

Tarr runs for 198 yards in Glendale's 20-6 loss to Everett

For The Progress some nice holes EVERETT — The turnover ran to daylight." "bugaboo" spoiled Glendale's season opener Friday night at Everett as the homestanding Warriors battled the Vikings to a scoreless first half before pulling away to a 20-6 victory with two late fourth-quarter scores.

Glendale had four fumbles and an interception, and the Vikings were unable to overcome

their mistakes.

"We can't turn the ball over like that and win," said first-year coach Rick Kozak. "We moved the ball on them but couldn't put it in the end zone. We shot ourselves in the foot too many times.

"Give Everett all the credit. They never quit and fought a tough battle to win this game. However, my kids hung in there all night. We just have to clean up the mistakes."

Everett coach Tom Waltman was happy to get away with the win.

Waltman commented. "They didn't just come down here to play. They came down here to win and gave us all we wanted. They were in the game until the last play."

That play was a 90-yard interception return by Warrior linebacker George Shawl on a fourth-and-15 from the Everett 20 with no time showing on the clock.

"It is a 14-6 game and they have a chance to score and go for two on that last play," Waltman said. "They were in it until the very end. I am very happy with

this win and so are my players." Viking junior running back Kelsey Tarr pounded his way for 198 yards on just 18 carries but could not get it in for a score.

"Tarr was all over the field tonight," Kozak said. "He put in an outstanding effort, as did the

The Warriors got a strong effort from fullback Adrian Ritchey, as the senior ran for 100 yards on 12 carries. "Ritchey ran hard for us tonight," Waltman continued.

Early in the game, Glendale had a field goal attempt blocked by the middle of the Everett line to thwart one scoring effort. That was followed on its next possession by a fumble that was recovered by Josh Snyder.

On the first play of the second quarter Glendale again put the football on the ground and Everett pounced on it. Neither team dented the goal line in the

first 24 minutes.

The Warriors got on the board on a strange turn of events early in the third quarter. Glendale at its own 14, quarter-

back Derrick Strong completed a pass to a lineman who had the ball ripped away from him by linebacker Tyler Robinette at the 15. Robinette streaked into the end zone for the touchdown, and the Warriors declined the penalty on the ille-gal pass. Banner Mann kicked the PAT and the hosts had a 7-0

On their next possession the Vikings again fumbled, and this time it was T.J. Ewing who recovered for the Warriors and the third quarter came to a close.

Early in the final stanza Glendale put together a 9-play, 64yard scoring drive to pull within 7-6. The Vikings hit paydirt with 6:13 left in the game on a 13-yard pass from Strong to A.J. Flick. The all-important PAT hit the left upright to keep the Warriors in the lead.

Everett immediately answered when Josh Snyder returned the ensuing kickoff to the Warrior 44 to give the home team great field position. Five plays later, Jacob Snyder tossed a 26-yard scoring

rest of the team. The line opened strike to Brett Elbin with 3:23 showing on the clock. Mann made it 14-6.

> However, Glendale was not about to throw in the towel. After the kickoff went out of bounds and gave the Vikings the ball at their own 35, they steadily drove down the field on the strength of some fine running by Tarr and Gary Walstrom.

Glendale got to the Warrior 20 before the ill-fated interception, which Shawl returned 90 yards as

time ran out.

September 16, 2005: Williamsburg 14 at Glendale 20 Glendale gets first victory of the season against Williamsburg

FLINTON - Derrick Strong threw for 116 yards and two touchdowns and the Glendale Viking defense held the visiting Blue Pirates to -53 yards as Glendale picked up its first win of the season Friday night at Dr. Roy F. Baker Athletic Field over

Williamsburg. Strong, who completed 8-of-22 passes, saved his best for last with 6:50 to play, fielding a bobbled snap and scrambling to find an open receiver. After getting a firm grip on the ball, Strong found Kelsey Tarr in the corner of the end zone for a 28-yard touchdown pass that proved to be the game winner for the Vikings.

The biggest story of the night, however, was not Strong it was the Viking defense. In an effort that left Williamsburg befitting of their school colors - black and blue, Glendale had 14 tackles for a loss, two sacks, a fumble recovery and held the Blue Pirates to

-60 yards rushing.
"What can I say, the kids worked hard all week. They were beat up on last week and took it



upon themselves to be prepared this week," said Glendale head coach Rick Kozak. "This is a reward for their effort."

The Vikings weren't the only team that knew

how to play defense though. After Strong had completed a 35-yard touchdown pass to A.J. Flick to cap off the Vikings' first drive to put them up 7-0, the Blue Pirates D stepped up to tie the game. On the first play of Glendale's

second possession Nate Robley scored his first of two touchdowns on the night, picking up a Derek Nash fumble and racing 49 yards to pay dirt. Nate Graham's kick knotted the score at 7-7.

"Williamsburg battled all night long and their defense kept them in the game. You have to give them credit they played hard," said Kozak.

Williamsburg defense fresh off that big play, forced yet another fumble on the very next offensive play. With the ball resting at the Glendale 36-yard line, it looked as if Williamsburg would take the lead. Not to be outdone though, the Viking defense rose to the occasion and held the Blue Pirates to a three-and-out on three straight tackles for a loss.

Quarter number two was less exciting as the teams exchanged punts for the majority of the quarter until the Viking offense

was able to get something going.
A 61-yard drive that saw big
runs by Nash and Gary Walstrom of 17 and 13 yards, respectively, gave Glendale the lead before halftime. Nash scored from four yards out with 3:30 to play in the half and Tyler Thomas' kick made the score 14-7 in favor of the home team.

Things stayed that way in the second half until Robley made a heads-up play to even things up again. Glendale, faced with a fourth-and-two at their 38-yard line, sent out the punt team for what would be the most disastrous play of the night.

After the snap to Walstrom sailed over his head, Walstrom picked up the ball and avoided two defenders to get an ugly, yet

effective punt away.

The punt bounced and rolled its way to the Blue Pirate 48yard line and was surrounded by four Vikings when Robley, to everyone's amazement, picked up the ball and ran it back 52 yards for a Williamsburg touchdown. Graham's kick got the Blue Pirates back even at 14-14 with 8:28 to play in the third quarter.

"They should have downed the ball right there and not waited for it to stop rolling," said Kozak. "It was a game where their team had nothing to lose, and they took a chance and made a big play. It certainly shifted the momentum."

Glendale, which was plagued by seven penalties to go along with their two turnovers, seemed to be behind the 8-ball at that point when the game was tied late despite holding the Blue Pirates to negative yards.

"The thing we emphasized on the sideline was that the game was not done because of one play," said Kozak. "It was just one of the five or six times that the kids could have guit and didn't."

In the end it was Walstrom and

the Viking defense creating yet another big play to seal the deal for Glendale.

Walstrom picked up a forced fumble after Joe Brown's second sack of Williamsburg quarter-back Nate Graham with under five minutes to play. The Blue Pirates, who were down by just six at the time, used a huge 35yard kick return by Mark Hoover to set up shop at the 40-yard line and moved the ball to midfield before the fumble.

With the win Glendale improved to 1-2, while the Blue Pirates remain winless at 0-3. The Vikings will look to even their record next week as they travel to Moshannon Valley for a homecoming contest with the

Black Knights.

October 22, 2005: West Branch 0 at Glendale 46 Glendale throttles West Branch in 46-0 shutout

FLINTON — Glendale head coach Rick Kozak has been saying all season that his 10 seniors are the best leaders a coach could ask for.

Turns out they aren't pretty bad players either.

The Vikings' got big games from all of their seniors, and juniors Gary Walstrom and Kelsey Tarr in a 46-0 rout of West Branch on, fittingly enough, Senior Recognition Night at Dr.

Roy F. Baker Field in Flinton. It was the first win for the Vikings over the Warriors in 12 years, and their first shutout over West Branch since 1986.

"It was a big night tonight," said Vikings head coach Rick Kozak. "Last week, the win was big because it was homecoming, but this was big in a different way. I think we came out and stunned them a little bit. The kids came out and really wanted

this tonight."

The Vikings just needed five plays on their opening possession to drive 66 yards down the field for a touchdown. The scoring drive culminated

with a 24-yard pass from Derrick Strong to Kelsey Tarr with 8:04 left in the first quarter.

Strong finished the night with 72 yards passing on four

completions.

Glendale took a little time to put up another score on its next possession of the game, driving from its own 44-yard line. Walstrom muscled his way in for a 3-yard score with 35 seconds left in the first quarter. Tyler Thomas added his second PAT of the night to put the Vikings up 14-0.

Walstrom finished the night with 219 yards on 17 carries. It was the first game of the season that Walstrom has eclipsed the 100-yard mark.

"This was our worse loss," said West Branch head coach Chad Koleno. "We just didn't tackle. Everybody could see that. We had guys hitting them a vard before the line of scrimmage, and then they are falling forward for three or four more yards. We just have to keep our feet and tackle. That's what it comes down to."

The Warriors continued to struggle in the second quarter when Glendale linebacker Brandon Baker picked up a blocked punt and returned it 11 yards back to the West Branch 9vard line.


Three plays later, Baker was rewarded for his efforts when he scored on a 5-yard run. Thomas added the extra point to give the

Vikings the big 21-0 lead heading into the locker room.

Glendale picked up where it left off in the second half, taking its opening possession in for the score. Walstrom broke loose for a 61-yard score just 55 seconds into the third quarter to put the Vikings up 27-0.

The Warriors, meanwhile, struggled to get anything going on offense, punting four times, and turning the ball over on downs twice. West Branch also struggled with penalties, racking up seven of them on the night. Two of those were 15-yard personal fouls that led to Glendale's second touchdown of the third quarter.

After the penalties, the Vikings had the ball on the West Branch 18. It took just five more plays to get in the end zone when Strong punched in the 2-vard score on a keeper. kick failed, leaving Glendale with a 34-0 lead with

Glendale picked on West Branch again just before the end of the third fram when Warrior quarterback Justin Shive hit Jesse Husted for what looked to be a huge 58-yard reception down to the Glendale 9. But the ball popped out when Tarr tackled Husted, and A.J. Flick picked it up, rambling for 24 yards before

being brought down. Three plays later, Walstrom picked his way through the Warrior defense before taking a 70-yard jaunt into the end zone to go over the 200-yard mark for the

evening.

An interception by Tarr in the fourth quarter set up the final scoring drive for Glendale. Robert Reitmyer scored his first touchdown of the night to cap off the scoring drive, taking in a 29-yard run to set, the final at 46-0.

"We just have to take it one game at a time," Kozak said. "This is nice momentum for us, but Claysburg-Kimmel is going to be a tough opponent. We just need to get back to work on Monday."

With the victory, Glendale improved to 3-5. The Vikings travel to Claysburg on Friday evening.

Kolesar Lance Warriors with 58 yards on seven Sudik, Todd carries. returned after missing a week with an injury, added 30 yards on seven carries.

"Lance has been running the ball well all season," Koleno said. "Todd did a nice job with the lead block tonight. We are just going to have to regroup and get it together for next week."

West Branch fell to 2-6 and travels to Northern Bedford on

Friday.
