

September 14, 2001: Williamsburg 30 at Glendale 12 Pirates make Vikings walk the plank, 30-12

The Progress FLINTON — Things started badly for the Glendale High School football team Friday night. And Williamsburg made sure it didn't get any better until it was too late for the Vikings.

Williamsburg got three touch-down passes and 240 yards through the air from senior quarterback Travis Lee to keep the Vikings winless, 30-12, at Dr.

"It started bad and got worse," Glendale coach John Kutz said after the Vikings slipped to 0-3 overall and 0-2 in Section III of the Inter-County Conference. "They played well, really good. But I don't think we're this bad."

Williamsburg's Jeremy Rup-eka recovered a Mike Morrison fumble on the opening kickoff, setting up a 34-yard touchdown pass from Lee to Kyle Bellew two plays later. Lee scrambled for a 5-yard TD run near the end of the quarter, and a pair of two-point conversions gave the Pirates (1-2, 1-0) all they would need with a 16-0 lead.

The Pirates, though, weren't through. They added a 58-yard touchdown catch-and-run from Lee to Jeff Detwiler in the second quarter and a 35-yard hookup from Lee to Todd Bookhammer to the end zone in the third.

"We've been working hard on our passing game," said Williamsburg coach Dave Baker, who called the game perhaps the best his team has played since 1992. "Our receivers are good and can run after the catch. I liked to think we could have some success eventually."

Williamsburg's receivers got a big cushion from the Glendale defensive backs and took advantage on several short passes early before looking to go up the field.

"Our gameplan is very simple, as simple as simple gets,' Kutz said. "It's a case of where we have so many first-year players. We've just got to learn to play.'

Glendale got a pair of Thad Francisco touchdown runs in the fourth quarter to set the final. But the first three quarters were nightmarish for the Vikings, who didn't get their initial first down until Morrison's 11-yard run with 50.4 seconds remained in the third quarter.

The Vikings had the ball for just 16 plays in the first half, netting 4 yards. "I'm not real sure I can tell

you what I told the kids at half-time," Kutz said. "We came out in the second half and got a little spark. The Morrison kid sparked us a bit. But we came out early and just couldn't get anything going

GAME NOTES: A moment of silence was observed before the

game in honor of the victims of Tuesday's terrorist attacks and their families. Immediately following, Kim Hamilton sang "God Bless America" and the National Anthem ... Morrison finished with 69 yards on the ground and Francisco added 52 ... Glendale junior tailback Spike Bungo missed the game with a concus-sion. Warriors deck Glendale in backyard battle, 41-6

West Branch last week, Moshannon Valley head coach Howie Camberg attributed the loss to the fact that the Warriors made the big plays.

West Branch continued to make big plays Friday night as it scored 28 points in the second quarter to take home the 41-6 win over Glendale. The Warriors improved to over .500 for the first time this season at 4-3.

The 28-point second quarter totaled more points than the Warriors have scored in any one game in 2001.

"We are real happy that we came down here and played well," said West Branch head coach Gary Hubler. "Typically it's a hard place for us to play because Glendale always plays us tough. Our kids knew what they had to get done when they got down here. That's a real credit to my coaching staff. Gary (Bickel), Bill (Hayward) and Les (Smeal) really get the kids ready.

Kevin Clark had two big runs on the night for the Warriors, the first on a 70-yard run and the second from 43 yards out. Clark tallied 138 yards on just five carries in the win.

Ryan Bickel also notched two TDs on the night despite a bad case of strep throat. Bickel's longest touchdown on the night

came off of a Todd Vereshack interception that he ran back 90 for the Warriors' only yards score of the third quarter.

"Ryan Bickel was sick," said Coach Bickel. "It wasn't that he just didn't feel good, he was really sick. That's just a testament to the kind of player he is. He wanted to play."

"We still have some breakdowns that we really shouldn't have compounded with the fact that they made four big plays in the first half," said Glendale head coach John Kutz. "We are still at the point where we strug-gle tackling. We are about as basic as you can be."

Both teams used big defensive stances to stop each other in the first quarter. Adam Andrasko laid a huge tackle on starting quarterback Scott Laing, sepa-rating the sophomore's shoulder. Laing left the game and would not roturn. His status is gues not return. His status is questionable for the remainder of the season.

Laing's successor, Vereshack, came in to replace him late in the first quarter.

"I don't know if he (Laing) will be done for the year," Kutz said. "If he does come back he will obviously be very limited in what he does. I think Todd did a nice job coming in for him and did his best."

The Warriors finally got the handle on the Vikings' defense in the second quarter when Todd

Dobo scored on a 63-yard run at cut short the Vikes enthusiasm the 10:03 mark.

Dobo also kicked the PAT, one of his five on the night, to put the Warriors up 7-0.

Glendale seemed to get a drive going on its next posses-sion, even working out of a second down and 22 situation. But the Vikes failed to get the ball out of their end and were forced to punt from their own 40-yard line

West Branch needed just two plays from scrimmage to put its next points on the board with Clark taking in his 70-yard TD with 6:42 left in the second quarter.

Glendale managed just four plays in its next series and punted the ball once again to the Warriors.

A West Branch penalty for blocking in the back forced the Warriors back to their own 35-yard line.

The Warriors then used a 12-vard pass from Bickel to Matt Hertlein and a 10-yard gain from Dobo to set up their next score, a 43-yard TD by Clark with 4:34 left in the second frame.

The Vikes tried one more time to get on the board before the half, but Vereshack threw right into the hands of a waiting Bickel, who returned it from the Warrior 10-yard line for a touchdown with 2:30 left in the first half.

Glendale came out fired up in the second half, but the Warriors

with a 10-play, 50-yard drive that resulted in a 1-yard touchdown by Bickel on a keeper.

The Warriors went on to score one final time in the fourth quar-ter when Eddie Kyler took in a 2-yard TD with 10:06 left in the game

The Vikings finally got on the board with a 12-play, 65-yard drive that resulted in a 7-yard Spike Bungo touchdown with 1:59 to go in the final quarter.

A two-point conversion pass was deflected by the Warriors, setting the score at 41-6.


"We had to be aggressive and play with lots of intensity and we did that," Hubler said. "Obviously, we finally took charge of the offensive and defensive lines. We were challenging our running backs to run the ball."

Bungo finished the night with 52 yards on 11 carries. Teammate Thad Francisco led all rushers with 66 yards on 18 carries.

"We are going to keep working and trying to get better," Kutz said. "Maybe something positive will happen and something good will come out of it."

Glendale fell to 0-7 with the loss. The Vikings travel to Everett on Friday night to face the Warriors.

West Branch travels to Williamsburg on Friday at 7 p.m.
