Vikettes Banking On Pair of Vets

FLINTON -- Although Glendale's girls basketball coach Joe Vesnesky has only two returning letterwinners in camp from last year's 4-6 team, a turnout of 29 prospects has the veteran mentor looking forward to the 1977 season.

The Vikettes, who will make their debut on Thursday in a non-league game at home against Moshannon Valley, will be relying heavily upon senior vets Brenda Ball and Gemaine Krise.

Ball, a two-time letterwinner who measures in at 5-7, is the Glendale offensive sparkplug and last season the senior averaged 15.5 ppg, with 155 points on the season.

Her performance was fourth best in Progressland and one of the best in the Skyline Conference.

Krise will provided the board strength for Vesnesky's team as she stands at 5-11.

Other seniors on the club are Patty Cossick (5-5), Jill Gabrielson (5-9), Debbie Matthews (5-9), Cherie Morrow (5-2), Jaynee Yingling (5-5) and Deb Youngkin (6-0).

This year the Skyline Conference has taken on two new teams, Clearfield St. Francis and upcoming power DuBois Central, and divided into two sections.

The Vikettes will compete against Harmony, Portage and Northern Cambria and the winner of that section will playoff against the champ between DuBois Central, St. Francis, Glendale and Moshannon Valley.

This is Vesnesky's second season as head man of the Glendale gals team and he is aided by assistant coach Mary Ann Kutruff.

Gone via graduation from last season's club are Sue Bloom (53 points), Julie Davis, Nina Gabrielson (64 points), Cindy Gorman, Cindy Kruse, Sherry Matthews and Tammy Davidson.

It should be pointed out that Morrow, a senior this season, lettered as a sophomore.

Glendale will play all Skyline Conference members twice this season.

Another outstanding performance by Glendale's Brenda Ball pushed Glendale past Harmony 41-38 while in another Skyline Conference girls basketball game DuBois Central ripped the Moshannon Valley Black Knights 48-29.

Ball, the area's leading scorer with 144 points in six games, pumped in 26 markers last night as the Vikings evened their log at 1-1 in the conference's Southern Division.

Glendale trailed at the end of the first period but after the second and third rounds, the Vikettes of coach Joe Vesnesky held two-point margins.

The Vikettes then held on despite plenty of pressure in the last quarter to make their overall season record 4-2.

Harmony, now 1-2 in the conference and 3-3 overall, was led by Cece Weaver's 15 points and Kelly Jones' 10.

"Glendale did an excellent job on the boards," lauded Harmony Coach Linda Richards. "We weren't boxing out or following shots like we should have been."

"But we beat them from the field by eight points. I think the biggest factor in the game was foul shooting. They took 32 shots and we only had 14."

"I think the big reason for that last statistic was the officiating was atrocious."

The visiting Owls did capture a win in the JV scrap by a 21-8 count. Diane Wagner

had six points to lead all scorers as the Harmony JVs evened their record at 3-3. Glendale's junior varsity team, under the guidance of Mary Ann Kutruff, is 2-4.

DuBois Central, a powerful 8-1 on the season and off-and-running at 3-0 against conference foes, jumped out to an 11-2 lead in the first quarter, a 30-8 lead at the half and 42-12 after three periods before the Cardinal subs were outscored 21-6 in the last frame to make the score look close.

Kim Foltz led DuBois Central with 10 points while the top point getter for Pat Barto's Mo Valley club was Judy Sidorick with 15 markers.

DuBois Central also won the JV game 30-14, sinking Frank Belella's junior Knights to 2-3.

All three area clubs will return to action on Thursday night. Harmony will host Clearfield St. Francis in a non-section game, Mo Valley will host West Branch in a Northern game and Glendale will visit Northern Cambria in a Southern Section tussle.
