# Hard-working Vikings looking for improvement

FLINTON - If what Glendale boys' basketball coach Eric Nagel has seen in practice is any indication of what he can expect from his team this year, the Vikings may be

in for a successful season.

"The attitude of the kids this year is great," Nagel said. "I really like our defensive intensity in practice. These kids have really stepped it up from last year to this year. We have been talking about that — being able to play really intense man defense, and these kids have shown the ability to do that through the last couple weeks of practice. We are definitely further along at this point than I anticipated. These kids just want to work.

Last season, Glendale had just one returning letter winner and suffered through a 3-21 season. But Nagel, who is in his second season as Vikings' head coach, returns the core of the team for the 2002-03 season including five letter winners (Shawn Krestar, Scott Laing, Derek Kauffman, Mike Morrison and

Christian Yingling). Krestar, a Mo Valley League All-Star and Progressland second team selection last year, led the Vikings in scoring with 14.2 points per game. Morrison, who averaged 7.0 ppg last season, was also named to the Progressland team as an honorable men-

"Shawn (Krestar) is a two-year letter winner that is hopefully going to be the leader on the floor," Nagel said. "Shawn is our leading scorer from last year, but I think the load will be off his back this year. If Shawn isn't hitting on a given night, I think that we have people like Scotty Laing and Derek Kauffman that can step up. And Christian (Yingling) and Mike (Morrison) as well all four of those guys can step up. I think that comes from the experience last year when they were playing as sophomores and

"Mike Morrison really started to step up toward the end of the year last year," Nagel continued. "He really started to put it all together, and hopefully that will continue

into this year."

Glendale will once again compete in both the Mo Valley and Juniata Valley Leagues, and Nagel hopes his team can make a good

showing in both.

"We are returning five letter winners from last year, so there is a lot of experience, Nagel said. "Our expectations are higher this year than they were last year. We definitely want to be competitive in the Mo Valley League and the Juniata Valley League."

# Palmer clutch in Tide's win over Vikes

After scoring just one point through the first three quarters of play, Cory Palmer drained three three-point field goals in the final six minutes of the fourth, including the game-winning shot with 11 seconds to play to give the Curwensville Golden Tide a 56-55 victory over Glendale on Monday evening.

"We hit some big shots at the end," Curwensville head coach Jim Fleming said. "Cory Palmer hit some clutch threes.'

Vikings head coach Eric Nagle had mixed emotions following the tough loss.

"I'm definitely proud of the way the kids came back," Nagle said. "However, like I told them in the locker room, we can't dig ourselves 13-point holes and win a lot of ball games. I am happy with the guts that they showed by coming back, but we just came up short."

In addition to Peoples and Krestar, Mike Morrison also scored in double figures for Glendale, netting 14.

For Curwensville, Greg Gilbert scored 14 points and pulled down 10 boards, while Anderson had 13 points and 13 rebounds. Palmer added 10.

Glendale won the junior varsity game 44-36. Mark Lyons led the Vikings with 14 points, while Todd Marino Curwensville with 13.

FLINTON — As Ty Swindell walked from the locker room across the Kitko Gymnasium floor to a waiting bus, Glendale boys' basketball coach Eric Nagel called to him.

"Mr. Swindell," Nagel began, then going on to compliment the Claysburg-Kimmel three-sport athlete.

It was appropriate for Nagel to use the title before Swindell's name. Just a junior, albeit a strapping 6foot-4, 210-pound powerhouse of a junior, Swindell is every bit a man near the basket.

Swindell scored nine of his gamehigh 23 points in the fourth quarter to lead the Bulldogs past host Glendale, 65-52, in Juniata Valley League action Friday night and dampen the evening on which Viking guard Shawn Krestar scored his 1,000th career point.

Swindell scored seven points in the last 4:40, as a four-point Claysburg lead swelled to the final 13-point margin.

When they came back, it was definitely crunch time there. We had pretty much controlled the first three quarters, and were hoping to in the fourth, but didn't," said Swindell, whose team had seen leads of 10 in the first quarter and 15 in the third melt away. "We made a few plays in the previous practices [which we went to down the stretch]. and Coach (Tony) Garver just made some excellent sets for me. I was lucky enough to convert."

After scoring his team's first eight points, Swindell quieted down considerably until stepping up in a big way in the fourth quarter.

"Our philosophy since the first day of practice has been that we're going to establish a presence inside, and I think we've done that. There are times we get away from it, but, by and large, that's who we are," Garver said. "I think [in the fourth quarter]. Ty just became more aggressive establishing position and give (the guards) a passing lane. He did a heck of a job.

Swindell scored off a Bruce Woodring feed on the ensuing possession, and, as the Vikings rushed to get back into the game, Claysburg was able to pull away.

"We got back in the game because we played hard," Nagel said. "Why weren't we able to get over the hump? We made some mistakes down the stretch, some young mistakes that hopefully won't be there next year.'

The Vikings only have three seniors on the roster. One of them, though, is Krestar, the sweet-shooting 6-0 guard who needed 15 points coming in to reach the milestone. After being held scoreless through nearly the first 10 minutes, Krestar found his rhythm and reached the magic number on a 3-pointer from the corner with 2:45 left in the third quarter. He finished with 22 points and six rebounds.

"I'm sure he was a little nervous coming in. He definitely wanted to do it in front of the home crowd. Thankfully, he did," Nagel said. "But, knowing Shawn, I know he's upset about the loss. It's kind of a bittersweet thing for him."
