 2008.


Paul VI has won two WCAC Championships and three VISAA State Championships under Emerson's direction, along with multiple regular season titles, invitational tournament crowns and national rankings. The Paul VI baseball program has sent more than 50 players to college baseball over the last nine years, a mark rarely matched in the Mid Atlantic Region.


While doubling as a manager in the Clark C. Griffith Collegiate Summer Baseball League from 2006-2009, Emerson has coached a total of 315 games (high school and collegiate combined) with a record of 226-89. He was the only baseball coach in America to guide a nationally ranked high school team and a nationally ranked collegiate team in the same years (2008, 2009). "I will miss the camaraderie, competition and the opportunity to coach so many great players," said Emerson, who during his earlier days as a high school baseball coach once led T.C. Williams to the Northern Region semifinals – the furthest the Titans have ever gone. "As the Athletic Director I will still have a hand in supporting Paul VI student athletes in advancing to college baseball. I will continue to work tirelessly behind the scenes to support all of our coaches and student athletes."

Nolan has coached both high school and college players for the last 25 years. He has coached at Paul VI during Emerson's entire tenure at the school and has helped Emerson establish the program as a perennial local and national power. Nolan was named Mid Atlantic Assistant Coach of the Year in 2009 by the National High School Baseball Coaches Association.

"The program won't miss a beat with Jeff in charge," said Emerson. "It can only get better. Jeff Nolan is the kind of coach who gets the most out of his players and the kind of man you want your child to learn from. As our pitching coach, he made more of our guys into All-Conference and college pitchers than anyone. Jeff has been essential to building this program."

History & Records



Paul VI Catholic High School opened in the fall of 1983 and fielded its first baseball team at the junior varsity level in the spring of 1984. The Panthers played their first season of varsity baseball the following year in spring of 1985.

PVI has competed in the highly regarded Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) since 1986. The WCAC was formerly known as the Washington Metro Athletic Conference (WMAC) until the fall of 1993. The WCAC is now comprised of 10 Catholic high schools from Washington DC, Maryland and Virginia. Three different WCAC baseball teams (including Paul VI) have been nationally ranked in the past five seasons. The conference used a divisional format (North and South) from 1998-2000 and from 2004-2005. The divisional format was dropped again in 2006 and the WCAC is now a straight nine team conference.

Beyond conference play, PVI competed for the Virginia Catholic High School League (VCHSL) championship from 1985 to 1991. In 1992, The Virginia Independent Schools Baseball Association (VISBA) was formed to provide a state championship for all private high schools in the state of Virginia. The VISBA changed its acronym to VISAA in 2006 which stands for Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association. Today the VISAA includes almost 80 private schools throughout the state.

In 25 seasons of PVI varsity baseball the Panthers have captured thirteen titles including the WMAC tournament/conference championship (1993), two WCAC South Division championships (1999 & 2005), two VISBA state championships (1994 & 2004), two VISAA state championships (2008 & 2009), two Southeastern Baseball Classic championships (2008 & 2009), two WCAC regular season championships (2007 & 2008), and two WCAC tournament conference championships in 2007 & 2009. All 13 championships were won in the past 17 years including ten in the past seven years.

Panther Field

Baseball has been played at Panther Field since 1937, when the Fairfax High School Rebels first took the field at their newly built school. The construction of the campus was performed by the Works Progress Administration, providing badly needed jobs during the Great Depression. After World War II, the athletic complex was named "War Memorial Field" in honor of Fairfax graduates and other veterans lost during that conflict. The Fairfax staff developed a reputation during those years for thorough, careful maintenance of the baseball field, and it was used extensively for tournaments and other amateur play.

In the 1960s, when Fairfax High School moved to its current site, this facility was used as the North Campus of George Mason University. While the Patriots played here, fencing was improved and dugouts and batting cages installed. The dirt berm in left field that is a hallmark of the field— and the bane of many an outfielder over the years—was also installed to cover a low brick wall that had been a previous source of injuries.

The Diocese of Arlington purchased the facility in 1982, and the Paul VI Panthers first played here in the spring of 1983. Improvements from that period include the grandstand and lighting in left field, the pressbox, the flagpole, and the "Panther Pause" concession stand. The name "Panther Field" was added in 1999. Still recognized as one of the finest scholastic baseball venues in Northern Virginia and the WCAC, Panther Field continues it's renewal process. A new scoreboard was installed in 2001; the playing surface underwent extensive rehabilitation in 2002, with installation of new dirt and sod in the infield and Bermuda grass in the outfield; and new netting was added above the backstop in 2003.

After completion of the new school gymnasium in the fall of 2003, the complex received a significant face lift entering the 2004 season. The dugouts were renovated and lengthened, and the press box was expanded to include clubhouse and locker facilities. 2005 saw improvements to the backstop netting and clubhouse interior, and a complete rebuild of the batting cages was completed in 2006. Significant portions of the year-to-year maintenance are performed on a volunteer basis by players, parents, and fans at two or three "Field Day" weekends in Late February and early March. The continuing generosity and hard work of the boosters, sponsors, and fans will permit Panthers Baseball to host opponents at one of the finest high school baseball facilities in the area for years to come. Truly a first-class field for a first-class program!

Paul VI is one of only two schools in the conference able to host a night game at all. Day games are great, but nothing beats the thrill and excitement of a game under the lights! Already the finest baseball facility in the metropolitan area, with the help of annual fundraising and dedicated volunteers, Panther Field will be one of the nation's best in just a few short years.



Billy Emerson 10th Year at PVI

A native of Vienna, VA, Billy Emerson was an all-district high school player at James Madison and a collegiate standout at both Montgomery College-Rockville and George Mason University. In 1994, he was drafted into professional baseball and played for the Class 'A' Newark Buffalos of the Frontier League. Following the '94 season he was offered several opportunities to continue in pro ball but opted to complete his college degree, work as a scout for the Houston Astros and begin a coaching career.

Upon graduating from GMU, Billy was named Head Coach at T.C. Williams High School and led the 1998 Titans to their best season ever, earning him honors as Northern Virginia's Coach of the Year. After coaching one year at Annandale High School, Emerson resigned from his head coaching duties in 1999 to accept a promotion as Assistant Athletic Director at his alma mater; James Madison High School in Vienna. During this time he continued in baseball, assisting at Madison and with the Vienna Mustangs of the Clark Griffith Collegiate Baseball League.

Emerson left Madison in 2002 to become Head Coach at Paul VI. His nine seasons at PVI have been extremely successful. The improvements and additions to the baseball program during his tenure have yielded an average of 22 wins per season, multiple title runs, 2 Conference Championships, 3 State Championships, and multiple national rankings. His players have garnered numerous All-Conference, All- State and All-Met honors along the way, including four Academic All-State selections as well as the 2008 and 2009 State Player of the Year selections. Emerson has guided dozens of his players to college and professional baseball in the past 16 years, including 48 players in just nine years at PVI. After



leading the Panthers to a 27-4 record in 2007, and winning the WCAC Championship for the first time in 14 years, Emerson was named WCAC Coach of the Year, Washington Post All-Met Coach of the year, Washington Examiner Coach of the Year, and the Washington DC Homeplate Club Coach of the Year. 2008 also proved to be another successful season for the



Panthers who finished with a 27-3 record including the Southeastern Baseball Classic Championship, WCAC Regular Season Championship, VISAA State Championship, and a final National Ranking of #12 in the Country. Emerson also received recognition as the 2008 VISAA Division I Virginia State "Coach of the Year", 2008 BCA/ Baseball America District 2 "Coach of the Year", and was one of 8 coaches nominated for BCA/ Baseball America National "Coach of the Year". In 2009 the Panthers finished with a 22-9 record, winning the Southeastern Baseball Classic for the second year in a row, as well as the WCAC Championship and the VISAA State Championship for the second consecutive year. PVI was also honored as the Private High School "Team of the Year" by the Washington DC Home Plate Club. In 2011 PVI finished the season strong going 17-12 and was VISAA State Runner Up. Five PVI student athletes from this team have gone on to play NCAA division I baseball.

Billy has spent six summers in the Clark Griffith Collegiate Baseball League as the General Manager of the Vienna Senators ('04 & '05), Vice President of Baseball Operations/Manager of the Fairfax Nationals ('06,'07, '08), and General Manager/ Head Coach of the Carney Pirates in 2009. In 2009 Emerson led the Pirates to a 29-10 record, finishing as the 23rd ranked team in the country. He also coached the "South Team" in the Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game from 2005-2008 and is currently an Associate Scout for the Detroit Tigers. In the fall of 2010 Emerson assumed his new role as Athletics Director at PVI. Billy has been married to his wife Lisa for sixteen years. The couple resides in Vienna with their three children; Amanda (12) Haley (10) and William IV (5). Emerson's father Bill is a legendary hall of fame bluegrass musician.



Upon graduating from Cal Poly, Jeff was invited to tryout with the Chicago Cubs and Kansas City Royals. He then taught at Pomona Catholic High School for a year before pursuing a business career. Ultimately, Nolan became Chief Executive Officer of a multi-million dollar information technology-consulting firm. He also founded Nolan Baseball Academy in Upland California, providing player instruction and coaching clinics. Jeff was the pitching coach at Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, CA, prior to relocating to Northern Virginia in 1998. He has been coaching at the high school level and above for over 20 years.

From 2004-2008 PVI pitchers led the WCAC in fewest runs allowed. Nolan was selected as an assistant coach in the 2005, 2006, and 2007 Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game and had twice been named a finalist for District 2 Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007 and 2008 (District 2 is comprised of all high schools throughout Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, DC and Virginia). In 2009 Nolan received the District 2 Assistant Coach of the Year award at the National High School Baseball Coaches Association in Tucson, Arizona.

Jeff has been married to his wife Greta, for 26 years. The couple resides in Centreville, VA. Their daughter, Lindsey (PVI '05), graduated in 2009 with a BS degree in Business Administration from Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, CA and resides in Southern California. Tad Davidovich VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH (INFIELD) 10th year at PVI

Originally from Chicago, Tad Davidovich was an all district infielder at nearby James Madison High School in Vienna, VA. Following a playing stint on the collegiate level at Division I Samford University in Alabama, he transferred to Mary Washington University where he



received a Bachelor's Degree in Historic Preservation.

Davidovich began coaching as an assistant at Madison and as a head coach in AAU summer baseball with the Vienna Mustangs. His 18 and under Mustang teams regularly competed at the national level and won a bracket championship at the Cocoa Expo International Tournament in 1999. Tad rejoined Billy Emerson at Paul VI in 2002 and has successfully coached defense and hitters in his 10 seasons with the Panthers. Under the guidance of Coach Davidovich, Paul VI set school records in 2005 by fielding .965 as a team, committing just 29 errors in 31 games. The Panthers followed that performance in 2006 with a school record of 25 double plays.

Davidovich was also selected as an assistant coach in the 2005 and 2007 Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game. From 2006-2007 he was an assistant coach for the Fairfax Nationals of the Clark C. Griffith Collegiate Baseball League (CGL). In 2007 the Nationals fielded .955 as a team and turned a league high 39 double plays. In 2007, Tad, his wife Donna, and Emerson created the Clark Griffith Collegiate Baseball League logo.

Tad's brother Pete played in the Division III College World Series for Salisbury University. Tad is a life-long Chicago Cubs fan. The nephew of the Cubs former traveling secretary, his birth was announced on WGN during a Cubs game. Tony Salgado ROVING INSTRUCTOR (CATCHING), 9th year at PVI

Tony Salgado played for Billy Emerson at T.C. Williams High School where he was an All-District catcher, team captain, and leadoff hitter for the best team in school history. Tony considered several Division II and III options before choosing to walk on at George Mason University.



After physical limitations forced an early end to his playing career, Salgado immediately began coaching as an 18-year-old varsity assistant at Annandale High School. He continued coaching high school travel baseball for the next five summers while completing his B.S. degree in Physical Education from Mason.

Tony rejoined Emerson as an assistant at Paul VI Catholic High School in 2003 and accepted a teaching position at Washington Irving Middle School in the Fairfax County Public Schools system. Under Coach Salgado's guidance as the catching coach, he has developed 5 players that have gone on to play at the collegiate level. With Salgado coaching first base, PVI runners stole 79 bases in 2005 and set a school record with 82 thefts in 2006.

Considered one of the top young coaches in the Washington Metropolitan Area, Salgado has coached players from Tulane, Tennessee, Auburn, and several other top ranked colleges in the Clark Griffith Collegiate Baseball League as an assistant coach for the Vienna Senators (2005), Fairfax Nationals (2006-2008), and Carney Pirates (2009). Salgado was also selected as an assistant coach in the 2005, 2006, and 2007 Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game.

While at T.C. Williams, Salgado was a student of Herman Boone; the legendary football coach portrayed by Denzel Washington in the major motion picture "Remember The Titans". He is currently the Middle School Health and Physical Education Resource Teacher for Fairfax County Public Schools. Tony resides in Loudoun County with his beautiful wife Suzanne and their daughter Emma (2).

Great Location

You must ask yourself, is it really worth hours of commuting every day to go to another school, when PVI has everything you want and need, right here in the middle of Northern Virginia?

Paul VI is near many major roads in Northern Virginia including routes 29, 50, 123 and 236. PVI is also less than 2 miles from I-66 and less than 5 miles from the Beltway.

Our central location is a great convenience to our students. As a high school athlete, there are many demands placed on your time all year long. Being at a school that is centrally located makes life easier by getting you home sooner. Being at PVI gives you the time you need for proper rest, family activities, homework, a social life and more.

Great Facilities

In 2004, Paul VI constructed a multi-million dollar, state of the art student activities center. The new building includes a new and larger gymnasium, new locker rooms and many other needed amenities. The addition of the new activities center gave PVI a second gym and a larger, upgraded weight room and fitness center, making the indoor facilities one of the area's best. Plans are in the works to upgrade the outdoor facilities in just a few short years.

Along with the changes to the school building, many recent improvements to Panther Field (the home of PVI baseball) have allowed Paul VI to provide the finest baseball facility in the area for its players, thus creating an exciting and professional environment to practice and play. **Home crowds regularly fill the bleachers around the complex!**

The Panther Field Baseball Complex includes:

- A fully enclosed Major League size field with seating for over 2500 fans.
- Professional grounds maintenance by *Game Day Inc.*, providing the top natural Bermuda grass and Camden Yards dirt playing surface in the area.
- A state of the art, underground irrigation and drainage system.
- Batting practice "turtle" and array of professional screens.
- A 1600 square foot "press box & clubhouse" facility directly behind home plate with lockers, storage space and a coaches office.
- An upgraded sound system for announcing and music.
- An enlarged home dugout with large benches, bat rack, helmet rack and adequate equipment space.
- Two 90' x 20' artificial turf batting and pitching facilities.
- Multiple hitting stations set up to accommodate 20 hitters at one time.

Panther Field is the only on-campus home field in the WCAC with lights!

Paul VI is one of only two schools in the conference able to host a night game. Already one of the finest baseball facilities in the metropolitan area, with the help of annual fundraising and dedicated volunteers, Panther Field will be one of the nation's best in just a few short years. **Plans for a reconfigured artificial turf facility are in the works!**

More Games equals More Experience... On a Higher Level

The PVI Baseball Program plays as many games as any program in the area. Including scrimmages and post-season play, the Varsity team can play over 35 games every year. After the regular season, the Varsity plays in the WCAC Tournament at the University of Maryland's Shipley Field. Plus, if the Varsity finishes in the top eight of the Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association (VISAA) Poll, they advance to the VA State Tournament for a chance to play at Richmond's historic Shepherd Stadium. The Panthers have won 3 State Championships and 4 WCAC Titles in the past 8 seasons along with being nationally ranked in 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2010. PVI's astounding record of 196-75 (.723) is evidence that the PVI has played and won more games than any other area program from 2003 to 2011.

The J.V. team schedules at least 20 regular season contests per year (along with 3 to 4 scrimmages). That equates to at least seven more games than area public school J.V. will play. The JV has played and won as many games as any other area JV team since 2003 with a record of 134-39 (.775).

The quality of opponents at PVI is very high. As a member of the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC), the Panthers always face a challenging conference schedule. PVI Baseball also schedules some of the best non-conference opponents from the Washington Metropolitan Area. The varsity team travels to Florida and/or South Carolina during spring break for additional non-conference games. Our fundraising program covers the expense of our trip.

Within the WCAC from 2003 to 2011:

- Seven of the WCAC's 10 teams have been ranked in the *Washington Post* Top 10.
- All Three WCAC Virginia teams have been ranked in the VISAA Top 5.
- □ Four WCAC teams have been Nationally Ranked by USA Today, ESPN-RISE and/or Baseball America.

The high level of competition not only makes you a better baseball player, it also draws the attention of college coaches and Major League scouts.

Other facts demonstrating our strength of schedule include:

- Multiple games (annually) against Nationally Ranked opponents.
- □ Multiple games (annually) against Washington Post Top 10 opponents.
- □ Every WCAC Varsity team has won at least 12 games and/or finished .500 since 2003.
- Over 60% of our opponents from 2003-2011 had a winning record.

The VISAA consists of over 70 private high school baseball teams within the State of Virginia. The schools are grouped by size into three divisions. Paul VI plays at the most competitive, largest level... Division I Teams are ranked weekly throughout the season, with the final top eight earning an at large bid to the State Tournament.







Playing baseball at Paul VI Catholic High School gives you the "total package". It's something we like to call "The PVI Way".

At PVI we make a year-round effort for our program and our players. Although the coaching staff encourages participation in other sports at PVI, there are opportunities for baseball players to improve all year through team baseball camps and baseball specific weight training & conditioning. In other words, we have all the camps you need. The staff also monitors the academic progress of baseball players throughout the school year. Our high school program is more like a college program. The idea is to prepare you for the next level. Those who plan to participate in other sports, are not disadvantaged or looked down upon by missing off-season baseball activities.

Our off-season conditioning program runs from late November through the start of baseball season and focuses on flexibility, cardiovascular strength & endurance, muscular strength & endurance, speed, plyo-metric power and nutrition. The coaching staff is well educated in the latest techniques to improve athletic performance. From late November through late February the PVI Baseball Staff coordinates camps for the players at local indoor baseball facilities. Players have a chance to improve skills with the coaching staff and prepare themselves for the upcoming season. In the summer, the staff co-coordinates at least 1-2 weeks of baseball camps in order for players to once again improve skills in the presence of PVI coaches and college coaches. The staff also produces a master schedule of PVI players' summer teams and makes regular visits to summer games.

The staff monitors academic progress year round through communication with the Dean of Academics and regular checks by the head coach on the school's intranet grading system. Players are typically referred to tutors and teachers who provide assistance if necessary. A major emphasis is placed on the idea of academic performance strengthening athletic performance. Players often attend after-school study hall with the coaching staff throughout the course of the season. This not only gives the players extra-time for schoolwork, it also further emphasizes our philosophies. The Principal, the Dean of Students and the Dean of Academics also visit the players once a year during practice to make sure each student-athlete fully understands the expectations of the institution.

Coaches meet with players before the season to set roles and goals. Following the each season, players have a post season meeting with coaches to set new goals. The idea is to continue successes and improve upon weaknesses. Coaches also meet with players and parents to discuss college options. The coaching staff provides information on college recruiting, NCAA rules & standards and a realistic expectation for all interested players. The coaching staff is in constant contact with colleges throughout the country to ensure that every player who wants to go to the next level can get there.

"The PVI Way" takes high school baseball to a new level. The PVI coaching staff brings a collegiate approach and a professional approach to the program. The high standards, academic monitoring, personal interest in each player, study halls, off-season conditioning and organized practices mirror the protocol for college baseball. Players are told "If you want to be a pro, act like one now". On that accord, our coaching staff makes every effort to run a program on a professional level. Although well experienced, the coaching staff is always looking for professional development opportunities. By attending clinics and collaborating with other high school coaches, college coaches and professionals, the PVI Staff focuses on properly teaching fundamentals with the latest techniques and the finer nuances of the game.



Section 6 A Staff with Experience, Integrity & Connections

Now in his 10th year at PVI, Head Coach Billy Emerson and his staff have established PVI Baseball as one of the most successful and respected programs in America. Five newspapers including The Washington Post have honored Emerson as "Coach of the Year". He has won the same award in the WCAC, the VISAA, the Mid-Atlantic Region and was one of eight finalists for Baseball America's National High School Coach of the Year. The former college and professional baseball player has coached at the high school level and above for 20 years and is also an athletic administrator. Since retiring from professional baseball in 1994, he has been heavily involved with college placement and has served as a major league scout since 1996; currently with the Detroit Tigers. Paul VI has maintained assembled an amazing group of assistants for years. Infield Coach Tad Davidovich (10th year) has Division I playing experience, has coached on the National Level in AAU, and also collegiately. Catching Coach Tony Salgado (9th year) is the top catching coaches in the area and has coached at the collegiate level as well. Other assistants at the JV and Varsity levels bring years and years of high level playing and coaching experience to the program. Five members of the staff have been together for nine or more years. Consistency breeds success!

Associate Head Coach Jeff Nolan is in his 10th year as PVI's top assistant. He has been an invaluable asset to PVI, helping win 11 Championship Titles in the past 8 seasons and assisting 50 student-athletes to college baseball (27 NCAA Division I). Coach Nolan was named Mid-Atlantic High School Assistant Coach of the Year in 2009. Nolan has over 25 years of coaching experience following a playing career that ended with an NCAA Championship under the "College Coach of the Century"; John Scolinos.

The baseball staff is loaded with professionals who take their positions very seriously and realize the impact that their actions and decisions make on young lives. The staff also believes in the principles of a Catholic Education and focuses on using baseball as a tool to teach important life lessons. The coaches strongly believe in a wholesome, family atmosphere. Players at PVI aren't simply looked at as baseball players; they are members of a family and each member is just as important as the next. Success off the field is clearly evident as well. Grade point averages rise as rapidly as winning percentages and the Panthers have built a reputation as a dedicated, respectful and hard working group of young men.

The PVI Baseball Coaching Staff includes:

- 7 former college baseball players...2 former professional baseball players...1 major league scout
- 9 college degrees...2 physical education degrees...3 master's degrees...4 coaches that work at PVI in other roles
- 3 certified strength and conditioning instructors...2 coaches certified in first aid, CPR and life saving techniques
- 5 coaches who are married, 5 with children...Over 150 years combined coaching and teaching experience

Along with numerous "walk-on" invitees, the PVI staff has helped 50 PVI players land a college roster spot in the last nine years. First and foremost, PVI baseball players will go on to college. Recruitment and the Transfer Rule

Active recruiting of pre-high school students is permitted by the WCAC. The coaching staff cannot approach a student who has already enrolled in high school unless the student or his parents have contacted the school or coaches first.

TRANSFER RULE After August 15th prior to the student-athlete's sophomore year, any student who was previously enrolled in another high school DC, MD or VA will not be eligible to participate at the Varsity level for one calendar year. The student will be permitted to play JV if he is a junior or younger. The transfer rule does have an appeal/waiver process for extenuating circumstances.
