McClellan has been slowed in the preseason by a broken hand he suffered against Moshannon Valley in the ninth game of the football season. According to Strasser, McClellan got his cast off on Nov. 21 and he's wearing a brace on the hand.

"He's real versatile," Strasser said. "He's maybe 5-10 or 5-11, but he's real strong and does handle the ball well. He can fit in anywhere."

Also looking for starting jobs at the guard spots are senior Scott Jones and juniors Jason Turner and Yuki Marasusumu. Strasser said he is looking for big things from his guards this season to help open up the inside game.

The biggest loss at the guard spot is at the point where Shawn Wagner (13.8 ppg.) graduated.

"If we get good production out of our guards and can take care of the basketball, I look for us to have a fairly good year," Strasser said. "If we struggle there, we're going to struggle in the win-loss column." Looking to fill the forward spots vacated by the graduated Andrews (10.1 ppg.) and Mike Ninosky (3.3 ppg.) are seniors Mike Gorman (6-6) and Steve Brink (6-3), and junior Gary Jasper (6-4).

"It's going to be difficult to fill those holes, but I think some kids will step up," Strasser said. "We're big and I really feel that for the most part our big kids are fairly athletic too, which is a help."

Glendale, which finished 12-13 last year, opens the season Friday against non-league foe Philipsburg- Osceola. The Vikings tip off the Moshannon Valley League season Dec. 9 at Harmony. The Juniata Valley League slate opens Dec. 22 at Mount Union.

EBENSBURG Steve Sinclair is Glendale's all-time leading scorer, so it was only fitting that in the last basketball game of his scholastic career he once again led the Vikings in scoring.

It was just another night at the office for the Vikings' big man.

Unfortunately, his 24-point effort wasn't enough as Bishop Carroll opened up a 47-25 lead at the half and cruised to a 69-52 win in the first round of the District 6 Class A playoffs at Central Cambria High School last night.

"I'm sad to see it come to an

end," Glendale head coach Mike Strasser said. "He's done a great job for four years. Tonight was another good performance.

"I'm glad he went out on a real solid note like he did."

Sinclair ends his career as Progressland's all-time leading scorer with 1,946 points.

Bishop Carroll (10-14) got off to a strong start, outscoring the Vikings 26-13 in the first quarter. Guards Craig Ernest and Matt Farabaugh paced the Huskies' first quarter run with eight points.

'We don't normally shoot the ball like that, and I wish we could do that all of the time," **Bishop Carroll head coach Dan** Gueguen said. "We knew coming in that we had to be patient on offense and work for the good shot, which we were able to get."

Glendale (10-15) was able to stay with the Huskies the first four minutes. Junior Jason Turner's two early lay-ins helped the Vikings take two two-point leads.

The Huskies got the offense rolling after Glendale's Gary Jasper nailed a jumper at the 5:27 mark to tie the score at six. Jeff Farabaugh opened the Bishop Carroll assault with a putback and a lay-in to give the Huskies their biggest lead at the time, 10-6.

Sinclair kept the Vikings close with a lay-in and a jumper, but two Ernest threepointers upped the Bishop Carroll advantage to 20-11 and forced Strasser to burn a timeout.

Ernest was a perfect 8-of-8 from the field in the first half for 20 points, en route to a 26point performance for the game.

"He had one of those nights where everything was going in for him," Strasser said. "He was getting good looks at the basket and getting his feet set. We said if he got his feet set we were in trouble, and that happened to us. He put on a good performance tonight."

Out of the Glendale timeout, Paul McClellan's jumper moved the Vikings within seven points before the Huskies closed out the quarter with buckets by Matt Farabaugh, Ernest and Matt Raptosh to take a 26-13 lead.

**Bishop Carroll's lead reached** 21 points with 1:30 to go in the second quarter on J.P. Maurer's lay-in. Jon Serenko's foul shot with four seconds remaining gave the Huskies a 47-25 advantage at the half.

"In the first half we did a real nice job of executing our of-fense," Gueguen said. "We were waiting for the good shots, and we were fortunate to make them."

The lead reached 24 points on two occasions before the Vikings got their offense and working. After defense Ernest's foul line jumper increased the lead to 51-27, Glendale outscored the Huskies 12-4 the rest of the third quarter to trail 55-39 at the end of three.

Sinclair's lay-in at the 3:47 mark got the Bishop Carroll under 20 points for the first time since late in the second quarter. Sinclair contributed six points to the Vikings' run.

"He got to a point in the third quarter where he was so exhausted he had to come out of the game," Strasser said. "He carries us, and that's what he did again tonight."

Clamping down on the defensive end also aided the Vikings' comeback. During the late third quarter spurt, Glendale forced three Huskies turnovers.

"In the second half things got a little sloppy," Gueguen said. "They were playing straight man-to-man in the second half. When they play man they just leave Sinclair hang out in the paint, and that can distort things for you a little bit."

Rob Horvath's second threepointer of the game opened the fourth quarter for the Huskies and rebuilt the lead to 19 points.

An Erich Wagner free throw and lay-in, and a Sinclair lay-in got the lead down to 58-44 with 5:45 left in the game.

After Jeff Farabaugh's short jumper, Sinclair brought the crowd to its feet by stealing an errant Bishop Carroll pass at midcourt and taking it straight to the hoop. He sent it home with a one-handed tomahawk dunk to cut the deficit to 60-46 with 3:57 remaining.

"He was running the floor, playing defense, blocking shots, (and) he put that dunk down, Strasser said. "He played well on both ends of the floor.

The Vikings got the lead down to 11 points 57 seconds later after Wagner hit one of two free throws resulting from Jeff Farabaugh's technical foul for hanging on the rim, and two Jasper free throws.
