New Coach Colors Vikettes Green

FLINTON — With only one returning regular from a team that went 1-13 last fall, new Glendale girls basketball coach Sherry Slaterbeck has inherited a team that is, in a single word, "young."

"We're basically a young team," Slaterbeck said on

the eve of her team's opener. "As far as starters from last year, we only have one back who really played a lot of basketball.

"We do have a lot of depth with our sophomores," Slaterbeck added, "but they're young. They have ability, but not much experience.

"Above all, we have to be aggressive, because we're not tall."

Slaterbeck has four letterwinners on her squad, returning starter and senior Jan Gabrielson, senior Karen Rupp, senior Cook Cree and junior Tammy Ford.

Gabrielson scored just 29 points last season and, even though her effort was fourth best on the team, the four veterans accumulated a total of just 63 points between them.

Cree had 21 points, Ford 13 and Rupp none.

Jan Gabrielson, Judy Noel (who was injured last year), Ford, junior Sherry Gabrielson and either Cree or one of the five sophomores will be in the starting lineup tonight when the Vikettes host Moshannon Valley in a Skyline Conference-South Section contest.

Last year the Vikettes, coached by long-time boys mentor Joe Vesnesky, went 1-13 and lost their last 12 games.

Glendale's offense average was just 28.6 points-per-game (the Vikettes were held under 20 points four times) and the Vikettes' only win was 43-25 over Curwensville.

Gone from that team are leading scorer Sue Matthews (180) and Peg Stanton (65), Laura Long (50), Deb Miles (26), Patty McClellan (7), Karen Fishel (4), Bonnie Feigh (2) and Lisa Sinclair (0).

Terry Sybert is the new JV coach and she'll need only one win to improve upon last year's JV lot of 0-14.

Tide Shuts Down Vikes 41-15

CURWENSVILLE — The Curwensville Golden Tide girls basketball team rolled up a 15-0 lead in the first quarter of last night's game with visiting Glendale, and that score pretty much speaks for itself.

Curwensville went on to win 41-15.

The Tide, now 2-4 and on a two-game win streak after a tough pre-league slate, displayed a murderous man-to-man defense and the quick guard tandem of Jeanne Bloom and Sharonda Yates ran the ball right through Glendale.

Yates scored the first six points of the game and all but one of her 11 points in the first quarter with a combination of steals, full-court drives, outside jumpers and foul shots.

Bloom, meanwhile, added five points on a short baseline jumper, a midcourt steal and drive and a free throw. That got her off and running toward a team-high effort of 12 points.

But it was a combination of rugged defense and Glendale's inability to hit its inside shots that made the difference.

The Vikings, who are now 0-2 under first-year coach

Sherry Slaterbeck, were 0-for-9 from the floor and even though they held a 14-5 rebounding edge, including five offensive bounds, they failed to capitalize inside.

And to top things off, Glendale turned the ball over 16 times in the first eight minutes.

"I was very pleased with how we played in the first half," claimed Curwensville coach Cindy Boyle. "We looked much better than we did last week."

Boyle graciously called off the dogs in the second period as she opened with just three starters and had the bench cleared minutes into the quarter.

But Glendale continued firing up air balls until Janice Gabrielson finally broke the ice with a short peeper at the 6:52 mark, after Curwensville had pulled ahead 17-0.

Judy Noel later added a layup, but that turned out to be Glendale's only other field goal of the night as the Vikes failed to find the hoop on all 20 second half shots.

Curwensville didn't shoot much better after the intermission (6-for-39) and only a lot of foul shooting by both teams kept the scoreboard changing.

NOTES — The Tide's offense slowed in the second half but under the boards Curwensville dominated as Sue Decker took control to yank down 12 of her game-high 14 rebounds. Curwensville outrebounded the Vikings 43-38, with Gabrielson leading Glendale with 12 caroms . . . The Tide hit on only 19 percent (14-for-74) of its shots but Glendale's five percent (two-for-42) effort offset that . . . The Vikes committed 43 turnovers, Curwensville had 29 . . . Curwensville also won the JV game 20-16 as Kim Myrter scored seven times. Barb Noel had seven points for Glendale.

On Thursday the Vikes host Clearfield St. Francis while Curwensville visits Northern Cambria, a game Boyle labels as "a very big test for us. We'll have to learn to defense the fast break better because they are pretty fast."

BEAVER VALLEY — The slow start has become a trademark for this year's Clearfield St. Francis girls basketball team.

But so has the comeback.

Again the Fillies came out of the blocks slowly, leading Glendale just 9-7 after one quarter, but they came on strong in the next two periods to blitz the winless Vikettes 47-26 in a Skyline Conference inter-division game last night.

Two of the main characters in the three-guard offense of St. Francis head coach John D. Lazor had fine offensive nights as Caroline Belin connected for 18 points and Lori Minute, the team's high scorer so far this year, added 15.

That was more than

enough to offset a fine 15-point effort by Glendale's Tammy Ford.

And finally, both teams played everybody.

And that's it. After all, St. Francis led 13-0 before Patty Fleming swished a jumper with 2:41 to go in the first quarter, and the Vikettes had just four more field goals the rest of the night.

"The good thing about a game like that was that all the kids got to play, especially the kids who didn't start," agreed Lazor. "They work hard in practice, so they deserve playing time.

"Once again, our defense stood out, which is what we'll need for our remaining games," added Lazor. "It's important that we win our remaining games to get a higher seed in the District 9 Tournament."

For the first year, the District 9 Tournament is open to all classes, and

teams with the best records will draw home games in the first round.

That's fine with Lazor. His team, 10-3 on the season, is 5-1 at home, losing only to DuBois Central Christian.

Glendale, coached by Sherry Slaterbeck, is 0-10 and has lost 22 straight games.

The junior varsity game was a little closer, St. Francis winning 36-22. No team had any scorers in double figures. The Filly jayvees are also 9-4.
