Vikings Upset Hornets In Overtime

FLINTON — The Glendale High School boys basketball team made its 1987-88 debut a sweet success by scoring what has to be called an upset victory over Juniata Valley 52-51 in overtime last night.

Juniata Valley was slated as one if not the team to beat in the Juniata Valley League this season, but the tough Viking squad forced the game into overtime and calmly walked out with the victory.

"It's going to be hard to top this," Viking coach Mike Strasser said of the victory. "It was a good game the whole way through and our kids never gave up."

The hosts opened with a good first quarter which saw them hold a 10-6 lead. However, the strong Hornet team battled back to hold the halftime score of 22-18.

Dave Burmeister pac-

ed the Glendale squad with 16 points while Len Haduck contributed 14 to the cause.

The contest stayed close throughout the third period with the scoreboard reading 36-31 with eight minutes left to play.

Time wound down in the fourth quarter and the Vikes found themselves still trailing by five with under a minute left to go in the contest. Haduck sank a jumper to set the score at 47-44 in favor of the Hornets.

Burmeister committed a foul the next trip down the floor to put the visitors on the line with seconds remaining. The foul was Burmeisters fifth and he was forced to exit the game.

Thus, enter our hero, Tom Terza. Terza, who hadn't stepped onto the floor before this point received a pass off the

missed foul shot and as time ran out the three-point shot made its first appearance in the area as a game saver. Terza sank the shot under pressure and forced the game into overtime with a 47-47 deadlock.

"The kids handled the pressure unbelievably well," Strasser said. "When Dave fouled out there was no let down and in the overtime they did what they had to do."

Glendale won the tip in the overtime period and went into a delay game before Larry Cusick hit his third three-pointer of the game for a 50-47 lead. After the Hornets scored Joe Nevling converted two free throws to again give the hosts a three point lead. Juniata Valley scored once again and when a foul shot was missed by Glendale the visitors had a final shot at winning the contest.

Fortunately for the Vikings, the shot sailed wide and as time ran out the Vikings posted a 1-0 record.

Curt MacEachern canned 16 points for Juniata Valley with help from Travis Broadbent's 12 and Doug Mills' 10.

The Hornets did capture the junior varsity competition.

Glendale will try to continue its winning ways on Tuesday when they host Blacklick Valley.

Vikings Hot Hand Cools Golden Tide 58-43

ALLPORT — The opening round of the 21st annual West Branch Holiday Basketball Tournament ignored the bitter weather conditions of last night and produced two fine basketball contests

The opening game was a preview of a tough Moshannon Valley League match-up as Glendale dumped Curwensville 58-43 to advance into the finals tomorrow. The second game saw West Branch hang tough before falling to Clearfield 73-51

Last night's opening game showed a promise of things to come in the MVL. The Golden Tide and Vikings battled throughout the contest before the game finally went to the 1986-87 MVL champion.

The first quarter belonged to Curwensville and senior Devan Flanagan. The Tide had little trouble breaking the Glendale

press in the first period and Flanagan was on the receiving end of the press break. At the end of the frame Curwensville had mounted a 15-11 lead and eight of the points belonged to Flanagan.

"Our guys didn't look like they were ready to play until they got behind," Viking Coach Mike Strasser said. "When we were losing they decided to get started."

The momentum changed hands in the second quarter, hands and teams. The scoring moved from Flanagan's hand to that of Viking senior Dave Burmeister. Burmeister put Glendale into the lead with a hot outside hand that included four three-point field goals and 16 points in the first half. The halftime lead moved to 27-23 in favor of the Vikes.

"They were playing a tight defense on us at the beginning of the game," said Strasser. "Fortunately, we were able to hit the

outside shots and open up things a little inside."

The second half began with both teams taking steps defensively to stop the other and as a result just 15 points were scored by both teams in the third quarter.

The third quarter was a defensive struggle as Glendale put eight points on the board and Curwensville netted seven as things slowed slightly.

The final eight minutes saw the score jump from 35-30 to the final of 58-43 as the Vikings fired up once more to walk off with the opening game.

Burmeister finished with 26 points while Len Haduck and Larry Cusick each tossed in 12. Cusick's points included two three-pointers while Haduck worked inside.

Curwensville collected 16 points from Flanagan with sophomore Shane Pentz netting 10 in the losing effort.

"I was pleased that we played decent defense in the game," Strasser said. "We just have to take the season one game at a time and collect the confidence to build on."

The Vikings moved to 3-2 on the season with the victory and will now play Clearfield tomorrow.

Curwensville, 1-6, will take on West Branch in a consolation game starting at 7 o'clock.

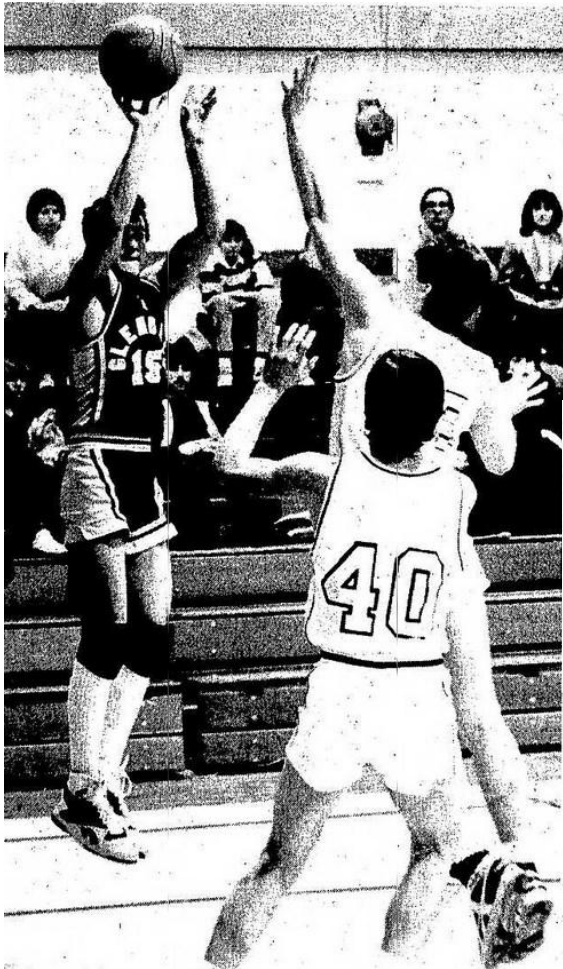

Vikes Tame Bisons For West Branch Title

ALLPORT — Area teams are making a new discovery on the hardwoods of late. There's a group of conquerors making a name for themselves, showing that coming from a small homeland isn't an automatic win for the larger tribes they meet.

The Vikings of Glendale are charting new heights on the basketball courts and are earning the respect of many area schools. The most recent team to feel the Vikings pressure is the Clearfield Area High School.

Glendale hustled its way past the Bisons 64-48 last night to take the West Branch Holiday Basketball Tournament away from the team who

had won it the past three years.

"We felt we didn't have anything to lose, I don't think our schools have ever met before," Viking Coach Mike Strasser said. "The kids felt they could beat them and went out and put it on the line during the game."

Curwensville captured the consolation game 71-48 over West Branch.

The Vikings are now 4-2 on the year and have played everyone tough to date. Even in the games they have lost (Blacklick Valley and Bellwood-Antis) the combined margin was 15 points.

The Bisons opened the first quarter of last night's contest by holding a slight lead, but could never shake the patient Viking squad. Clearfield held a 12-11 lead after the first eight minutes, however, the remainder of the contest saw the tourney champs holding the edge.

"I thought Glendale deserved to win the game, they were ready to play and stayed tough throughout," Bison Coach Pat Gahr said. "This will be a good opportunity to see what kind of Character our team has and if they are able to bounce right back."

The Vikings applied a full court press that bothered Clearfield from start to finish causing 21

turnovers. Glendale also pumped in 26 of 45 field goals for a 58 percent shooting outing.

"The press was one of the big factors in the game," Gahr said. "It made us play at their tempo and not ours."

While the press and hot shooting caused problems for Clearfield, the fact that the Vikings used a very balanced attack was even more frustrating for the Bisons.

Dave Burmeister, the tourney's Most Valuable Player, lead all scores with 17 points. Larry Cusick and Len Haduck picked up the scoring slack when the Bisons keyed on Burmeister to score 15 and 14 respectively. Joe Nevling and John Ninosky also contributed to the scoring with eight apiece. Cusick and Haduck were both selected to the All-Tournament team as well as Burmeister.

"It's been a common error for teams to think we're one dimensional with Dave," said Strasser. "This team meshes together well and we're looking forward to the rest of the season."

Glendale took the lead at halftime by a 29-25 score and never turned back as the advantage went to 10 points at the 5:51 mark of the third frame. The 10-point lead held throughout the re-

mainder of the game as the Bisons simply couldn't break the hot shooting Viking's spell.

"We have to learn to handle the pressure better if we want to be competitive in our league," Gahr concluded.

Kevin McCracken, also an All-Tourney selection, paced the Bisons for the second night in a row with 16 points while Jamie Wright and Mike Baum finished a good tournament with nine and eight respectively.

The final tournament all-star came from the third place Golden Tide squad. Devan Flanagan backed up a fine opening round with a solid performance last night that impressed coaches in the balloting. Shane Pentz and Tim Warren topped the Tide scorebook last night with 14 and 13 respectively and Paul Painter came off the bench to contribute nine points and board strength. Thirteen players entered the game for Curwensville and 12 scored.

Matt Beck canned 22 points in the losing effort for the Warriors.

Glendale will next host Curwensville, 2-5, on January 7 in a Moshannon Valley League contest. Clearfield, 4-4, travels to Bishop Guilfoyle on Monday. West Branch, 0-5, wel-

comes Bucktail on Monday.

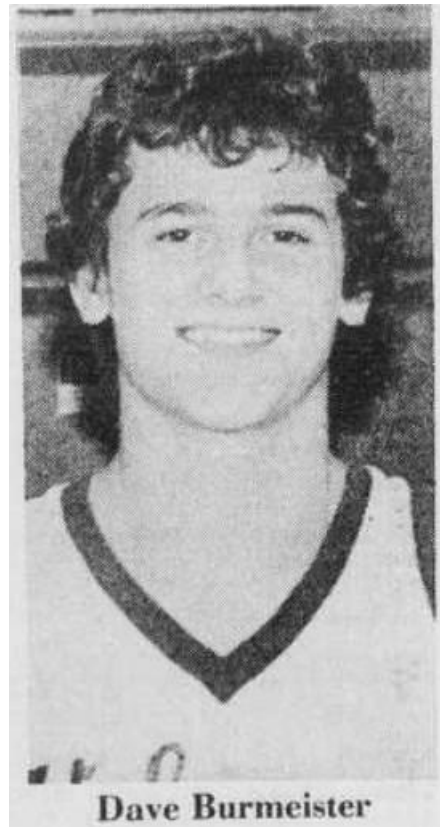
