


### Fillies Score School Record 66 Points

St. Francis' 66-point effort, made possible because of 46 Glendale turnovers and the Fillies' 39-28 edge on the boards, is a new single-game scoring

record for the winners.

But none of those numbers seemed to discourage Slaterbeck, who watched her

team lose its 29th straight game.
"I'm pleased with the way the girls are playing," Slaterbeck said. "We've still got a lot of work to do, but our
