The Glendale Lady Vikings earned their first win of the 1983 scholastic basketball season last night in Patton Hall, while the Golden Tide's win column remained unmarked, as the visitors trimmed the hosts 27-23 in an emotional Moshannon Valley League contest.

Glendale sophomore Beth Ann Tiesi demonstrated poise and a nice shooting touch on the court by canning 14 points, including six in each of the first and last quarters.

"It's good to get this first win," Glendale's first-year head coach Andy Bloom commented. "Hopefully, this will bring us along. We still need to work on eliminating some of our mistakes, but the victory will help to build the confidence we need. The girls know now that they can win."

The Tide scored first as senior Jenny Grecco hit the second of a pair of free throws with less than a minute gone in the first quarter. The lead was short-lived, however, because Tiesi drove in for her first bucket a minute later, and Glendale was never behind again, leading 10-7 after the first canto, and 16-12 at the half.

Curwensville pulled to within two points three times in the second half, and had several opportunities to tie the score, but couldn't cash in with the clutch shot.

"I thought we might have a chance when we closed the gap to two," Curwensville mentor Benny Irwin sald, "but we just missed the shots."

Irwin was pleased with his team's effort, though.

"Every girl is giving 101 percent, and I can't ask for any more. It's up to the coaching staff now to correct the fundamental mistakes."

Irwin also praised the efforts of his only returning letterwinner, noting that Greeco tallied 11 points and grabbed 11 rebounds for the second straight game of double figures in that statistical column.

Bloom, meanwhile, was very happy with the play of his young team, especially Tiesi.

"Beth Ann is only a sophomore, and she has improved in her ability to handle pressure situations. She made four of five free throws in the fourth quarter, and that's a lot of pressure to put on an inexperienced player."

Tiesi tallied all six of the Lady Viking's points in the final stanza.

"Seniors Betsy Garman and Sheryl Rydbom also played fine games," Bloom added. "The scorebook can't show the leadership presence they give to the rest of the players. Hopefully, we can spread the scoring around some in the future." Karen Noel pumped in 17 points as Glendale won the preliminary game 20-18. Glendale, 1-3 overall and
