Vikings drop heartbreaker to Titans in OT

FLINTON — The Glendale High School football squad lost a heartbreaker in overtime by a score of 21-13 Friday night in front of the home crowd at Dr. Roy F. Baker Field to Tussey Mountain.

The Vikings are now 0-2 on the season, but showed signs of improvement in the loss. Tussey Mountain improved to 1-1.

"We got behind a couple of times and came right back," Glendale coach Pat Pino said. "We played hard, and we improved vastly from last week. A break here and there, and we win. I thought we played well. We are improving and that's what we want to do."

Tussey Mountain used a bruising ground game that kept the Viking defense on the field for most of the game. When the Glendale offense was on the field, it usually wasn't for long.

The Titans ground assault racked up 260 yards on the evening and mixed in 57 passing yards to keep the Viking defense honest. Tyson Neville rushed for 119 yards on 17 carries, and Kenton Sitch added 98 yards on 20 carries en route to scoring all three Tussey Mountain touchdowns.

Glendale mustered 198 yards in the game with 131 coming on the ground. Darrell Lewis led the Viking attack with 82 yards on 10 carries and a touchdown. Quarterback Jeff Best was next in line with 18 yards on 10 carries — despite being sacked three times by a stingy Titans defense.

Glendale was able to come back two times in the contest, but the well went dry for the overtime period. Tussey Mountain won the toss, chose offense and scored to force Glendale's hand.

On first down at the 10-yard line, Neville busted through the Vikings defensive line for a pickup of five yards. Neville was held for no gain on second down, and Sitch scampered in from five yards out on third down to give Tussey Mountain a 20-13 lead. The Titans opted to go for the two-point conversion, and it paid off.

Quarterback Brady Rourke dropped back to pass and hit Brad Neal with a 3-yard strike to put Tussey Mountain ahead by a score of 21-13. That forced Glendale to score eight points if it had any hopes of victory.

"Basically, we lost one a couple of years ago in overtime," Tussey Mountain coach Bill Rogers said. "These seniors remember it, and we just needed to be more on our toes. This is something we needed this early in the season."

Glendale took over and couldn't find the end zone in four plays.

On first down, Lewis gained five yards, but the next three plays just didn't pan out for the Vikings as three Best passes fell incomplete.

The Titans grabbed a 7-0 lead in the first quarter on a 9-play, 65-yard drive that took 3:51 off the clock.

Tussey Mountain kept the drive going with a key completion on a second-and-six at the

Glendale 38-yard line. Rourke hit Neal with a 19-yard strike for a first down.

Sitch carried the ball to the Viking 11 on first down, and Neville gained three more to place the ball on the Viking 3 for a first-and-goal situation.

Sitch plunged in from there to give Tussey Mountain an early 6-0 lead. Jason Foor converted the extra point with the Titans holding a 7-0 lead with 5:33 left in the first quarter.

Glendale came back in the second quarter with to tie the game at 7-7 as Lewis scampered 26 yards on a pitch left to put the Vikings on the board. Chris McGarvey converted the extra point to knot the game.

The Vikings went for a 25-yard field goal with 3:13 left in the first half. Glendale was driving the ball and was faced with a fourth-and-six at the Titans eight yard line. Glendale opted for the field goal and McGarvey's kick didn't make it past the line of scrimmage, leaving the game tied at 7-7 at the break.

Tussey Mountain scored just 1:34 into the fourth quarter as Sitch ran in from one yard out to cap a 10-play, 66-yard drive that gave the Titans a 13-7 lead. The extra point attempt was wide left.

Glendale got a couple breaks and managed to tie the game. As Best hit McGarvey with a 33-yard pickup, the Titans were whistled for a personal foul putting the ball on their own 17-yard line.

After Best was sacked for a 10-yard loss by Titan defensive

tackle Jason Foor, he hit tight end Rick Swauger with a 27-yard strike to knot the game at 13. Glendale went for two and Best's pass fell incomplete leading to overtime.

"It was a good ballgame," Pino said. "When you have two evenly matched teams like we were today, mistakes will happen. Both teams played well, and I thought our guys came back and did a good job."

The teams traded two turnovers late in the fourth quarter, but neither team could take advantage.

Glendale travels to Juniata Valley Friday night.

WILLIAMSBURG — Three in a row!

The Williamsburg Blue Pirates are on a roll.

Three consecutive victories probably aren't much at most places. Not so at Williamsburg.

Williamsburg posted its third straight victory by pounding Glendale 29-0 Friday night.

The last time Williamsburg had three consecutive victories was in 1992.

"People say so what, three straight," said Williamsburg coach Dave Baker. "But when you have experienced the tough times, it feels good to win three in a row. We went through a stretch of winning seven games in five seasons."

Williamsburg, now 3-3, took control early. The Pirates led 15-0 after the first quarter and 22-0 at halftime.

Williamsburg quarterback Travis Prough scored two touchdowns and threw for another score.

The speedy Prough raced 55 yards with a fumble recovery, threw a 47-yard touchdown pass to end Darin Carper and had a 1-yard TD run.

Williamsburg wasted little time getting on the scoreboard. Tailback Justin Kagarise dashed 34 yards for a touchdown on the fourth play of the game with 9:33 left in the first quarter. Kagarise also rushed for the two-point conversion.

The Pirates struck quickly again. Glendale's Chris McGarvey fumbled a punt and Prough grabbed the football and raced 55 yards for a touchdown. Seth Kauffman added his first of three PAT's, staking Williamsburg to a 15-0 lead.

Glendale, winless through six

games, had the football for just three plays and trailed 15-0 at the 5:26 mark of the first quarter. A familiar situation for the Vikings.

"We have the same thing happen every game," said Glendale coach Pat Pino. "We give up a couple of big plays in the first quarter, get in a hole and then play even the rest of the game."

"We knew Williamsburg was tough," Pino added. "They are a team that is really coming along. They seem to get better as the season progresses. Until this year we played them in the season opener."

Baker also believes his team is making progress.

"We are making some improvement," Baker said. "Our defense was solid once again and we were able to hit some passes and made good plays."

Game notes: The victory was Williamsburg's first over Glendale in five years ... Next Friday night, Williamsburg hosts Moshannon Valley while Glendale entertains Northern Bedford.
