Thinking About College Athletics?

What is the NCAA Eligibility Center? Why is it Important? The Eligibility Center certifies the academic and amateur credentials of all students who want to play sports at an NCAA Division I or II institution as freshmen. In order to practice, play and receive an athletic scholarship, students need to meet certain academic benchmarks. An additional certification process exists to make sure the student is still an amateur, which is necessary in order for the student to compete. Students must register at <https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/>. If student athletes wish to participate in NCAA Division I or II athletics, they need to be certified by the NCAA Eligibility Center. Students need to qualify academically and will also need to be cleared as an amateur student-athlete. Students are responsible for achieving and protecting their eligibility status! Check with your high school counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate on time with your class and have the required amount of core courses. Ask your high school counselor to submit your final transcript with proof of graduation.
