Long Runs Highlight Warriors' 20-13 Win As Glendale Falters

ALLPORT - The Warriors of West Branch snapped a three-game losing skein with a 20-12 comeback win over the Gendale Vikings here last night.

The loss was the fifth straight for Glendale, which posted its only win over Bucktail Area in its season opener.

The Vikings wasted no time in taking the lead, but they were unable to pose a serious scoring threat in the last three and a half quarters of play.

Guards-Kovalcin Tocimale

Pat Pino took the opening kickoff and raced 86-yards to paydirt to put the visitors out in front 6-0; John Heverly's PAT boot was blocked.

The Warriors took the ensuing kickoff on their own 35 yard line and advanced 65 yards in 14 plays; quarterback Jeff Spanogle provided the clincher. a TD run from three-yards out. A high pass from center and a penalty killed the conversion attempt.

Spanogle greeted the Vikings with an 86-yard touchdown run on the second half kickeff for the final West Branch taily. Paul's conversion, this one a boot, was good.

Glendale got on the scoreboard early as the Vikings started a scoring drive by recovering a fumble on the Moshannon Valley 47 on the second play of the game. In 11 plays, the Vikings moved to the one with Tiesi ramming over for the score. He followed by kicking the extra point.

Moments later, the Knights came as close to the Vikings as they were going to all night when after Moshannon Valley was forced to punt, Don Ross scooped up a fumble in the backfield at Glendale's 22 and scampered into paydirt. Rick Sherkel rushed for the tying point.

With five and a half minutes remaining. Glendale took the kickoff and used up much of the time as the Vikings drove down to where they had a first and goal to go on Moshannon Valley's 1, but they could not score as the Knight defenders turned in a brilliant goal line stand.
