Richard "Dick" Goodman is a 1976 graduate of St. Joseph High School. Dick earned two varsity letters in football, two in wrestling and three varsity letters in track. Dick was an All Conference selection in both football and wrestling his senior year. In track, Dick was a member of the 1975 school record-holding 1600m relay team.

Dick continued his sports career at Kalamazoo College where he played football for four years and ran track for one year. Dick earned four varsity letters in football and was selected as a captain his senior year. He received his MBA from Indiana University (Bloomington) in Marketing.

Dick served for six years on the board of the Wyman Center, a non-profit located in St. Louis, MO, focused on teen development.

Married to Jan Azar Goodman, Dick lives in St. Louis, Missouri, where he is currently Chief Operating Officer of Wallis Companies, a company with over \$1 billion in sales and over 1,100 employees. Dick and Jan have four adult children, Mary, Charles, Leslie, and Rich.
