Vikings return talented squad

FLINTON — Many things went the right way last year for the Glendale boys basketball team and first-year head coach Ryan Pastva.

Pastva led the Vikings to a 13-11 overall record, including a district playoff win over Saltsburg in the first round before falling in the quarterfinals to Bishop Carroll.

Pastva, now in his second season at the helm for Glendale, welcomes back four letterwinners for the 2013-14 campaign.

"The guys have been working really hard," Pastva said. "Even in the offseason, they've been putting in a lot of time in here. It's been a great team effort as far as work ethic. This has probably been the best effort I've seen since I've been around the program."

One of the greatest assets the Vikings feature this season is their height. Eight of the 12 players on the Vikings' roster are listed at 6-foot or taller. Shea O'Donnell, the tallest of the bunch at 6-6, returns after a stellar sophomore season last year when he led Glendale in scoring and was also a candidate for the Progressland Player of the Year.

O'Donnell scored in double figures 16 out of Glendale's 24 games last season, and even had a game late in the season where he scored 25 points and pulled down 20 rebounds.

"He has some lofty goals that he wants to reach

by the time he's done here," said Pastva of O'Donnell. "That only comes with hard work. I think he'll push himself, but he also wants what is best for the team. The chips will fall as they may for him. I know he's not out there for himself.

"We were very balanced last year. We had four guys that were scoring a lot for us, and we played a very good team game last year. I think you can expect to see a lot of the same team mentality with the guys working together. But I do expect to see some of the guys from last year step up and maybe take on some bigger roles."

Anthony Barnhart, Matt Schultz and Dakota Sinclair join O'Donnell as the four returning lettermen and all played significant roles last season. Barnhart was one of the primary 3-point threats last season along with Damon Braniff, who was lost to graduation.

Sinclair saw some time as a starter or was one of the first players off the bench for Glendale last year, averaging 2.6 points per game. Schultz also saw many minutes off the bench as a forward and put in 26 points on the season.

"I'd like to see them all step up," said Pastva. "They all did some of that last year, and I think they'll do more of that this year. Some of them missed out on some opportunities last year, and I think they're going to make up for that."

"I know they're itching to get out on the court and get going."

Seniors Colton Kimberly, Matt Kimberly and Gene Landeck all saw minutes on the floor last season and will be competing for time as guards.

Senior Tyler Potutschnig and junior Cameron Wigfield are both newcomers to the team, while sophomores Nate Braniff and Dane Mencer and freshman Jared Schultz will look to be in the mix in their first years on the varsity and junior varsity squads.

Pastva and Co. are looking to build on the successful 2012-13 campaign and would like to go even further in the playoffs.

"I thought last year we did better than we were probably expected to do," he said. "Even though we lost some big players from last year, I think we have some guys coming up that can fill those spots. We're working harder than I've ever seen, and I think that will bode well for the guys because hard work really does pay off."

Glendale opens the season on Dec. 6 at United before opening its home slate on Dec. 11 against Harmony.

O'Donnell's trey lifts Glendale over Curwensville, 56-55, in overtime

FLINTON — With 12.7 seconds to go in overtime, Glendale head coach Ryan Pastva called a timeout.

Problem was he got the timeout right as the Vikings scored to tie the game at 55-55.

The timeout negated the bucket, and in a game twist much like that of Michigan's Chris Webber calling a timeout he didn't have in 1993, almost cost Glendale the game.

But in another twist, the timeout ended helping the hosts, who got a trey from Shea O'Donnell with 9.4 seconds remaining to give the Vikings the 56-55 victory.

"We joked in the locker room that we called that timeout because we knew Shea would drain that," said Pastva. "But obviously, it wasn't something we had planned."

O'Donnell wasn't done with his heroics though, blocking one

final Curwensville try with 0.7 seconds remaining to help his team to the win. O'Donnell finished the night with 28 points, 18 rebounds and three blocks.

For the Tide, it was the second loss in overtime on the road this season, falling to Kane earlier this year.

"We have four losses this year, and two of them have come in overtime," said Curwensville head coach Shane Pentz. "We just didn't make plays down the stretch. We had our opportunities and just couldn't get it done."

Things looked easy for the Tide early on, as they broke out to an 8-0 lead to start the game.

Glendale came back and took an 11-10 lead, before Curwensville pulled back out to a 10-point lead in the second

quarter. The game was definitely one of runs, especially for the Tide, who forced 36 Viking turnovers on the night.

Unfortunately for Curwensville, it was able to get the lead, but not hold on to it.

"A lot of our offense comes from turning turnovers into transition baskets," said Pentz. "And, for whatever reason tonight, we just didn't convert at our normal rate and Glendale took advantage."

The Tide led 31-21 late in the second quarter, before the Vikings went on a 6-0 run to close the gap to 31-27 at the half.

Brett Gardner had 17 points at the break. He finished the night with 25 points, including six 3-pointers.

"Our guys didn't quit," said Pastva. "We knew Gardner could

shoot. We focused on him and (Tanner) Elensky. Gardner came to play. He was shooting the lights out in the first half.

"We tried to key on him in the second half, and I think that showed. He didn't get as many opportunities. He knocked some stuff down still, but good players do that."

O'Donnell quickly closed the gap in the third quarter, knocking down a bucket and drawing a foul from Tide starter Kyle Johns. Johns had three fouls early and was forced to sit much of the game.

A basket by Tyler Potutschnig tied the game at 31-31 before Matt Schultz gave the Vikings the lead with a jumper with just over five minutes to play in the third.

"Schultz did what leaders do,"

said Pastva. "You might see it in the minutes, but he wasn't on the bench complaining that he wasn't playing. He does exactly what you ask a player to do."

"It was a grade-A effort from him. It was perfect."

After trading the lead back and forth, O'Donnell sank a 3 to give Glendale a 37-36 lead. Gardner answered with a trey to give Curwensville a 39-37 advantage heading into the fourth.

Glendale retook the lead with 2:57 to go on back-to-back 3s from Anthony Barnhart.

A bucket by Gardner and a foul shot from Elensky tied the game with 1:17 left.

Curwensville went up 50-48 on two free throws from Elensky before Barnhart answered with a putback basket with 45.7 seconds to go.

Curwensville had one more chance at the ball, but it was rebounded by O'Donnell.

Glendale took the ball down the court before Pastva called a timeout with 4.5 seconds left.

The Vikings tried to inbound the ball, but it was blocked twice by the Tide's Austin Jacobson. Jacobson had six blocks on the night and was a key on defense in the waning seconds of regulation.

"Austin has been playing well the last few weeks," Pentz said. "A lot of times it doesn't get in the scorebook as far as points, but it's the little things he does. He rebounds, he protects the ball and is in the right spot on defense. He has been coming along pretty well."

The two teams headed to OT with Glendale getting on the board first. O'Donnell hit one of his two free throws with 2:35 to go to give his team a 51-50 lead.

A basket from Alex Olson put Curwensville head 20 seconds later, before an Elensky layup extended the advantage to 54-51 with 1:36 to go.

Schultz was fouled on the Vikings' next trip down the court, and he sank both to cut the score to 54-53.

Curwensville got to the line with 24.5 seconds to go when Elensky was fouled going up for a shot. He hit one of the free throws, giving the Tide a 55-53 lead.

Glendale drove down the court and struggled to get to the hoop. Pastva called a timeout right as his team scored, negating the basket and leaving the Vikings with 12.7 seconds to come up with two points.

In the timeout, the plan was simple — get the ball in

O'Donnell's hands.

The Vikings obliged, and the junior drained a 3-pointer with 9.4 to go, sending the home fans to their feet and giving Glendale a 56-55 lead.

"I said, 'How did we win this game?' and he is a big part of that tonight," said Pastva of O'Donnell. "He had a lot of perimeter shooting tonight, and that kept us in the game early. He didn't let us fall far behind when we were doing other things, like turning the ball over 36 times."

"Down the stretch, he hit a big one. He was in the moment, and it was a great thing for our team."

The Tide got a final shot, but O'Donnell blocked it, giving Glendale the victory and sending the student section out on to the court.

"It's a long season, and we

aren't even halfway done yet," Pentz said. "We just have to get ready for Ridgway (on Tuesday)."

The Tide had just two players in double digits — Gardner and Elensky. Elensky finished the game with 18 points. Jacobson added five points and eight rebounds, while Trey Rauckhorst had five points and six rebounds.

In addition to O'Donnell's 28 points, Glendale got 14 from Barnhart and seven from Dakota Sinclair. Barnhart added nine rebounds, while Cameron Wigfield had seven.

"We definitely hit a little bit of a slump there," Pastva said. "It's definitely one of those things that we can build from. Being 3-7 is not where we want to be. I think we did a good job on hanging in there tonight and fighting some of the turnovers."

Glendale improved to 4-7 over-

all and 3-1 in the Moshannon Valley League. The Vikings host Bellwood-Antis tonight.

Curwensville dropped to 6-4 overall and 3-1 in MVL. The Tide host the Elkers on Tuesday.

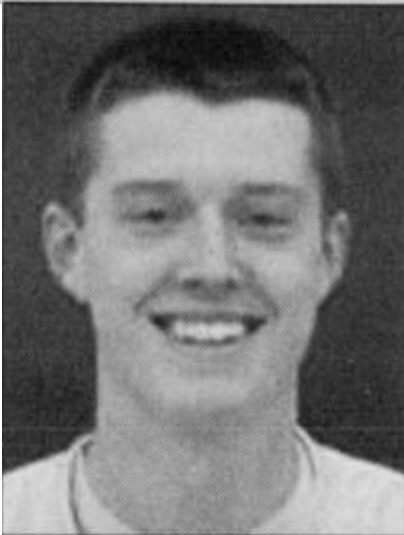
