Hole in the middle:

Vikes must try to replace Sinclair

FLINTON - Who's going to score?

That's the big question facing the Glendale Viking boys' basketball team after Steve Sinclair graduated this spring.

Sinclair was the 10-15 Vikings do-everything man, scoring a school-record and Progressland all-time high 1,944 points, grabbing 1,148 rebounds and 377 blocked shots.

"We lost three starters and Sinclair is impossible to replace. We have a limited number of players who have played on the varsity, so it's a concern how they will react," Viking head coach Mike Strasser said.

Strasser, in his 11th year as head coach and 12th overall, has a small, quicker team that will depend on 3-point shooting and pressure defense.

"With our lack of size we are working on rebounding the ball. The 3-point shooting is a strong suite for us, but we have to have the ball if we are going to score," Strasser said.

Senior Jason Turner and junior Paul McClellan are both returning starters for Strasser. McClellan is the returning scorer for Glendale with 8.6 points per game. He also made 20 3-pointers. Turner averaged 7.3 ppg.

Strasser said senior Yuki Murasusumu, juniors Mike and Mark Harpster and sophomore Jared Andrews are probable starters.

Mark Harpster played in 15 games last season averaging 1.1 ppg. Both Harpsters are 6-1, Andrews is 6-2 and McClellan is 5-11. Strasser hopes that group can pick up the rebounding slack.

With only 14 players out for the team, Strasser is concerned with depth over the course of the season.

"We're trying to run two programs and it's tough with these numbers. We have a lot of kids that haven't played varsity, but the guys are working hard and starting to step up," Strasser said.

Glendale scrimmaged Calvary Baptist last week and six players scored in double figures.

"We want to be .500 and I want to see improvement every week. If we improve every week, the numbers will take care of themselves," Strasser said.

Glendale, competing in the Mo Valley and Juniata Valley leagues, will have its work cut out. The Vikings were third place, 4-4 in the MVL and fifth place, 5-9 in the JVL.

Juniata Valley was 27-4 and a state finalist in Class A, Bellwood-Antis was 17-10 and Williamsburg went 17-11. Curwensville was 19-7 and Harmony was 19-9 in the MVL.

"Both leagues are very competitive, so we'll have our work cut out for us," Strasser said.

Glendale opens its season Friday night in the Northern Cambria Tip-off Tournament.
