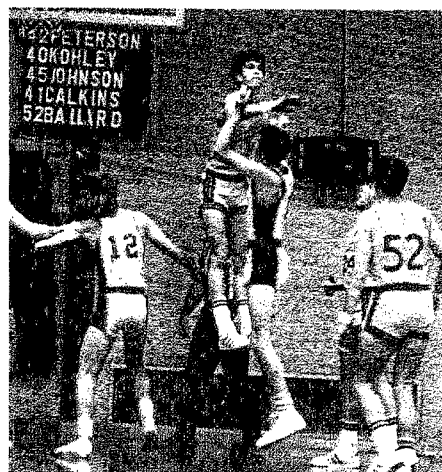
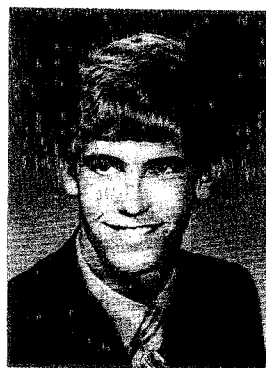
Athlete



Name: TY HALLOCK GHS Class of 1989

Sports/Accomplishments: Ty played football and basketball for four years, baseball one year and ran track one year. He was an All-Conference honoree in both football and basketball. He garnered All-State Special Mention his senior year in football. Ty played football at Michigan State University from 1989 to 1992. His seven year National Football League career began in Detroit with stops in Jacksonville and Chicago where he played fullback, tight end and linebacker, as well as special teams.

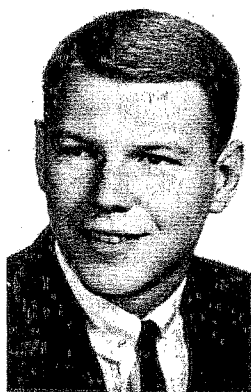
Family: Married to Jennifer, he has two sons, Tanner and Tate, and a daughter Theryn.

Sports/Accomplishments: Played football, basketball and track. He was an All-Conference performer in all three sports. Paul was the State Champion in the 120 yard High Hurdles, and took 2nd place at the State Meet in the 180 yard Low Hurdles. An exceptional athlete, he played quarterback for Western Michigan University for four years.

Name: STAN KEMP (Deceased 1995) GHS Class of 1963

Sports/Accomplishments: Stan participated in football and golf for four years and basketball for three years at GHS. He attended the University of Michigan in 1963-66 where he was a Punter and an End. While there, the team was Big Ten and Rose Bowl Champions. He was the last player cut from the Green Bay Packers training camp in 1967. Stan was a Graduate Asst. coach at the University of Michigan, and later the Freshman Team Head Coach and Varsity Wide Receivers Coach at the University of Wisconsin. Stan began his officiating career at the high school level but quickly rose through the college and professional ranks to become an NFL referee for seven years. A tremendous Yellow Jacket supporter, Stan was a volunteer coach and contributor to Greenville High School athletics as well as other community sports including Greenville Little League.

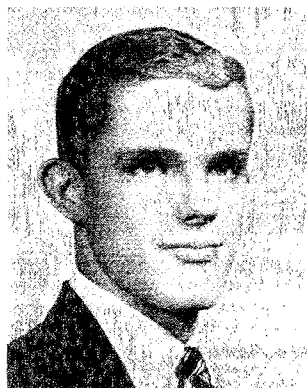


Name: JAMES (JIM) LINCOLN GHS Class of 1951

Sports/Accomplishments: James participated in football for three years, basketball and track for four years. He was an All-Conference football and track and field performer in his junior and senior years. Jim was an All-Region and All-State sprinter, hurdler and long jumper. A state champion in the High Hurdles his senior season and runner up in the 220 yard dash his junior year. He also held at least four school records in track and field. His long jump record of 21' 8 3/8" set in 1951 stills stands to this day. His track and field accomplishments led to a scholarship to Michigan State University.

Frank won three district titles, one regional title and went to the State Finals in 1972. His teams were 11 time Conference Champions. He was inducted into the M.H.S. Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1996. He also coached Varsity wrestling at GHS from 1966-1972 and coached Middle School basketball and baseball for three years and football for one. The Varsity High School baseball field was named in his honor in 2001. Frank competed in baseball at Western Michigan University.

Family: Married to Marilyn and has two daughters, Kay and Julie. He has four grandchildren, Zach, Morgan, Kelsey and Rachel.



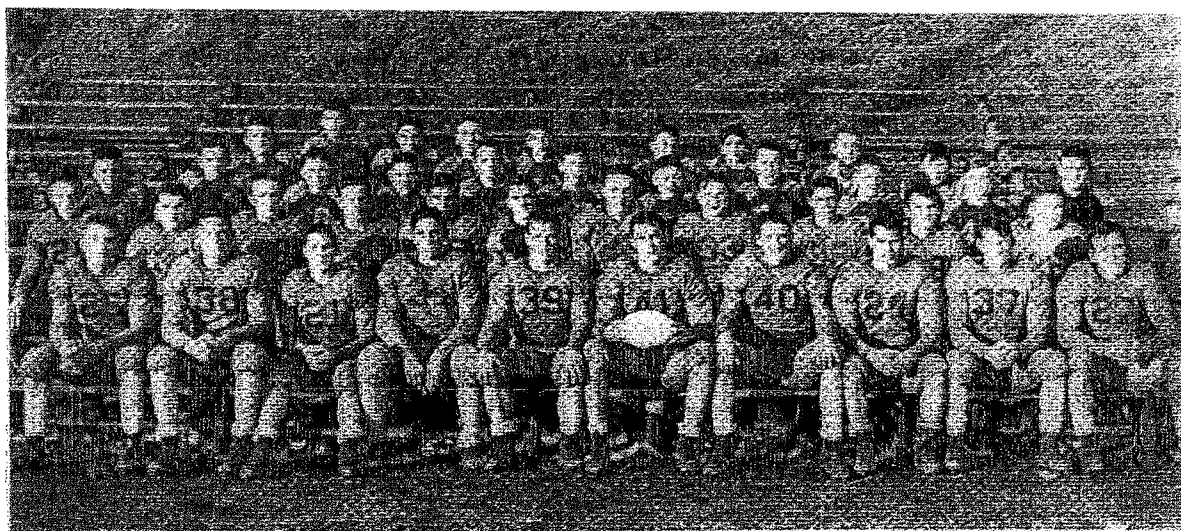
Name: RICHARD "DICK" DEIHL Mason High School Class of 1943

1945 FOOTBALL TEAM

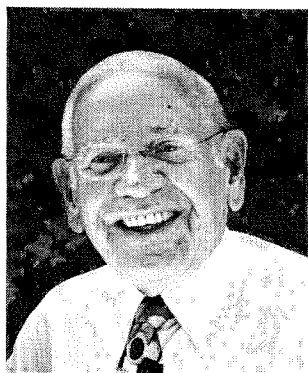
Undefeated and un-scored upon with a record of 7-0-1, they outscored their opponents 155-0. They were coached by John Heinzleman.

Name: LEO MARSHALL Grand Rapids Union Class of 1949

Community Contributions: Has been involved with GHS athletics for 40 years, most of those as a track & field official for both middle and high school meets. For many years, Leo provided ambulance service for home football games. He was a vital part of raising money to build Greenville's first track that was presented to the school and community in 1975. Leo has always been very involved in the Greenville community, volunteering his time and leadership.

Name: WALTER JAEHNIG (Deceased 2003) Hancock High School Class of 1930

Community Contributions: Walter was employed by the *Greenville Daily News* from 1943 to 1979. He started covering local sporting events in 1944. He was the Managing Editor and Sports Editor at the *Daily News* for many years and retired in 1979 as fulltime Sports Editor. After his retirement he continued to write for the Sports Department through 1983. Some fun stats: Wally covered about 300 football games and 675 basketball games. He predicted results of 2,188 football games and 5,671 basketball games in Greenville's league and for other teams for his weekly columns with a .738 correct prediction percentage.

People still speak of his accurate, fair sports reporting. He was devoted to the community, Greenville Public School and its students. He covered all school sports and cultivated working relationships with coaches at area schools as well as those at schools in Greenville's athletic leagues. The press box at Black Field was dedicated to Walter in September of 1968 in recognition of 25 years of sports reporting and he received the School Bell Award in 1986. In the 1950's, he was instrumental in organizing a Greenville baseball summer league for grade school and middle school students since no Little League program existed at the time. He also served on the Greenville School Board from 1953 to 1962.
