

Experienced Vikings ready for season

FLINTON — If experience is the key to success, then the Glendale boys basketball team is in for a very good season.

The most experienced squad in Progressland, the Vikings return four of five starters and five letterwinners for the 2009-10 season, and the group hopes to reap the rewards of that veteran knowledge.

"Absolutely," Glendale head coach Rick Stackhouse said. "Hopefully that's our strong point, and I hope we're a touch deeper than we were last year."

"Last year we had a six-man rotation, and this year I feel we can go seven or eight. Even that one extra guy helps. I think that's going to be a plus for us."

Glendale brings back its top two scorers — versatile junior Tyler Jenny (14.3 points per game) and sharp-shooting senior Brad O'Donnell (14.0 ppg). Both were among the area's top 10 scorers.

Jenny is at his best with the ball in his hands and going to the rim, resulting in the second-most free throw attempts in Progressland a season ago (102). He also had the second-best free-

throw shooting percentage at 74.5 percent.

Gone is Vance Kimberly, the team's best rebounder and 3-point shooter, but the rest of the returning cast will look to fill that void, and the team comes out of the offseason physically stronger than it has ever been. That should allow guards Lucas Westover and Ty Stackhouse, along with forward Ethan Cree, to provide support to the other two top scorers.

"We're fairly athletic, and the kids have certainly gotten stronger," coach Stackhouse said. "I think it makes you a little more aggressive and a little more physical. I think it's going to help with our rebounding."

The extra muscle won't hurt on defense either, where the Vikings already excelled last year. Glendale was the area's top defensive unit, allowing only 49.3 ppg.

After seeing limited floor time as a freshman, lanky 6-foot-4 forward Michael Wigfield will be counted on in a bigger role this season as the first man off the bench. There will also be contributions from the team's younger contingent, with the coaching staff happy with how

some of the freshmen have performed so far.

But even with a lot to be excited about, the Vikings aren't resting on their laurels. The preseason hasn't been perfect, and Glendale is looking to address some issues before the real deal gets under way on Dec. 15.

"If we stay where we are, we'll be OK," coach Stackhouse said. "I'd prefer we be better than OK."

"We're not meshing yet. To have a good season, it's not just going to fall in place and happen. There's work involved."

The head coach feels most of the hurdles are "between the ears," and wants his group readied for a tougher campaign.

"I really emphasize how much the game is mental," coach Stackhouse said.

"Last year we were young and there might have been a few teams that looked past us; won a couple of games we shouldn't have. I don't know if that's going to happen this year."

As for predictions, coach Stackhouse wants no part of those.

"I'm not even into that a little bit," he said. "I'll let you know when the season's over. I've always coached one game at a

time. After the season's over, that's when you can reflect."

The new effort gets under way hosting West Branch on Dec. 15. Tip off is at 7:30 p.m.

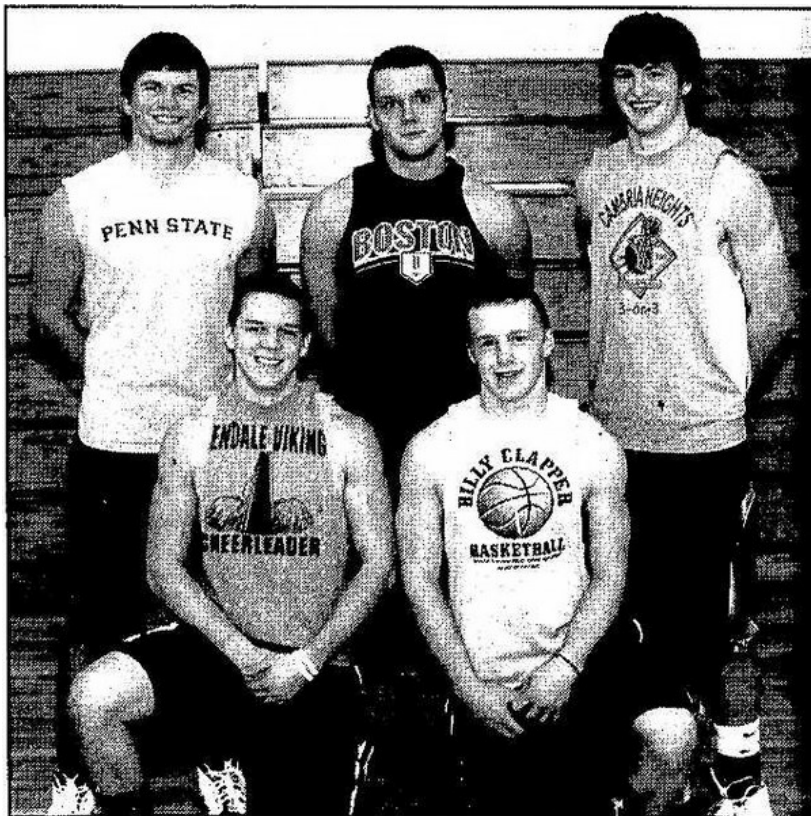

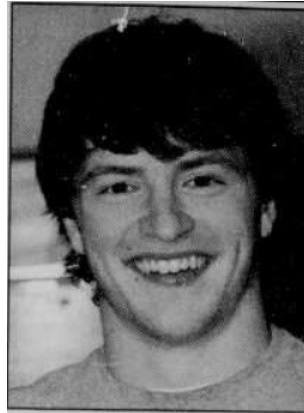
