# Terza łakes over young Glendale boys' team

FLINTON - Whoever said you can't go home again never talked to Tom Terza.

Terza, a 1989 Glendale High School graduate and member of the basketball team from 198689 , returns to his alma mater as head coach of the Vikings after the resignation of former coach Jason Bahr.
"It has been going fairly well," said Terza. "Being a former player at Glendale, I am familiar with the system. I am also a football coach, so most of the kids I'm coaching in basketball I have had experience working with in football."

Terza will take over a team that, after posting an 8-16 record in 1996-97, fell to 4-20 last season. He said that battling a number of key injuries, most notably to senior forward Rick Swauger, and the overall inexperience of the team are the two main obstacles to overcome.
"We have a really young squad this year," said Terza. "We only have' three seniors and when you look at the roster you see mostly juniors and sophomores. We have also been bit by the injury bug. Rick tore a muscle in his shoulder during football season and recently had arthroscopic surgery. We are still waiting for him to be cleared to even start working. He would have been a big scorer and rebounder.
"We are also missing a sophomore by the name of Jared Leib. He is a really talented athlete. I think he might have been a probable starter. It looks like he will miss the season with a torn ACL. Sophomore Brad Harrison, who would have seen spots of varsity time, broke his leg in the Claysburg football game. He has been cleared to come back, but is just jogging on it right now."

Lost to graduation from last year's team was Jared Andrews who led the team and was seventh in the area in scoring at 15.8 points per game. Andrews, who was a starter from his sophomore year to his senior season, was named to the Moshannon Valley League All-Star Team.
"We are definitely going to have to spread the scoring around," said Terza. "Everyone is going to have to contribute. We are probably going to play eight or nine people. We are going to be doing a lot of building for the future this year."
The Vikings return four letter winners from last year's team. Leading the charge is junior Brent Matish. The $5-10$ pointguard tallied a 10.0 points per game average and topped the team in 3-pointers with 24.
"Brent is going to have to lead this team," said Terza. "He is our general on the floor. He is not only going to have to distribute the ball, but he is going to have to do his share of scoring. He is a really hard worker and I have nothing but positive things to say about him. To win some games this year, a lot of it is going to have to ride on his shoulders."

Joining Matish in the starting lineup is senior Jim Dick. The 5-10 guard contributed 2.6 points per game in 20 contests last season. Also getting the starting nod is Nathan Garman, a speedy $5-10$ junior who only saw action in three varsity games last season as a sophomore, but is expected to see a much larger role this year.

Terza will round out his starting five with a pair of sophomores in Adam Beers (5-7) and Kyle Dague (5-9).
"Adam is very quick," said Terza. "That is going to help us out a lot, especially on the defensive end. He had a lot of steals in our first scrimmage. He is just a consistent hustler out there on the court. Kyle is a good ball handler and he is going to have to step up if we are going to win some games."
Senior Mike Hoey, who appeared in 11 games last season, is expected to see a great deal of time off the bench. Junior Phil Ricketts is also being looked at for varsity time in a reserve role.
"Mike is probably our best pure shooter on the team," said Terza. "He is definitely a 3 point threat.
"Phil is going to have to be aggressive if he is going to help us out inside. His size is definitely an asset, but he is going to have to play an aggressive game."

Glendale opens the season Friday evening against Moshannon Valley at the Knight Booster Tip-Off Tournament. Tip-off is set for 7:30 p.m.
"The way we are going to go into it (the season) is we are going to play hard, make adjustments as needed and hopefully improve as the year goes on," said Terza, who will be assisted by Mike Ninosky.

AMESVILLE - Moshannon coach Tom Terza who took over Valley's Eric Gormont picked after the resignation of Jason up right where he left off last Bahr. Terza said that, despite season.

The Black Knight senior, who scored 31 points in a 71-69 heartbreaking loss to Bucktail in the District 6-A playoffs last February, tallied 23 points Friday night to lead Mo Valley to a season opening 71-43 win over Glendale in the first round of the Booster Club Tip-Off Tournament at Monte Close Gymnasium.

With the win, the Knights advanced to the tournament championship game this evening against Cambria Heights at 7:30. The Highlanders were a 57-56 winner over PhilipsburgOsceola. The Mounties and the Vikings will meet in the consolation game set for $6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$.

In addition to Gormont's 23, Jonathan Freeberg and Dusty Washell both hit double figures with 12 and 10 respectively. In all, eight of the 10 Mo Valley players who played in the game scored.
"That is how these guys are," said Knights coach John Lazor of his team's unselfish nature. "They are playing as a team. Anytime you have a team effort like that, you can't complain. We just have to come out mentally geared tomorrow night to play a lot better. If we do, we could win the tournament. That is what the guys have as their goal. It will be a tough one, but the challenge is there and we are gning to go for it."

Mo Valley's win spoiled the coaching debut of Viking head the loss, his young team played very hard and is improving from game to game so far.
"You could tell that we were a little nervous at the start," said Terza. "A few of our sophomores had the jitters and turned the ball over two or three times in a row. That is to be expected with young players so early in the season.
"I was pleased with our overall effort. In our first scrimmage against Tyrone, we did a lot of things poorly. Our second scrimmage against Altoona's jayvees, we improved a little bit. Tonight, we made one more step. We hustled and never gave up. We just got killed on the boards. That was a major factor in the game that hurt us."

Junior guard Brent Matish was a bright spot for the Vikings with 17 points. He connected on three of the Glendale's six 3-pointers.
"Brent did an excellent job
tonight in controlling and distributing the ball for us tonight," said Terza.

Lazor did point to the fact that even though Mo Valley did come out on top by 27, the Knights did not hit a 3 -point basket. It was something that Lazor said his team will need to overcome to be successful this season.
"I keep telling the guys that in the '90s, you can't win if you can't shoot threes," said Lazor. "Teams are just going to pack in the middle. Somebody is going to have to step out and start knocking down some threes."

After a mini 4-0 run to close out the first quarter, the Knights came out and extended its lead to eleven at $21-9$ on baskets from Brandon Stodart, Gormont and Freeberg.

A jumper by Phil Ricketts and a trey from Brian Dubler allowed Glendale to cut the Mo Valley lead to $21-14$ with $3: 34$ remaining until halftime.
A runner in the lane by Gormont made it 23-14 at the 3:07 mark followed by a Knight 10-3 run in the final 1:54 of the half.
"Early in the game, we were a bit tentative," said Lazor. "For the first game you could kind of expect that. We were standing around looking for something to happen. We finally were forcing some turnovers and came out stronger in the second quarter."

Washell led the Mo Valley attack in the third quarter as his six points helped the Knights maintain their double-digit lead. Mo Valley held as many as a 24 -point lead in the quarter before Glendale cut the Knight advantage to 17, 47-30, at the end of the third on a jumper and 3-pointer from Matish and another three from Kyle Dague.

Mo Valley used a $24-13$ fourth quarter to set the 28 -point final. Gormont hit for 11 of the Knight's points in the quarter.
