Glendale boys basketball looks to continue success

FLINTON — The Glendale boys basketball team advanced into uncharted waters last season, finishing fourth in the District 6 Class A playoffs.

But Viking head coach Gregg Mazenko lost four starters from last year's team and five seniors total, who had 38 of the 63 points Glendale averaged per game.

But the cupboard isn't bare for the Viking program, which had struggled in recent years before Mazenko assumed the controls a season ago. Mazenko helped guide Glendale to an 18-9 mark and looks to build on last year's success.

"We tell the kids that if they play every game as hard as they possibly can, then that game will take care of itself," said Mazenko. "I don't want us to look at February — I want us to look at what's in front of us. I want our team to be focused on the present. It's good to have longterm goals, but I think that can be dangerous as well."

The Vikings lost leading scorer Mark Lyons, who averaged 14.5 ppg, as well as Mark

Yeckley, Richie Ball, Mark Noel and Colt Thomas to graduation.

Mazenko will look to returning starter Shane Krestar this season, as well as letterwinner Bill Ball, to help lead the inexpe-

rienced Glendale team. "Shane started last year and

Bill Ball started at times for us, and are pretty much locks to start this season," Mazenko said. "We have six or seven other guys competing for starting positions. We'll probably have a different lineup depending on what our opponents do, whether they run more zone or man. Our lineup will also depend on who is playing well at the time."

Krestar averaged 14 points per game last year and was a force pulling down rebounds.

"Shane pretty much controlled the rebounding for us last year," said Mazenko. "He pulled down 356 last season, and I look for him to exceed that mark this year."

Ball played a pivotal role off the bench last season, averaging 10.1 points per game. The Glendale senior also connected on 42 three-pointers and hit

36-of-42 free throw attempts.

"He started early for us last season, and last year gave both him and us confidence in what he can do," said Mazenko. "He ended last season on one heckuva note, scoring 27 points against Conemaugh Valley when Mark Lyons was in foul trouble. That game gave him confidence, and hopefully he can carry it into this season."

While Ball and Krestar are considered locks to start. Mazenko has been looking at several other players to fill the final three starting positions.

In the mix are seniors Jimmy Wagner and Andy Barnhart, junior Gary Walstrom Jr., and sophomores Brock Kauffman, Sam Yingling, and Brett and Ethan Hullihen.

"I knew last year that there were four guys that were going to start. Everyone this year needs to prove that they belong," Mazenko said. "Practice has been pretty intense and really competitive. I think the way the kids practice will help them in the long haul."

The Vikings will be competing in the Moshannon Valley League again this season, as well as the

Juniata Valley League.
"I think we have a lot of talent, although it is young talent. They still need to learn some things," said Mazenko. "We'll look to Shane and Billy to not let them rely on them all the time. We want five guys working as one, instead of relying on two guys to handle everything.

While Mazenko will have to welcome new starters to his lineup, he will also have to change the way he coaches.

"I had those guys last year since they were in ninth grade, and they knew what I was going to say before I said it, which made coaching easy," Mazenko said. "My coaching will be a lot different this year because I'll have to explain things that I'm not satisfied with. I have to be more specific with what I want them to do."

Glendale begins the season Friday at the Harmony Tip-Off Tournament, facing Claysburg-

Kimmel at 6 p.m.

"Winning is a mentality and a mind-set. We preach to these guys that if you work hard and play as one, then you will win,"

said Mazenko. "It doesn't matter what a school's history is, it matters what you put into it. If we do those things, then we will be pretty successful."

Glendale boys topple Claysburg-Kimmel

WESTOVER — The Glendale
boys basketball team tangled with Claysburg-Kimmel in the opening round of the Harmony Tip-Off Tournament Friday and was hoping to defend its title

from a year ago.
The Vikings made it to today's championship game with a convincing 49-29 victory over the Bulldogs and will meet Harmony for the title.

Shane Krestar posted a double-double, scoring 25 points and pulling down 15 rebounds. He also added six steals and had two blocked shots for the game.

"Shane picked up where he left off by controlling the boards and scoring," said Glendale head coach Gregg Mazenko. "They went small in the beginning, and our guards recognized that and got him the ball.

Glendale began the game on fire, racing out to an 8-0 lead, largely due to Krestar who scored 10 of his team's 15 points in the quarter, but Claysburg-Kimmel cut the lead down to two points after one period.

The Viking defense stepped up in the second quarter, holding the Bulldogs scoreless for the entire period while opening up a double-digit lead of 26-13 at the half.

"I'm glad that after we let them back in the game we were able to get aggressive again and play smarter and played hard-er," said Mazenko. "We started well but midway through the first quarter we let them back in

In the third quarter, Glendale built on its lead with some balanced scoring as Krestar, Gary Walstrom and Sam Yingling each scored four points for a 38-20 lead after three.

With a big lead Mazenko was able to play a lot of his players outscored Claysburg-Kimmel 11-9 in the fourth quarter.

A key stat in the game was the Vikings outrebounding the Bulldogs 46-18, and according to Mazenko, a nice positive for his team was the play of sophomore Brett Hullihen.

"Our rebounding advantage was key, and Gary Walstrom did well to clear out guys to allow Krestar to rebound," Mazenko said. "Also Brett Hullihen was a pleasant surprise ... I knew he could play defense well but he was very aggressive on the offensive end, which is what we need him to do."

Yingling contributed eight points to go along with seven rebounds and three assists, while Walstrom chipped in six points of his own and five rebounds.

Coach Mazenko was happy with the win but said his team needed to learn to not let up on a team when it has it down like it did in the first quarter.

"I told them that psychologi-cally we let them (Claysburg-Kimmel) believe they could win, and you never want to do that," said Mazenko. "You want to make a team think that it is over before they get back in it when you go up early like we did."
He also added, "Claysburg

played hard and got back in the game but we picked it up in the second period and the second half. We shut them out in the second quarter, and I told our team we needed to play with that intensity throughout the entire second half."

Caleb Fleck led the Bulldogs

with nine points. Kyle Nale added eight.

The Vikings will have little time to relish their opening game win as they face backyard rival Harmony for the championship tonight at 7:30.




