# Glendale Is Rebuilding

FLINTON — With last season's top three scorers, including The Progress-area's number two point-producer Brenda Ball, gone via graduation, Glendale girls basketball coach Joe Vesnesky faces the task of rebuilding with four returning letterwinners.

Returning from last year's 10-5 squad are seniors Peg Stanton, Sue Matthews, Deb Miles and Patty McClellan, but they totaled only 62 points offense between them during the 1977-78 season.

Matthews had 33 points and Stanton 28, so those two will probably be looked to to carry the scoring load in the

early part of this season, which begins Thursday night at Moshannon Valley.

Lost via graduation last spring were Ball (344 points), Deb Matthews (137), Gemaine Krise (53), Jaynee Yingling (33), Deb Youngkin (18), Patty Cossick (16), Cherie Morrow (9) and Jill Gabrielson (2).

Vesnesky, who is beginning his third year as head coach of the girls basketball program at Glendale, coached the Vickettes to a 4-5 in his first campaign but last year he turned them into a 10-5 winner, which earned Glendale a trip to the District 6-A Open Basketball Tourna-

# Damsels Dump Vikettes, 55-38

AMESVILLE. She's a little difficult to notice being just a 5-7 center, but Karen Morrioni gets the job done.

The two-year letterwinner from Moshannon Valley used her line leaping ability and good shooting touch well last night, scoring 23 points and keying Mo Valley's 55-38 Skyline Conference victory over scrappy Glendale.

Morrioni, a senior who was seventh in area scoring last year, posted herself beneath the basket and grabbed everything within reach, often times putting the ball back up for easy points. She also played a good defensive game with numerous rebounds and one exceptional steal.

Both teams showed a lot of hustle and aggressiveness in their season opener, reasons which often times led to mistakes.

Along with senior Jill Tiracorda, who slammed in 21 points, Judy Sidorick, Tami Krupa and Joyce Higgins, Mo Valley dominated both boards, the single most important factor in their victory.

Meanwhile, Glendale, a team that was supposedly ripped by graduation, came up with good balanced scoring and relied on the turnover to stay within striking distance of the Damsels, something they did until very late in the game.

Vikette Laura Long made her first varsity start a sur-

prising success with 12 points, mostly off short rebounds from the right side and did Glendale's best job on the boards.

Neither team broke out of the gate breathing fire and it ended with Mo Valley ahead 9-6. The statisticians got the biggest workout of the first eight minutes as there had to be at least 20 turnovers.

The most noticeable play in the first quarter was the defensive work of Krupa, a transfer student from Florida making her debut in a Black Damsel uniform.

In the second quarter, however, Mo Valley picked up offensively and did an outstanding job defensively as Patti Barto's Damsels held Glendale to just one point through the first 5:30 of the period and to just four markers in the entire stanza.

Meanwhile, Sidorick, who chipped in nine points on the evening and Morrioni carried the bulk of the offense, accounting for all 14 points in the period, putting Mo Valley ahead 23-10.

Whatever it was Glendale head coach Joe Vesnesky said to his girls at halftime, however, must have been a dandy because the Vikettes came roaring out of the locker room to put the heat on Mo Valley, making two buckets in first 30 seconds, forcing Barto to ask for a timeout.

The timeout seemed to do the trick as Tiracorda hit a long jumper and Morrioni added a quick three points to

build the margin back to 28-14 with six minutes left in the period.

But the duo of Deb Miles and Long starting hitting from all over and soon a jumper from the right corner by Long made it 34-26 with 2:32 remaining.

However, the Vikettes cooled off a bit and could get no closer by the end of the frame, trailing 38-30 when the buzzer sounded.

Mo Valley began breaking away in the last quarter as Tiracorda got hot, scoring 10 points, but not before the Vikettes closed within seven at 41-34 on Tammy Ford's bank-in.

However, Tiracorda's hot shooting was well enough to keep the Vikettes from challenging in the final three minutes.

Mo Valley seemed to be in excellent condition, something that is going to be a must for the Damsels with just 12 players on the roster, varsity and jayvee.

Incidentally, officials Barry Abbott and Paul Bradley, both of Phillipsburg, did a fine job.

The junior varsity tilt was captured by Mo Valley 38-11 as Debbie Custred pumped in 15 points for the winners. Tammy Ford had nine of Glendale's 11 points.

# Matthews' 25 Spark Vikettes

A superb effort by Glendale's Sue Matthews resulted in 25 points, an effort that sparked the Glendale Vikings to a 43-25 victory over Curwensville in one of four games involving Skyline Conference girls basketball teams last night.

In other contests, Northern Cambria came from behind to trip Moshannon Valley 40-35, DuBois Central Christian set all sorts of school records by ripping Harmony 87-42 and St. Francis won the battle of defenses at West Branch, taking a 19-14 decision (see separate story for details).

Matthews canned 10 field goals and hit on five of 16 at-

tempts from the free throw line for her 25 points. The next best offensive showing came from Vikette Laura Long with nine points.

"Sue put on a fine shooting performance," noted Glendale head coach Joe Vesnesky, "and Laura did a real good job of rebounding. Deb Miles, Judy Noel and Peg Stanton all played a good floor game."

The Golden Tide had trouble mustering any offense in the hot and humid gymnasium at Glendale. Wendie Fye leading the way with 10 points.

The win evens Glendale's log at 1-1 while Curwensville slips to 1-2 with the loss.

In jayvee scraps, Curwensville dumped Glendale 25-16 despite 12 points by Vikette Tammy Ford, Northern Cambria popped Mo Valley 42-25 and DuBois Central laced Harmony 60-37. Connie Davis scored 14 points for the losers.
