Vikings hoping to build on success of last season

FLINTON — They may not have achieved a winning record or captured a league or district championship, but the Glendale boys' basketball team made significant strides last season.

The Vikings won nine games in 2000-2001, the most since the 1994-95 squad, led by Steve Sinclair, went 10-15 and earned a trip to districts. Glendale also ended a 21-game Moshannon Valley League losing streak and came within a four-overtime, heartbreaking loss to Harmony of capturing the MVL championship.

The Vikings (9-16 last season) gave Saltsburg all it could handle in the quarterfinals of the District 6 Class A playoffs before falling to the Trojans, 56-51.

Glendale suffered a number of key graduation losses from that team. Gone are Adam Beers (11.8 ppg), Kyle Dague (7.4), Brian Dubler (5.6) and Chris Swauger (2.5). Phil Moore, a junior last season for the Vikings, transferred back to Clearfield for his senior season. Moore led Glendale with 18.1 points per game and was named to the Progressland All-Star First Team.

Another loss from last year's team was head coach Tom Terza, who resigned after three years at the helm of the Vikings. Taking over for Terza is Cambria Heights graduate Eric Nagel. A St. Francis College graduate, Nagel was an assistant coach at Cambria Heights for four years before taking the head coaching job at Glendale.

"Being a head coach as opposed to an assistant is definitely a different feel," said Nagel. "A lot of the planning and decision making is on my shoulders now."

Nagel is happy with the way his players responded to him and their work ethic as the season approaches.

"They really accepted me and we worked hard over the summer," said Nagel. "They really want to work hard and are willing to learn."

The Vikings do have a big gun back in junior Shawn Krestar. The only returning letter winner, Krestar was second on the team in scoring at 14.1 points per game. He was lethal from the three-point line as well, canning 66 treys. As a team, Glendale drained an area-best 190 three-pointers.

"Shawn is a really good player," said Nagel. "He's so versatile. We can put Shawn anywhere on the floor from one to five. You need kids like that."

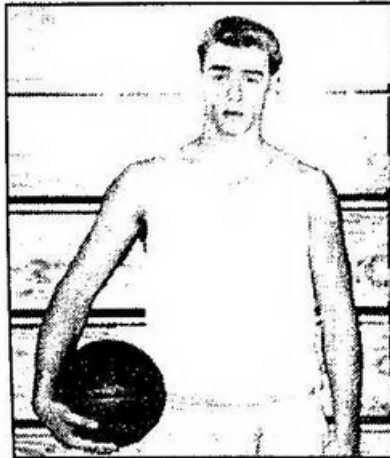

Other returning players who saw some varsity action last season are senior Ryan Cornelius, juniors Mike Morrison, Christian Yingling and Chad Kauffman as well as sophomores Bill Peoples and Scott Laing.

"Bill and Scott moved up last year as freshmen," said Nagel. "They got some good experience."

Peoples, at 6-5, is expected to man the inside for the Vikings.

"Bill's come a long way," said Nagel. "It's great to have someone that's 6-5. Not many teams have a player 6-5. He was definitely a presence in our recent scrimmage. He gives us help on the boards."

Cornelius is another one to look out for this season.

"Ryan is a very hard worker," said Nagel. "If you ask him to do something, he'll do it. He did some really nice things in our scrimmage."

Nagel knows the Juniata Valley League will be tough this year, but he feels the tough competition will serve his team well.

"The JVL is not an easy league," said Nagel. "Two teams, Juniata Valley and Williamsburg, played in the (Class 6-A) district finals. The quality of the competition is good. You have to see that night in and night out. I'm anxious to see what we can do (in the JVL)."

Glendale is also ready to go after the Mo Valley League title. Curwensville is the defending champion.

"I'm excited to get going in the MVL too," said Nagel, who will be assisted by Jeff Steffans. "There are a lot of great rivalries in the MVL. Mo Valley is just right down the road. It will be hard to top last year's Harmony games. It's a great league to play in."

The Vikings kick off the season Nov. 30 at the Knight Booster Club Tip-Off Tournament. Glendale takes on Central Cambria in the first semifinal game at 6 p.m. followed by Mo Valley and P-O at 7:30. The consolation and championship games are set for Saturday at the same times.

Glendale vs. Central Cambria

In the first game of the Moshannon Valley Tip-Off Tournament, Glendale faced off against Central Cambria for the right to move on to tonight's championship game.

In the end, Central Cambria's aggressive style was just too much for the Vikings as they fell, 70-43.

"We just came out flat," said

Glendale head coach Eric Nagel. "We are green. Shawn (Krestar) is our only starter, so the guys need to get into it and I think they will. We did some good things, we did some bad things. Central Cambria is a good team."

Both teams started out slow in the first quarter, with the Red Devils taking a 9-5 lead at the end of the first frame.

Central Cambria picked up the pace in the second quarter, notching 23 points to Glendale's 10. Six of those Vikings points came from senior Shawn Krestar, who notched two of his five treys in the second quarter.

"Shawn play a good game

offensively," said Nagel. "He is going to be our go-to guy there. But I also think Christian Yingling played a great game for us tonight defensively."

Krestar finished the night with 25 points to lead all players.

Landon Sinclair led the Devils with 17 points, while teammate Bobby Keilman added 16 points.

Glendale seemed to bounce back in the third quarter, but the fast-paced Devils kept the up the pressure.

Quick start propels Moshannon Valley to win at Glendale, 67-50

FLINTON — The Moshannon Valley High School boys' basketball team used strong starts in both the first and second halves in a 67-50 victory over Glendale in a Mo Valley League and Juniata Valley League contest Monday evening at Glendale.

The Black Knights jumped out to a 14-3 lead to start the game and led 20-9 after one. Mo Valley, leading 34-22 at halftime, used a 12-3 run to start the third. The Knights held a 52-30 advantage after three.

"Getting out to that early lead is always crucial," said Mo Valley head coach Darin Ricciotti. "The kids worked hard for that. We need to keep sustaining that lead after we get it.

"We've talked about getting better at putting teams away," Ricciotti added. "If we have a lead at halftime, we want to make sure we take care of the game in the third quarter. Earlier in the year, we didn't do that. These last four games, we have done that."

Those two runs propelled Mo Valley to its fourth win in a row. The Knights improved to 5-3 overall, 3-2 in the JVL and 3-0 in the MVL.

"It's great to have a four-game winning streak," said Ricciotti. "They're really coming together and are continuing to work to get better as a team. We need to keep improving and be ready for every challenge."

Glendale fell to 0-7 overall and 0-5 in the JVL. It was the Vikings' first MVL contest of the season. Despite the tough start, Glendale head coach Eric Nagel sees improvement and the maintained positive attitude from his players.

"We had some lapses on defense tonight," said Nagel. "That comes with starting three sophomores and two juniors. Being that young, you're going to make young mistakes. Everybody's still learning the system. I did see some things tonight that I really, really liked."

The Knights took control in the third as Tom Wulderk canned a jumper followed by a two-point bucket from Steve Holencik.

Following a three-point play from Viking sophomore Bill Peoples, Lance Thompson and Matt Beilella connected on back-to-back three's to give Mo Valley a 46-25 lead with 4:29 to go in third.

"We were playing a lot of help-side defense and we were

sagging back," said Nagel, concerning the early third-quarter run by the Knights. "They would kick it out to Thompson and (Beilella). They hit those two threes — that's half of their run right there."

A three from John Swistock and a layup from Wulderk gave the Knights their biggest lead of the game, 57-30, with 7:44 to play. Mo Valley would maintain that lead over the next two minutes before a late Glendale surge.

The Vikings outscored the Knights 16-6 the rest of the way. Justin Baker drilled a 55-foot shot at the buzzer to set the final.

"I have to give the kids credit," said Nagel. "They just didn't give up. They just wanted to play. That's the kind of kids you want."

Mo Valley got another balanced scoring effort, led by Wulderk's 14 points. Wulderk also recorded a game-high eight rebounds.

Thompson added 12 markers while Beilella scored 11 and Holencik and Brad Esposti each tallied eight.

"Our kids are really starting to accept their roles as a team," said Ricciotti. "We need that balanced scoring to be successful. We need contributions from a lot

of people and I'm glad to see that we're doing that."

Peoples led all scorers with 15 points. Shawn Krestar added 14 for the Vikings.

Luke Martin led all scorers with 22 points as Moshannon Valley won the junior varsity game 77-44. Slade Glass added 17 for the Knights. Baker and Chad Kauffman each scored nine points for the Vikes.

Both teams are off until January. Mo Valley hosts Harmony on Jan. 2, while Glendale travels to Williamsburg on Jan. 3.

Glendale gets its first win of the season, 52-50

FLINTON — The Glendale Vikings are winless no more.

Glendale, which had come out on the losing end of its first nine games, got the job done Friday evening against rival West Branch, defeating the Warriors 52-50 at the Donald A. Kitko Memorial Gymnasium.

"This was a great win for the kids," said Glendale head coach Eric Nagel. "This was an intense game. We had a nice lead at one time. West Branch didn't give up. They fought hard. That's what high school basketball is all about."

The Vikes (1-9) improved to 1-1 in the Moshannon Valley League with the win. Glendale also upped its record in the Juniata Valley League's First Cycle to 1-7 with a make-up game at Penns Valley set for this

evening.

"You've got to give credit to these kids," said Nagel. "Even in practice, at 0-9, these kids could've packed it in. They've been very attentive in practice and have worked hard. They come in ready to go every day. I think we needed this win to keep it there."

West Branch fell to 2-9 overall with the loss. The Warriors fell to 0-3 in the MVL. It was West Branch's 12th straight loss in the MVL dating back to the 1999-2000 season.

The Warriors dipped to 1-7 in the JVL First Cycle. West Branch closes out first-cycle play with a make-up game at Juniata Valley Wednesday.

"Glendale deserved to win the game," said Warrior head coach Bill Etchison. "They played hard. They could've folded a couple times when we were making

those runs.

"Both teams played very hard," Etchison added. "With two teams that haven't had much success, there's something to be said about that."

Glendale built its largest lead, 38-26, midway through the third quarter. But West Branch didn't fold and battled back. The Warriors used a 10-0 run, getting five points from Matt Hertlein, to pull within two with 51 seconds left in the third.

The Vikings stopped the West Branch run with a Shawn Krestar jumper. Allen Pryde answered with a three for the Warriors at the buzzer to make it a 40-39 Glendale lead after three.

Both teams battled back-and-forth in the final stanza. The game was tied twice, at 44 and 46. A quick 6-0 run put the Vikings ahead 52-46 with 2:22 to play. Bill Peoples had four of

those points on two free throws and a layup, coupled with a jumper from Ryan Cornelius.

West Branch fired off one last rally as J.J. Reichard hit a jumper with 2:07 to play, cutting the Glendale advantage to 52-48. With nine seconds to play, Hertlein converted a layup, closing the margin to 52-50.

The inbounds pass was heaved downcourt to Krestar who closed in for a layup. Krestar missed the layup and Hertlein grabbed the rebound. Hertlein had just two seconds to get off a shot from 70 feet. As he was releasing the shot, contact was made and the shot was deflected as the buzzer sounded.

West Branch led by five points at two different times in the first quarter. The Warriors led 14-13 after one quarter and 16-13 with

a minute gone in the second. Glendale used a 7-0 run to take a 20-16 lead at the 4:14 mark and never trailed the rest of the game.

"When we were leading in the first quarter, we should've put them away," said Etchison. "We came down and threw the ball away and got guys in foul trouble."

Each team made 21 turnovers in the game.
