Scott Armstrong is often considered not only the top basketball player ever to attend Milford, but also one of its top over all athletes. He played basketball, baseball and ran cross country in addition to being an outstanding student.

However, it was in basketball that Scott became a legend as he set the school career scoring record with 1,253 points. He also scored the most points in a single season with 596 during his senior year. He led his team to three League Championships during his career. The Milford basketball team only lost seven games during Scott's four years while winning 64. Along with the KVC titles, the team also captured two MHSAA District titles.

Armstrong was by no means a one-sport specialist, as he competed on varsity baseball and ran on two League Championship cross-country teams. In baseball, he was the centerfielder on the Runner Up team in the 1989 MHSAA Class A Baseball Championships. He won eleven varsity letters in his career.

After graduation, Armstrong accepted a full-ride scholarship to play basketball at Wayne State University, where he started for four years and currently holds the record for most career starts.

Scott owns his own e-business consulting company. He lives in Milford with his wife, Heather and their children Gabrielle, Elizabeth, and Scott. He is remembered at Milford as a model citizen and a winner at every level of competition.
