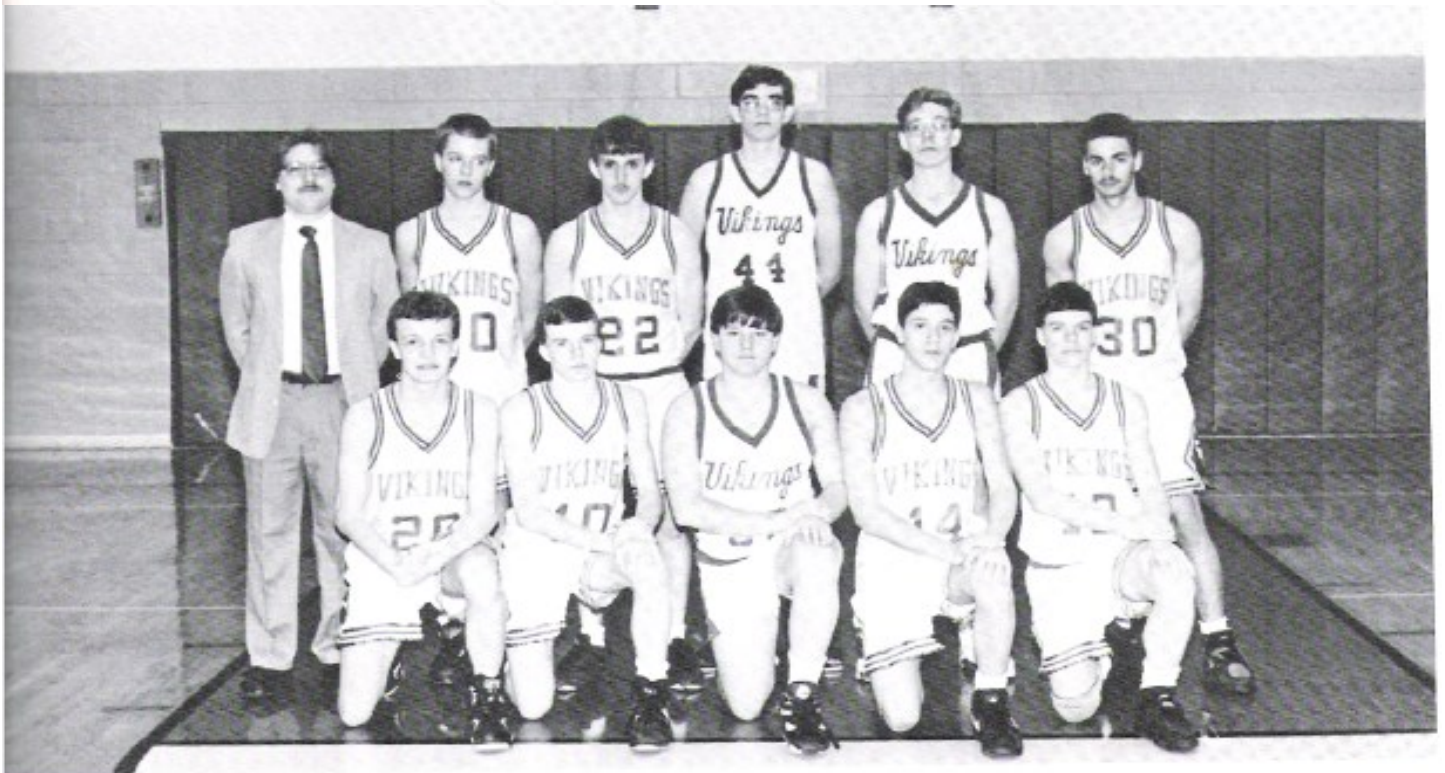

CURWENSVILLE - Both coaches came into the game with similar game plans - Let the big men cancel each other out and hope for the rest of the lineup to do the job.

Tide's senior center Khase Wilkinson and his sophomore counterpart Steve Sinclair did equal each other statistically. Wilkinson netted 22 points and pulled down 11 rebounds, Sinclair scored 21 points and collected 11 rebounds. But the battle of the supporting cast went clearly to the Golden Tide who put three other players in double figures in scoring in their 70-55 victory over the Vikings at Patton Hall last night.

The win improved the Tide's record to 10-4 and 4-1 in the Moshannon Valley League and kept them one game behind league leader DuBois Central in the loss column. The Vikings (6-8) dropped their fifth straight game and fell to 2-3 in the MVL.

With Sinclair and Wilkinson 1-2 on the Progressland scoring leader board, both coaches hoped they would at least offset each other and set up a 4-on-4 match-up in the scorebook. The Tide won that battle as Brad Pentz (13), Scott Irwin (12), and Mike Richards (11) each hit double figures. Ryan Andrews, despite 3-for-18 shooting, was the only other Viking in double figures with 11.

Vikings coach Mike Strasser's strategy was to pull Sinclair outside to free up the rest of the offense and get Wilkinson out of the paint. While Sinclair got his points, the rest of the plan didn't work.

"We wanted Steve to come out and get Ryan some open shots inside," he said. "We thought we could have a tradeoff with Steve and Khase and go with the match-ups, but the bottom line was their perimeter shooting was better than ours. They came out and shot the ball well."

The Vikings shot 33 percent from the field (21-63) while the Tide shot 46 percent from the field (29-63), including 8-for-13 in the first quarter.

"Their game plan looked good on paper," said Tide head coach Randy Strickland. "But they weren't making their shots. We shot well when we had to and we were fortunate they weren't hitting their's."

Even though the Tide were sizzling and the Vikings were struggling, the Tide owned a 19-17 lead after one quarter. They pulled away in the second quarter, outscoring the Vikes 20-10, behind the shooting of Wilkinson and Irwin.

The seniors accounted for 13 of the team's points in the quarter as the Tide climbed to a 39-27 halftime advantage in the midst of a 11-2 run that helped

them build a 16-point lead midway through the third quarter.

But the Vikes played the Tide even the second half, causing Strickland to be a little uneasy even though his team held a double digit lead the entire second half.

"We were in control but it seemed like we could let them in the game any time," he said. "I was nervous."

The Tide responded to any Vikings uprising with key baskets. After Luke McClellan cut the Tide's lead to 47-36 with under a minute left in the third, the Tide played the clock to perfection as reserve guard Duane Barrett hit a jumper before the buzzer sounded.

It started a Tide 7-0 run that put Glendale's comeback hopes to rest. Irwin, who was 6-for-10 from the field, scored to put his team up 54-36 early in the fourth quarter.

"I thought we played well tonight for a quarter, our mental game was not there and they took advantage of it," said Strasser. "You can't do things like that against a good team like them."

Glendale cut the deficit to 11 one more time with 4:39 remaining on the strength of a six-point outburst from Sinclair but the Tide answered with a 13-3 run - 7 points from Wilkinson - to solidify the victory, making Strickland's day, in which his son Nicholas turned 4 years old, even brighter.

The Curwensville jayvees also won, 49-28, behind Jason Miknis' 16 points and Eric Wassil's 15.

The Vikings travel to Moshannon Valley tonight while the Tide visits Brockway Monday.
