# Vikings Lose Low-Scoring Contest

ALEXANDRIA — A low scoring battle took place last night between the Glendale High boys basketball team and Juniata Valley, and when the smoke cleared it was the Green Hornets walking away with a 39-33 season opening win.

"Juniata Valley was much bigger than we were with three players over 6-foot-3," Glendale coach Mike Strasser pointed out. "I think the kids played very hard and deserved a better fate."

Perhaps the first quarter score showed that the contest was going to be close, with the teams knotted at eight. However, the Hornets made a run in the second period and the Vikings found themselves down by 10 at one point and had to battle back to close the gap to 20-15 at the half.

The Vikings fought back behind the 14-point effort of Dave Burmeister to pull within a foul shot at the buzzer of the third period.

The Vikings grabbed the lead in the fourth quarter at 33-32, but failed to hold on as the Hornets finally overcame their pesky guests.

"We had the opportunity to win, but couldn't hit the big shots," Strasser said. "We had the momentum going and there's no telling what might have happened if we could have hit those shots."

"We did have some key turnovers throughout the game that also hurt us in the end."

Despite the height advantage for Juniata Valley, the Vikings controlled the boards with 28 re-

bounds compared to 20 for the home team. Rich Laing was the high boardsman for the visitors with seven.

Glendale took the Hornets down to the final minutes before of the junior varsity game before Juniata Valley claimed a 35-28 win.

Glendale will next travel to Blacklick Valley on Tuesday in hopes of evening its record.

# Curwensville Learn(s) Winning Ways Against Vikes

CURWENSVILLE — It was the best offensive night of the season for the Curwensville Area High School boys basketball team and its efforts paid off in the Golden Tide's first win, 49-45, over Glendale in a Moshannon Valley League battle at Patton Hall.

The Golden Tide hit 22 of 50 shots from the field for 44 percent and sank five of their eight foul shots for a nice improvement over their previous games.

"I am pleased with the offense we showed tonight," Tide mentor Vic Gearhart said. "We worked the ball very well and got a good shot selection."

Many of the Tide's shots came from down low out of the hands of Ken Learn, who positioned himself well to pile up a game-high 20 points.

Learn also was effective on the defensive side blocking 13 Viking shots and pulling down 12 rebounds.

"Ken played one heck of a game," Gearhart mentioned. "He was a very big factor in the victory."

While the Golden Tide was playing their best game on the season, Glendale was playing an equally competitive game that could have gone either way right down to the final minutes.

"We've been in a lot of games down the stretch," Viking coach Mike Strasser pointed out. "We just can't seem to get over the hump and learn how to win the close game."

Curwensville held the early advantage going up on top 14-11 at the end of the first period With Chris McGarry holding the hot hand for the Tide.

Dave Burmeister opened fire from the outside in the second quarter for the Vikes as the score reversed and the visitors took the half time lead at 25-24.

Burmeister finished the game with 16 points netting most of them in the first half while McGarry also scored the majority of his 12 points in the opening minutes, keeping the score close.

The second half began as an all Learn show, as the Tide kicked the ball inside every time down the floor and forced the Vikings

to change their defensive strategy.

Double-teaming Learn became effective and the guests climbed back into the lead at 39-36 with eight minutes to play in the game.

Burmeister had to sit down early in the fourth quarter due to a foot injury that hasn't quite healed and the Tide was able to take advantage of the situation.

"When Burmeister had to leave the game it hurt them," Gearhart noted. "A big part of the offense was gone and overall they're a better team with him in the game."

McGarry put the Tide up for keeps at the 4:13 mark with a 44-42 score.

Glendale tried to take back the lead, but Learn was able to swat away a good deal of the shots the Vikings put up.

"We had too many turnovers in the game," Strasser said. "And they were able to take away our inside game."

"We are coming around and it is good to be in a game like this, with a little more experience we'll win these games."

Gearhart also made note of the play of Tim Warren, who came off the bench to play well hitting some key shots in the fourth quarter.

"I'm glad the kids got this victory," Gearhart said. "In a couple of our past games we seemed to quit, but they came back and had some good practices and now we have something to show for it."

Curwensville is now 1-0 in the league and 1-3 overall and is gearing for a showdown with Clearfield tomorrow at Patton Hall.

Glendale drops to 1-4 on the season with a 1-1 MVL slate and will host non-league foe Juniata Valley on Monday for its next test.

DUBOIS — The atmosphere was much like that of a year ago when the Glendale High School boys basketball team invaded DuBois Central Christian for the final game of the Moshannon Valley League Championship, but the end result last night was a horse of a different color.

The Vikings came into DCC's gym with the determination and fan support that, a season ago, helped them get as close to the crown as possible without winning. Last night those same fans and the intense play gave the league's regular season third place finishers a 64-61 win.

The totally different attitudes coming into the game were again evident as the visitors showed spark in their step even in the pregame warmups while the Cardinals went through the motions. The difference was even shown in the fan support, with Glendale packing the bleachers while the DuBois Central fans were sparse.

The game was anything but a blowout even though the hosts did have things going their way in the first half when an emotional start by Glendale

faltered and the lead went to the Cardinals at 14-9 after eight minutes.

In the second period the DuBois Central squad had its fast break running and upped the tempo of the game to take a 35-25 advantage into the intermission seeming to smell their third MVL championship in a row as they ran off the court.

The February breezes brought different odors to the flaring nostrils of coach Mike Stasser's Vikings as they recalled last year's hard fought 55-54 heartbreak. Nothing less than a win would do and the regrouping at half time gave the Vikes the momentum to come out and get the job done.

"It's ironic that we had to come back here and win the championship after last year's loss," Stasser said. "After the first half the kids could have given up, but they haven't all year and they didn't tonight."

Glendale's offense came out on fire in the third quarter and the Haduck brothers, Paul and Lenny, made up the majority of the points with 11 and eight, respectively, while the Cardinal defense was keying on Dave Burmeister, who netted

17 markers in the first half.

"As brothers Paul and Lenny have their differences off the court," Stasser said. "But in the game it's the opposition who pays the price for their hard work."

Behind the Haduck's scoring burst the Vikings were able to jump back into the contest trailing by a slim 48-47 margin at the end of the third period.

The time ticked by in the fourth quarter with the two teams exchanging baskets as the Vikes couldn't seem to find an opening to move past until the 3:25 mark.

Rich Laing picked up a loose ball off of his own missed foul shot and converted it to knot the score at 56-56.

The difference came down to the fact that DuBois Central couldn't find the basket down the stretch and Glendale was able to hit some clutch free throws.

In the closing seconds, Burmeister iced the game when he was fouled intentionally with 13 seconds left. The foul gave Burmeister two shots and Glendale the ball. After making the second free throw the Vikes inbounded the ball and walked out of the gym as the new Moshannon Valley League king, a position that

they probably deserved last year as well.

"You can't take the win away from the kids, they played their hearts out," Stasser said. "It's not a district win or a state championship, but it means a lot to us."

"It was one of our goals at the beginning of the season and it made the perfect ending to a never-say-die year."

Burmeister finished as the games high scorer with 26 while Paul Haduck netted 15 and Lenny Haduck tallied 10 to back the great team effort.

Tim Tarcson sank 21 for the Cardinals with Tom Frank adding 15 and Sam Kirk 13.

The Vikes ranked third on the MVL regular season at 5-4 and finished the season with an improving 8-14 slate.

DuBois Central now moves on to the District 9 Class A tournament on Thursday as they travel to meet North Clarion in the opening round.
