Stackhouse takes over Glendale basketball program

FLINTON — Only one season removed from a 15-11 record and nearly winning the Juniata Valley League, the Glendale boys basketball team will look very different when it hits the court for the 2008-2009 season.

Gone are head coach Gregg Mazenko, Progressland All-Star and 1,000-point scorer Sam Yingling and leaders Brock Kauffman and Brett Hullihen.

Rick Stackhouse takes over the reigns as Vikings head coach, and the team on the floor will be young. There also won't be as much depth as Stackhouse might like.

"I think our weakness, a little bit, is our numbers," Stackhouse said. "It's especially our age, you might say. We have one junior and one senior. Our depth and youth is our biggest concern."

However, Glendale does have some talent and returns two starters from last year as well as some major contributors who will be counted on even more this time around.

"We don't have a lot of kids, but most of the kids we have have been through our system since elementary," Stackhouse said. "And the kids we have, I think they're players. Even though we're young, our skills

are pretty good. I think that's a strength.

"We scrimmaged Saturday, and I was satisfied with how they played at both ends of the floor. We're going to be very young, but we certainly held our own in the scrimmage against Purchase Line."

Senior Vance Kimberly and sophomore Tyler Jenny return after starting last year, and the team will count on them for leadership on and off the court.

Kimberly averaged 9.4 points per game while Jenny dropped 8.8 ppg and was named a Progressland All-Star Honorable Mention in just his first season.

Junior Brad O'Donnell missed the first half of the 2007-08 season before returning to provide minutes off the bench down the stretch, while the 6-foot-2 Ethan Cree battled injuries but offers size in the paint.

"Ethan Cree and Brad O'Donnell both came off the bench last year," Stackhouse said. "Their playing time varied from game to game, but they certainly have to step it up. So far they have."

Lucas Westover and Ty Stackhouse, who played a big role on last season's junior varsity squad, will see varsity time this season as guards.

Defensively, the Vikings will run out of a base 2-3 zone, but will mix things up with varied looks. So far the new head coach has liked what he's seen on the defensive side of the ball.

"Just looking at one scrimmage ... I was satisfied with how we played defensively," Stackhouse said. "Everybody seemed to hustle."

Offensively, the emphasis will be on taking care of the ball and limiting mistakes.

"I'm going to let the kids run when they can run," Stackhouse said. "I don't mind that, but I believe in taking care of the basketball."

"That means not beating yourself. Try to limit your turnovers. I expect when we're in our halfcourt offense to be patient and not taking many bad shots, not taking many hurried shots."

While Stackhouse may be new as the ringleader, he is no stranger to the players on the team. Most recently an assistant to Mazenko, he has worked from the elementary level up through the system and is entering his 24th year in coaching.

"I was an assistant last year, and Coach Mazenko decided he wanted to step down and spend time with his family," Stackhouse said.

"These kids that are sopho-

mores, and my son is one of them — and that had something to do with it — I've been with them every year since third grade. I guess I'd say it was natural that I moved up with these kids."

Glendale will tip off its season Dec. 5 at Bishop Carroll.

Glendale gets past Moshannon Valley 67-62 in double overtime

FLINTON — Add another game to the list of classics in the Moshannon Valley and Glendale rivalry. The Vikings boys basketball team overcame a first half of turnovers and poor shots to stage a dramatic second-half comeback on Monday, downing the Black Knights in double overtime, 67-62.

"What a game," Glendale head coach Rick Stackhouse said. "What a strange game.

"We hung tight by coming back, and when it was close they hung tough every bit as much as we did. It was a good character-check for our younger kids."

The Vikings were led by Tyler Jenny with 20 points, and Vance Kimberly knocked down 18 points and grabbed 16 rebounds.

What felt like it could become a Mo Valley blowout at halftime changed quickly as Glendale

chipped away at the deficit in the third quarter.

"We knew this was going to be a tough game coming in," Mo Valley head coach Darin Ricciotti said. "Glendale's a good team. We jumped out to that big lead early, and we couldn't sustain it the way we wanted to. We can build off some things from this game and the effort we got from all the guys, and there are some things we really need to correct.

"They made some plays to start off the third quarter, and we couldn't really extend the lead the way we wanted to. ... They made some plays near the end, we didn't."

The momentum officially swung in favor of the home team when Viking Lucas Westover drove to the basket and knocked down the bucket with a second left in the third quarter, while also drawing a foul from Black

Knight sharp-shooter Tom Rowley.

Westover missed the free throw, but the layup kept his team within single digits of the visitors and the foul proved critical, as Rowley picked up his fifth foul in the first minute of the fourth frame, leaving Mo Valley without its top scorer.

Amidst controversy over Rowley's foul-out, a technical foul was also dished out and Jenny converted three of the ensuing four free throws to bring the Vikings within one possession of the lead.

"I'm not sure how we got out of our hole," Stackhouse said, "because we were still in a hole with about two minutes to go in the third quarter. A little bit of patience and some big shots."

Westover capped a 13-0 run by draining a 3-pointer with 4:48 left in regulation, giving Glendale its first lead of the game. The soph-

omore guard finished with a career-high 14 points.

With time winding down and Mo Valley still on top, Westover knocked the ball away for a steal while drawing a foul and converting the first of two foul shots to tie the game at 48 with 1:17 to go.

Both teams had opportunities to win the game, but Knight forward Justin Dudurich drew a charge from Kimberly with only seconds remaining, and Nick Shawver couldn't hit a layup in traffic at the other end of the court.

Dudurich used a big first half to put together 13 points, 10 rebounds and three steals.

"I thought Dudurich picked it up for them in the first half," Stackhouse said. "He was hurting us as much as anybody."

The first extra period remained a stalemate as the two teams went shot-for-shot, but Dudurich watched his hook shot

slip through the net for a 57-56 advantage.

Jenny responded on the other end, draining a shot from outside the arc to take back a two-point lead. With less than a minute left, Mo Valley senior point guard Tyler Neff drove to the hoop for a bucket that sent the game to a second overtime.

Neff finished with a team-high 17 points, but fouled out early in the second overtime. The absence of both of the Knights' floor leaders — Rowley and Neff — was too much of a blow to overcome.

"It was already tough," Ricciotti said. "We already had a short bench to start the game. It was tough when we started losing guys on the floor, we had some people playing positions they don't normally play.

"We played hard right until the end, I give our guys credit. They didn't hang their heads or

anything, they just kept playing and kept trying to make some plays. And we did, but Glendale made more than we did."

Westover forced a backcourt violation after Mo Valley won the final tip, and with 2:26 left Ty Stackhouse converted two free throws to grab a 63-61 lead for the Vikings. Kimberly sank two shots from the foul line and iced the game with a steal and an easy layup with six seconds remaining.

Glendale (4-3 overall, 1-1 Moshannon Valley League and 4-1 Juniata Valley League) will look to build momentum off the win as it heads into a tough stretch of road games, starting at Williamsburg on Wednesday.

Moshannon Valley (5-3 overall, 2-1 MVL, 3-2 JVL) is back in action hosting Juniata Valley on Wednesday.
