

With new coach, Glendale boys hope to continue success

FLINTON — The Glendale boys basketball team had its fair share of ups and downs last season. After the team started the season at 5-7, reaching the district playoffs seemed to be a distant dream.

But the Vikings picked themselves up and won nine of their next 10 games and won the Moshannon Valley League to earn their spot in the playoffs.

Glendale's season ended in a two-point loss to perennial power Bishop Guilfoyle in the third place game for a spot in the PIAA state tournament.

Six seniors graduated from that team that finished with an overall record of 15-10, including Progressland Player of the Year Michael Wigfield and honorable mention selection Kyle Wright.

Mark Yeckley also stepped

down as head coach over the off-season and handed the reins to Ryan Pastva, who was an assistant on the senior-laden team a season ago.

"It has been a growing process so far," said Pastva. "As with any new head coach, the players have to adjust to the way I manage the team. Expectations are different from coach to coach and it is something we are growing into. Practices have been flowing better as the season goes on. The biggest problem is the season hasn't started yet. The guys are ready to see some other opposition."

"Kyle and Wiggy did a great job for us last year and they did leave voids in the starting lineup. The players we have now are not expected to replace Kyle or Wiggy, but they are expected to give it their all. Those players

will work to play within themselves and the gameplan we set out each game.

The Vikings return three letterwinners this season, including a key piece from last year's success in senior letterwinner Damon Braniff. A second-team Progressland pick last season, Braniff finished in ninth place in the area in scoring with 11.1 points per game and also averaged one three-pointer a game. Senior Chris Wilson and junior Dakota Sinclair join Braniff as the top returnees for Glendale this season.

"I expect to see some leadership from them," said Pastva. "This is something they know and realize that they need to do. They have some shoes to fill, but they have the ability to do that if they lead the rest of the team there."

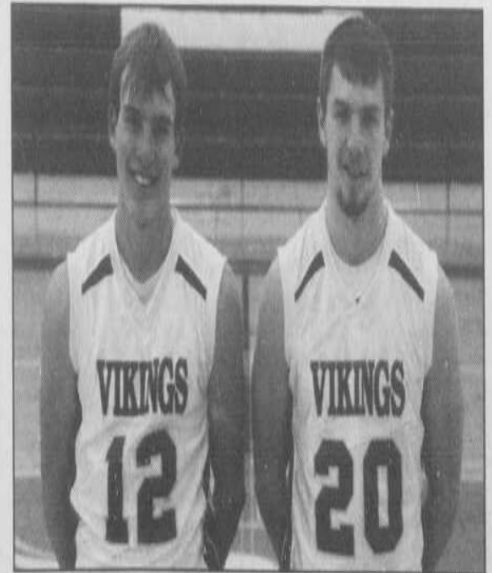
The Vikings also have a trio

of newcomers out for the team this season in seniors Derrian Matchock and Bill Snyder and junior Marcus McCrae.

Still, Pastva is hesitant to name a starting lineup for the Vikings' season opener.

"I have an idea of who will be in the starting lineup, but nothing is set in stone," he said. "There are some guys working really hard that could crack the starting lineup or even earn a spot as a role player if they continue to improve. The team knows that this can change at any time for a variety of reasons."

The Vikings would like to build on what they showed last year in the District 6 Class A playoffs and their goals show that they have set the bar high again this season.

CURWENSVILLE — For the first 20 minutes of Wednesday's game against Curwensville, Glendale's Marcus McCrae had no stats except for a few rebounds.

But for the last 12 minutes of the game, McCrae helped carry the Vikings on his back, netting 13 points to help Glendale overcome a 16-point deficit in a 57-53 victory over the Tide.

"Marcus was the big key for me," said Vikes head coach Ryan Pastva. "He hasn't been hitting a lot lately and I've had the reins on him a little bit. He was feeling it and he took them and knocked them down. That was really big. We got after the boards in the end there. We played through some adversity."

Glendale led 10-8 after one quarter, but Curwensville responded with a 15-9 second quarter, giving them a 23-19 lead at the half.

The Tide were led in the second frame by eight points from Austin Jacobson. Jacobson finished the game with 12 points.

"Austin had a very strong game," said Curwensville head coach Shane Pentz. "He came up really big for us in the first half. He was able to convert some inside shots off some nice passes."

The Vikings struggled to hit shots in the second quarter, and turned the ball over several times, most of which the Tide converted into points.

But the visitors seemed to hang in there, even when Curwensville went on a 7-0 run.

"I've been preaching playing with heart regardless of the situation," Pastva said. "We've been in some tough spots in games, and so far we have done a really good job with the exception of one or two games. It showed that we have heart, and I'm proud of

the guys for that."

The Tide built a 43-27 lead after two straight turnovers by Glendale midway through the third quarter. Curwensville's Brett Gardner came up big in the frame, scoring eight of his team-high 15 points.

But the Vikings rallied, thanks to back-to-back 3s from Anthony Barnhart and Damon Braniff to cut the score to 43-33.

McCrae added a bucket before the Tide's Gardner hit a 3 at the buzzer to put the score at 46-35 heading into the final frame.

"Barnhart got us started there with a couple of 3s," said Pastva. "He was knocking them down. Damon had a few, too."

Barnhart and Braniff each finished the night with four treys. McCrae netted two.

reason we got away from that. We were able to hit some 3s and it worked out for us."

Glendale started off the fourth with two more 3s from Barnhart to trim the lead to 46-41 with 5:45 remaining in the game.

After a Gardner free throw, the Vikings got right back at it with two baskets from Braniff, including another trey.

Gardner and Tanner Elensky each had baskets to extend the lead back out to 51-46 before a 3 by McCrae cut it to 51-49.

Jacobson added a huge bucket with a jumper with just over three minutes to play off a pass from Gardner, who had a steal.

That put the score at 53-49, but the momentum was short-lived.

McCrae hit his second trey of the night at the 2:50 mark, before a turnover by the Tide set him

"Sometimes you live by the 3 and die by the 3," Pastva said. "We weren't getting some of the stuff we wanted inside late because we were getting away from our gameplan. What we did early was working, but for some up for another bucket shortly after, giving Glendale its first lead since the beginning of the second quarter.

"For some reason we got very tentative in the fourth quarter," said Pentz. "We stopped doing what got us the lead. We had a 16-point lead with a minute to go in the third quarter. They made back-to-back 3s there to end the quarter and that started the downfall. We just lost our confidence."

Up 54-53 with 1:42 to go, the Vikings called a timeout to set up their game plan.

A foul shot by Braniff with just over a minute left gave Glendale a 55-53 lead with 23.3 seconds left to play.

Curwensville was forced to foul, and the Vikings missed most of their shots, getting a free throw from Shea O'Donnell to put the score at 56-53.

A block by O'Donnell with 6.7 seconds left forced the Tide to foul McCrae. McCrae hit one of his two allotted shots, and a last-

second 3 by Curwensville fell short, giving the Vikings a 57-53 win.

"They made five 3-pointers in the fourth quarter," Pentz said.

"For some reason we lost shooters.

We told them the couple of shooters Glendale had, and we just weren't there to guard them. I credit Glendale for making the shots when they were open."

Curwensville was led by Gardner's 15 points and five rebounds. Alex Olson added eight rebounds and four blocks.

"From here on, we are going to play a lot of games and we aren't going to have a lot of practices," said Pentz. "We've played six games, and five of them have come down to the last couple of minutes. We just have to find a way to get a win."

McCrae had 13 points and 12 rebounds, while Braniff netted 21 points and seven rebounds. Barnhart had 14 points, while O'Donnell notched nine rebounds.

"We got down big in the third going into the fourth," said Pastva. "I've told them that we've come back from worse, and they know they have the ability to do that. Both sides fought really well. It was a good game."

Glendale improved to 3-3 overall and 2-0 in the Mo Valley League. The Vikings travel to West Branch on Friday night.

Curwensville (0-6 overall, 0-3 MVL) travels to DuRois Central Catholic on Friday.

Glendale won the junior varsity game, 29-27. Bill Snyder led the Vikings with 12 points, while Trey Rauckhorst had six for Curwensville.

O'Donnell pulls down 27 rebounds in Glendale's win over United

FLINTON — Not even a fire alarm could stop the Glendale boys basketball team on Monday evening.

The alarms, and the resulting evacuation, delayed the ending of the junior varsity game, but once the Vikings took the floor, they were the ones too hot to handle, downing visiting United, 65-34.

"This was the first time playing a team for the second time," said Glendale head coach Ryan Pastva. "It was a measuring stick for us. This was a show of how we improved. I feel like we have done a great job."

"The first time we played them, we shot lights-out, so I don't think the score was indicative of how we played in the first game."

The last time the two faced off

was in the opening game of the season. Glendale won that game, 58-41.

Vikings Damon Braniff, Marcus McCrae and Shea O'Donnell combined to score 17 points in the first quarter, while O'Donnell also had 12 of his 27 game-high rebounds in the frame.

The Vikings led 39-12 at the half, closing out the quarter with an 11-0 run.

That run was sparked by a bucket and resulting free throw from Gary Witherow, who finished the night with seven points and five rebounds off the bench.

"Gary stepped up very well for us," Pastva said. "He played

solid defensively. He was finishing when we got the opportunity. He did the little things right."

The third quarter was all O'Donnell — literally. O'Donnell scored 12 of the Vikings' 15 points in the quarter. Braniff added one of his three treys on the night to put Glendale up 54-22 heading into the final quarter.

The duo scored 41 of the team's points on the night, with Braniff picking up a game-high 22 and O'Donnell notching 19.

"Shea did an amazing job rebounding tonight," Pastva said. "That was awesome. It was big for us. He had a lot of rebounds. It was one after the other."

Part of Glendale's success was its ability to force turnovers and pick up a sizeable advantage on the boards.

The Vikings outrebounded the Lions 60-24 on the night. Most of

United's rebounds came in the fourth quarter.

"We didn't turn over the ball much tonight either," said Pastva. "I'm just glad we were able to get everybody in. The hard work paid off and we got everyone in from top to bottom. That's great."

All 13 players who were dressed for Glendale played in the game.

McCrae finished the night with 12 points and five rebounds, while Anthony Barnhart had four rebounds.

"Barnhart had a quiet night, but I still think he played well for us defensively," said Pastva.

"You'll have those nights. But he does everything we ask him to do."

"When you win a game like that, you can't really complain where the points come from."

United was led by 10 points each from Michael Gili and Tyler Offman. James Currie had six rebounds for the Lions, which dropped to 0-9 on the season.

The Vikings improved to 5-4 overall.

Glendale hosts Curwensville in a Moshannon Valley League matchup on Wednesday. The two played last Wednesday, and the Vikings rallied after being down by 16 points to defeat the Tide, 57-53.

"We got away with one at Curwensville," Pastva said. "They (Curwensville) know it, and they know what our shortcomings were. We've talked with the guys and we know what we need to do to have a more posi-

Saltsburg assumed a 36-29 lead entering the final period, only to watch the Vikings tie the score in the first two minutes of the quarter.

"On a couple of possessions I thought we got lazy on defense," Stitt said.

Barhnhart's third 3-pointer of the night put Glendale in front 45-42, with 3:04 left. Saltsburg achieved another tie, 47-47, when Mitchell Yard hit two free throws with 1:06 left.

After a Vikings turnover in

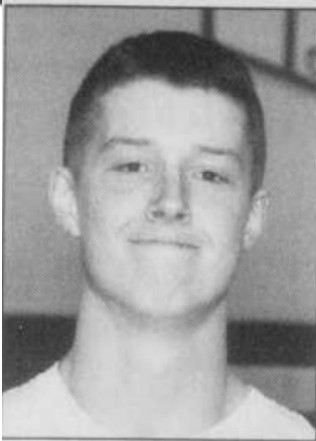

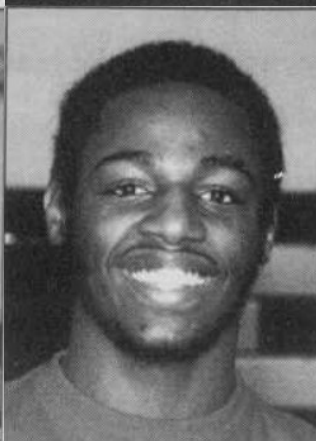

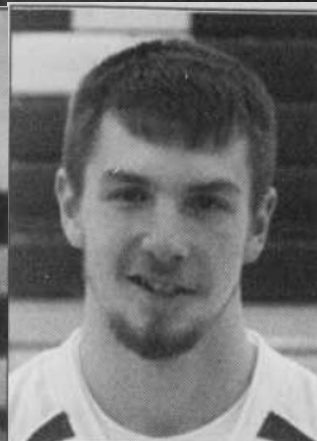
