## Bahr takes over Glendale boys' basketball program

FLINTON - A new era in boys' basketball Glendale begins as Jason Bahr becomes the new head coach of the Vikings after replacing Mike Strasser, who stepped down last spring after 12 years at the

Bahr, who comes to Glendale from Aquinas High School in Lacrosse, Wis., inherits a team that will look to improve on its 8-16 record from last season.

Glendale also hopes to better its Moshannon Valley (4-4) and Juniata Valley (5-13) league records. With the talent returning, Bahr is optimistic that the Vikings will improve.

"The players have a real pos-itive attitude," Bahr said. "I'm still getting to know them as they are getting to know me. Basically I tell the players that I'm going to push them to work hard. We have the talent to win some games this year.

The Vikings must replace graduates Erich Wagner, Paul McClellan and Mark Harpster. Wagner, a Progress First Team All-Star selection last year, led Glendale in scoring at 16.3 points per game. McClellan and Harpster added 10.6 and 5.7 points per game, respectively.

There are six letter winners returning for the Vikings this season. One of those returnees is senior Jared Andrews. This is the 6-4 guard's third year in the starting lineup. He pumped in 9.5 points per game last season. including 13 3-pointers.

"Jared will be one of the guys I'll be looking for to do well this season," Bahr said. "He can play wing or the post. He has definitely stepped up his game."

Junior Rick Swauger steps into the starting lineup after coming off the bench last season in the rolle of sixth man. Swauger fought off an ankle injury toward the middle of the season to average 6.7 points per

"Rick works hard every night in practice," said Bahr. "He is always hustling, always listening."

Seniors Jon Morrison (5.0) and Ben Mages (0.2) will pair up at the forward positions.

"Jon will be a great post player," said Bahr. "I expect good, strong play from him as well as Ben. With these two, we should have a pretty strong front court.'

The other returning letter winners are senior guard-forward Shawn Weaver (1.9) and sophomore point guard Brent Matish (1.8).

'Shawn works hard every night," said Bahr. "He's a fine example of hustle and determination. He has a nice shot from the wing.

"Brent played strong as a freshman toward the end of last season. He has picked up where he left off. He needs to not be afraid of being a leader even though he's only a sophomore."

Two other players that Bahr thinks will be right there in the mix are junior point guard Jim Dick and junior guard Mike Hoey. Dick averaged 1.6 points per garne and made three 3pointers in a reserve role last season. Hoey adds a solid shooting touch from the wing.

"I think that I have a lot of experience coming back," Bahr said. "I don't care who scores as long as we score. The kids work hard in practice and believe in themselves. I'm looking forward to a good year.

Bahr will be assisted by Brian Parrish. The Vikes open the season Friday at the Moshannon Valley Tip-Off Tournament against the host team.
