# September 10, 1999: Williamsburg 21 at Glendale 8

FLINTON — Winning can put a smile on your face.

It did just that for Williamsburg coach Dave Baker.

Williamsburg took control early and went on to beat Glendale, 21-8, Friday night at Dr. Roy F. Baker Athletic Field.

"We haven't experienced many wins, so when you get one, you enjoy it," said a smiling Baker.

"We worked real hard for this," Baker added. "The guys were really pumped up and wanted this one."

The Blue Pirates, improving their record to 1-1, indicated early that they wanted this one. Williamsburg took the opening kickoff and drove for a touchdown.

Travis Prough dashed into the end zone from the 5, capping a nine-play, 63-yard drive at the 8:34 mark of the first quarter.

"We're not used to being ahead," Baker said. "That was a big boost and we were able to keep the pressure on them."

Williamsburg threatened on its next possession, but stalled at the Glendale 6. However, the Pirates still came away with points.

Glendale quarterback John Kuzemchak slipped in the end zone while attempting a pass, giving Williamsburg a safety.

The Pirates extended their advantage to 14-0 by halftime. Williamsburg quarterback Travis Lee ran up the middle on an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:52 left in the first half.

Williamsburg scored on its first possession of the third quarter. Josh Flaig covered the final six yards of the drive and

Justin Becker added the PAT to put the Pirates ahead 21-0.

Glendale avoided a shutout by driving 97 yards in the final quarter. Doug Brown scored on an 11-yard run with 1:29 left in the game. Joe Luther passed to Brown for a two-point conversion to set the final count.

"We're going through growing pains," said first-year Glendale coach John Kutz, whose Vikings dropped to 0-2. "We are capable of being a decent football team."

**Game notes:** The teams were guilty of 25 penalties, losing a total of 218 yards ... Brown churned out 137 yards on 20 carries ... Williamsburg's Jeremy Brua had two interceptions ... Next Friday night, Williamsburg hosts Everett while Glendale entertains Bellwood-Antis.

# October 1, 1999: Northern Bedford 35 at Glendale 7

## Panthers cruise to second win

FLINTON — Northern Bedford ran over and through Glendale for a 28-0 halftime lead and breezed to a 35-7 win on homecoming Friday night at Dr. Roy E Baker Field.

The Black Panthers (2-3) held the Vikings (0-5) to minus five yards total offense in the first half, got 124 yards rushing on 21 carries from Kirk Morningstar and did not have to punt.

It was the fifth time in six meetings Northern Bedford scored 35 points on Glendale.

"I think we have to credit the offensive line," Black Panthers coach Dan Foor said. "We had a gameplan going in, and our line did a good job ... and Kirk ran well. I think it was a good combination of the offense running on full gear tonight."

Northern Bedford put things away early with touchdowns on its first three possessions, with its first two drives beginning in Vikings' territory and the third at midfield. Quarterback David Potchak scored from one yard out and Adam Holsinger from four yards for a 14-0 lead after one quarter.

Glendale couldn't move the ball the first half as Northern Bedford's line shot the gaps into the backfield with ease and totaled seven tackles

for loss.

"I'm at a loss for the offensive side sometimes," Glendale coach John Kutz said. "We even went to a very basic blocking scheme this week and still weren't able to pick some things up."

Morningstar, who piled up 74 yards in the opening half, scored on a five-yard run midway through the second quarter, and Aaron Nelson's second two-point conversion pushed the lead to 22-0. Steve Legarski's interception of a Brad Harrison pass set up the Black Panthers' final score of the half, a 27-yard catch-and-run by Nelson from Potchak, who finished with 118 yards through the air.

"We're not afraid to go to the passing game," Foor said. "We have some good skill people, and if we block we can get the ball to them."

Morningstar's 2-yard score pushed the lead to 35-0 with 10:02 left in the third quarter and ensured the clock would not stop the rest of the way.

"I wasn't sure what to expect, so we just went out and played as good as we could," Morningstar said.

Glendale finally found some offense later in the third when John Snyder busted loose for 11 and nine yards on successive draws, plays that finally pulled the Vikings out of the minus category in total offense.

Harrison hit Joe Luther for a 19-yard pickup to the one and scored just his team's second touchdown of the season on the next play.

"We really needed something," Kutz said. "We've really been struggling offensively, and for that matter defensively."

# November 5, 1999: Claysburg 58 at Glendale 6

FLINTON — The seniors on the Claysburg-Kimmel football team wanted their last game to be a memorable one.

Their only problem was convincing head coach Jeff Lingenfelter to keep them on the field for their finale and not on the sidelines.

Claysburg scored on its first six possessions and breezed by winless Glendale, 58-6, Friday night at Dr. Roy F. Baker Athletic Field.

"It was our seniors last game and they wanted to play and they deserved to play," Lingenfelter said.

"But the game got out of hand early on. It was a tough situation under the circumstances."

It was Glendale that opened the scoring just 20 seconds into the game with a halfback pass from John Kuzemchak to Joe Luther that went for 71 yards and a touchdown.

The Vikings lead was short-lived however; when on the next play from scrimmage Matt Sell connected with Brandon Ickes for a 57-yard pass down to the Glendale 11. Four plays later Sell scored from a yard out on a quarterback keeper. Dustin Walter's extra point put Claysburg on top 7-6, and the Bulldogs never looked back.

The Bulldogs scored early and often and extended their lead to 27-6 after just one quarter. Claysburg went into the half with a 39-6 advantage and added to its lead on a 3-yard touchdown run by Derek Tipton in the third quarter that put the 35-point mercy rule into effect.

Tipton finished with 155 yards rushing and four touchdowns on 15 carries. Sell was a perfect 7-for-7 passing for 128 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for two touchdowns.

"We had a good group of kids," Lingenfelter said. "With the exception of the BG (Bishop Guilfoyle) game we were in every game with a

chance to win. I was pleased with what we were able to do. We represented ourselves and the school well."

While Claysburg was putting an exclamation point on a 6-4 campaign, Glendale was suffering through its third winless season of the 90s, but first-year head coach John Kutz, who is Glendale's fifth head coach in the 90s, is looking forward to leading the Vikings into the millennium.

"We have a lot of work ahead of us," Kutz said. "But our kids want to win. I want to get into the school during the off season and get more kids to come out for the team. I want

to get them in the weight room so we can be better prepared. (Long-time Hollidaysburg) Coach (Harold) Price lost his first 19 games as a head coach and he was here tonight. He said he doesn't want me to catch him."
