KELLY HALVORSEN ANDREWS

Kelly, a 1991 graduate of St. Joseph High School, participated in swimming, diving, and track and field where she earned eight varsity letters. She was an All-State diver her senior year and placed at the state and regional dive meets as a junior. She was also an All-Conference diver her junior and senior year and currently holds the varsity pool record for diving. She was the captain of her track team her junior and senior year where she excelled at the sprints and long jump. She was an All-Conference long jumper, winning the event her senior year. She qualified for the state meet as a junior and senior in the long jump and 200 meter sprint. She was named to the All-State track team her senior year.

Kelly was the recipient of the Ted and Rae Stone Outstanding Senior Female Athlete Award and attended Eastern Michigan University on an athletic scholarship. She competed at Eastern Michigan for four years in the one and three meter springboard, qualified for the MAC Conference Meet all four years, and qualified for the NCAA Regional Zone meet her senior year where she placed in the top ten. Kelly was also a member of the Junior Olympic Team, competing in the one and three meter dive.

Kelly earned a Bachelor of Education in Special Education from Eastern Michigan and a Masters Degree from Michigan State University. She is employed as a Special Education Coordinator with the Sutton Bays Public Schools. She currently resides in Traverse City, Michigan with her husband, Timothy, and two children, Erik and Emily.

LYNN ACHTERBERG OFFERDAHL

Lynn is a 1981 graduate of St. Joseph High School where she participated in diving, cheerleading, and track, and earned seven varsity letters. She was an All-Conference diver, Conference Champion, and an All-State diver her senior year. She maintained a 3.97 GPA and was a member of the National Honor Society.

Lynn continued on with her education at Western Michigan University where she was an All-American diver. When they cut the Western Michigan swim program in 1983, she followed her coach to Kalamazoo College where she was an NCAA Division III Diving Champion and Division III All-American. She received the prestigious NCAA post graduate Olympia Award Scholarship in 1985.

Lynn currently resides in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida with her husband, John, and three children, Ali, Drew, and Jameson. She started a chain of restaurants in 1990. She also volunteers her time at the Food Bank in Miami, the Museum of Discovery and Science in Ft. Lauderdale, the United Way, and Sheridan House Ministries.

CAROL SILVERTHORN MORRIS

Carol graduated in 1979 from St. Joseph High School where she earned nine varsity letters, three each, in basketball, volleyball, and softball. She was All-Conference in basketball her junior and senior year. Carol was an honor graduate and a member of the National Honor Society.

Carol continued on with her education at Central Michigan University where she played basketball for two years and graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in 1983. She obtained her Masters Degree from Western Michigan University in 2002. She has coached softball, basketball, and volleyball along with teaching, since graduating from Central, and was the head volleyball coach at St. Joseph High School from 1987-1999. She has volunteered her time with AYSO soccer and the St. Joseph Baseball Association. She currently teaches math at St. Joseph High School and resides in St. Joseph with her husband, Mark, and son, James.

DAVE WILLAUER

Dave is a 1960 graduate of St. Joseph High School where he earned six varsity letters, two in basketball, two in baseball, and two in football.

Dave was an All-State Honorable Mention and an All-Conference basketball player his senior year and currently holds the varsity single game rebounding record at 27. He continued his education at Michigan State University where he played basketball.
