## 1985-1986 Season

### December 5, 1985: Blacklick Valley 53 at Glendale 42 OT

FLINTON — Foul trouble plagued the Glendale High School girls basketball team in their opener last night, enabling visiting Blacklick Valley to escape with a 53-42 victory in overtime.

Glendale coach Andy Bloom lost the five starters to fouls by the end of regulation and had only four Lady Vikings on the court for the final moments of the fourth quarter and the entire extra period.

"With Candace Peterson out with injury, we only have nine players on varsity," Bloom said. "We played very well, particularly on defense.

"The offense certainly needs improvement, but the girls want to work. We will get better. We were aggressive on defense, but not on offense."

Beth Ann Tiesi led all scorers with 20 points, while Michelle Matthews added 10 to pace the Lady Vikes.

Despite having four players on the court at the time, Glendale held a 41-39 lead with seconds left in the fourth period, when Blacklick junior Missy Nairn, who finished with 13 points, rolled a shot around the rim and in to send the game into overtime.

Taking advantage of their "power play," the Blacklick Valley Vikings ran up a 12-1 margin in the overtime.

"The officials were also doing their first game of the year," Bloom said. "The officiating was inconsistent, but it was inconsistent for both sides.

"The girls have to accept that.

"But if we had made some more of our foul shots, it could have been different. It was a learning experience for the kids."

Glendale was 14-for-28 from the foul line, Blacklick Valley 13-for-30.

Debbie Waltemire added 11 points for the winners.

Blacklick Valley won the junior varsity game 24-15.

Glendale hosts another non-league opponent, Juniata Valley, Tuesday.

# Tiesi Shoots, Rebounds Vikings Past Owls

FLINTON — A scintillating performance by Beth Ann Tiesi carried the Glendale High School cagerettes to a 62-40 victory over winless Harmony in their Moshannon Valley League opener last night.

Tiesi scored 29 points and grabbed 25 rebounds for the finest all-around effort by a Progressland basketball player this season.

The 5-8 senior pushed her average above the 20-point mark.

"She moves well without the ball, and she got an awful lot of points on her rebounds," Harmony coach Linda Richards said. "She was putting the ball in the hole.

Karen Noel backed

Tiesi with a season-high 14 points as coach Andy Bloom's Lady Vikings evened their record at 2-2.

Korena Trout paced the Lady Owls with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while Mary Jo Bernard chipped in 12 points.

Harmony, 0-2 in the MVL and 0-3 overall, kept it close through one period, trailing 12-9, but Glendale began to pull away in the second quarter. By halftime, Tiesi had 18 points, two more than the Harmony team, and the hosts led 29-16.

A surge early in the fourth quarter enable the Lady Vikings to open the gap to 20 points.

"Rebounds and turnovers tell the story,"

Richards said.

Glendale had a whopping 60-37 bulge in rebounds and gave up possession 23 times compared to Harmony's 37.

"Our girls are not hitting the boards," Richards said. "That's our big weakness. We don't have a big team, but they should be doing much, much better on rebounding. They know how to box out, but when the ball's in the air, they're not aggressively going for the boards.

"Every team we've played has almost doubled the rebounds on us."

Richards added that the Lady Owls were victimized several times by Lady Viking fast breaks.

Shooting percentages were about even, 37 for

Glendale and 34 for Harmony.

The Lady Vikings will host Williamsburg in a non-league test tomorrow night and play a key early-season MVL game at Curwensville Friday. The Lady Owls will be home against DuBois Central in MVL action Thursday.

Glendale's junior varsity won 13-10.

# Tiesi Nets 29 as Lady Vikings Stop Tide 47-43

CURWENSVILLE — The weather outside was frightful, but the game inside was delightful — for the Glendale High School Lady Vikings.

Riding the 29-point effort of Beth Ann Tiesi, the Lady Vikings put together a solid team effort to down the Curwensville Golden Tide 47-43 in a hotly-contested Moshannon Valley League tilt at

Patton Hall last night.

"We needed this game, and I was proud of our girls' effort," proclaimed Lady Viking coach Andy Bloom after the contest. "We've had a lot of adversity lately, but tonight the team pulled together, used their heads, and played well.

"It's good to be 2-0 in the league right now," added the Glendale mentor.

Glendale punched out an early lead that it would never give up. With a lineup featuring two players up from the jayvee ranks, the Lady Vikings scored the first seven points to set the tone of the game.

Glendale seemed none the worse for the loss of starters Michelle Matthews (flu) and Candace Peterson (knee), as the Lady Vikings worked the ball well through the Tide press, and Tiesi was finding the range. The senior was a questionable starter because of an eye infection, but she burned the cords for 14 first-half points.

Meanwhile, the Lady Viking 1-3-1 defense was putting a damper on Curwensville's fun. The Tide seemed disorganized, and a 19-for-67 shooting performance was the result, as Glendale refused to

let Curwensville run its offense.

Glendale seemed to be outscraping the Tide as well, and Curwensville headed for intermission trailing 24-16, and searching for ways to stop Tiesi.

Curwensville, 1-1 in the MVL, used the third quarter to make its run. The Tide press started to disconcert the Lady Vikings a bit, and Curwensville turned the resulting turnovers into baskets. A free throw and buzzer-beating jumper by Lori Demchak cut the Golden Tide deficit to 34-31 at the end of the third stanza, with the Tide looking to take the lead.

With the outcome of the game hanging in the balance, Glendale responded to the challenge.

A Tiesi jumper boosted the Glendale advantage to 40-34 two minutes into the final period, and seconds later Lady Viking guard Karen Noel stripped Deb Spackman of the ball and flipped it to Tiesi, who converted at the other end.

Curwensville pulled to 42-39 on a Spackman layup, but Glendale shut the door on further Tide advances. As Curwensville resorted to fouling the Lady Vikings in order to gain possession, Glendale converted enough free throws to seal the win, with Sue Turchick

grabbing her own missed free throw and converting the first of two more charity tosses to ice the cake.

A tired but happy Bloom maintained that good teamwork keyed the win. "We had outstanding rebounding to go with our defense," asserted the Glendale coach, "and Patty Callahan turned in a tough game. I was very happy with Lori Swasing and Mary Murray, who are usually jayvee players. They gave us the help we needed to win."

A dejected Curwensville coach Rick Hall said, "We played terribly," with the exception that "Traci Gardner played well."

The Golden Tide, 2-3, will play again tonight, hosting St. Marys.

The 3-3 Lady Vikings will travel to the Claysburg-Kimmel Holiday Tournament Friday and Saturday.

Curwensville won the jayvee game 30-22.

## January 7, 1986: MoValley 46 at Glendale 42

FLINTON — The Moshannon Valley High School girls basketball team has served notice that it's not about to give up the Moshannon Valley League title the 1984-85 Black Damsels won without a fight.

Although only one starter returns from that 21-3 squad, the Black Damsels jumped to a 3-1 league slate with last night's 46-42 win over Glendale.

First-year head coach Mick Patkalitsky's Damsels took second place away from the Lady Vikings, who dropped to 2-1. West Branch leads at 3-0.

Kelly Gossar led the Black Damsels with 18 points and 16 rebounds, while Lori Cervenak and Amy Lloyd had 11 points apiece.

Beth Ann Tiesi was high for coach Andy Bloom's Lady Vikings with 17 points. Karen Noel added 10.

"It was a typical Mo Valley-Glendale game, close and hard-fought," Patkalitsky said.

The pace was slow in the first half, which ended with the Black Damsels ahead 19-12.

"In the third quarter, they came out a little more aggressive and we were a little tentative," Patkalitsky said.

That combination enabled Glendale to run off 11 consecutive points for a 23-19 lead before Mo Valley settled down. When the period was history, the game was deadlocked 32-32.

Tiesi, held to one point in the first 16 minutes, led Glendale's surge with eight points.

"She really came at us," Patkalitsky. "It could have been a complete blowout (in the third quarter) except for Cervenak. She had nine points."

Gossar, a 5-11 sophomore, was the heroine for Mo Valley in the fourth quarter with 10 points, including a pair of free throws that put the visitors ahead to stay and a field goal that provided the insurance.

Mo Valley shot 41 percent, 19-for-47, in balancing its season record at 3-3. A 27.3 percent night, 15-for-55, was a big reason Glendale fell below .500 at 4-5.

Both teams will play MVL games tomorrow night, the Knights hosting DuBois Central and the Lady Vikings trekking to Barnesboro to test Northern Cambria.

ALLPORT—It was a performance that wouldn't win a local hoop shoot competition, but the West Branch Area High School girls basketball team will take it, anyway.

Both the Lady Warriors and the visiting Glendale Lady Vikings did little damage to the nets during their key Moshannon Valley League scrap last night.

However, the Lady Warriors managed to limp home to a 36-29 victory to claim a share of the league lead with Moshannon Valley at 5-1 and relegate Glendale to third place at 4-2.

The limping belonged mainly to West Branch's Elizabeth Bedner, who did not suit up for the game due to a sprained ankle incurred in practice the night before.

Coach Stan Solarczyk chose junior Barb Buck to run the West Branch offense, and Glendale responded by opening the game with a full-court press. Glendale tried to take advantage of the Lady Warriors' depleted ballhandling capabilities, with some success.

Karen Noel picked off two early steals and

cached in at the opposite end both times to give the Lady Vikings a 6-5 lead. Patty Callahan added a free throw, and Glendale led by two as the first quarter expired.

Glendale's defense was the key to making the two-point lead stand through the first half. With Bedner out, the Lady Vikings concentrated on keeping the ball away from Jenny Hoffman.

Unfortunately, Glendale could do little at its own end of the floor, as the shots were there for the taking, but they weren't going in. West Branch tied the game three times in the second quarter before Noel hit from the corner to set Glendale's halftime edge at 15-13.

When Lady Viking Candace Peterson hit a turnaround to open the second half, the Lady Vikes hoped to light up the scoreboard a little more. But this was not to be, as Wanda Mollura cashed consecutive offensive rebounds for West Branch to knot the score again, and Hoffman put the Lady Warriors in the lead.

Beth Ann Tiesi answered from outside for Glendale, but the

Lady Viking shooting fortunes quickly turned sour again. Glendale added insult to injury by not rebounding their misses, and the Lady Warriors inched to a 25-21 advantage after three periods.

As the final quarter unwound, only the play of Tiesi kept the West Branch margin from widening. The Lady Viking senior popped for five points in two minutes to keep Glendale within one at 27-26, but Hoffman countered with a bucket and added a free throw at the halfway mark in the stanza to put the Lady Warriors in the driver's seat. Mollura contributed another basket and Buck bounced in a free throw to seal the Lady Vikings' fate at 36-29 and send them home 6-6 overall.

"I was pleased with the play of Barb Buck" offered West Branch coach Stan Solarczyk. "She seemed to stay cool through it all."

"We seemed to press a little too much early in the game," added Solarczyk, "but we were more settled in the second half. We also rebounded well, and that seemed to be the turning point of the game."

Glendale coach Andy Bloom felt that the Lady

Vikings' 12-for-66 shooting performance doomed his team.

"Our defense was good, but our shooting was horrendous," stated the Lady Viking boss. "We won't win games by shooting 18 percent from the field, and our foul shooting was not much better."

"It would have been a nice game to win, but we're by no means out of the league," added Bloom.

Hoffman took game scoring honors with 16 points, followed by Mollura with 13. The Lady Warriors were 13-for-50 from the floor and won the battle of the boards 46-26.

Tiesi scored 13 points to lead Glendale.

The 10-1 Lady Warriors will try to pad their league record Monday night at DuBois Central Christian. Glendale has a week off before hosting Northern Cambria Thursday in another MVL tilt.

Nikki Mann's 11 points paced West Branch to a 22-17 jayvee win.

EBENSBURG — Conemaugh Valley showed

why it's the top-seeded Class A team for the District 6 Girls Basketball Playoffs in sidetracking Glendale 69-35 at Central Cambria High School last night.

The Lady Blue Jays, rebounding from Saturday night's tough 44-41 loss to Marion Center in the Appalachian Conference championship playoff, made it a long night for the Lady Vikings with their up-tempo style of play in the tourney opener.

The winners were off and running at every opportunity and constantly kept pressure on the Moshannon Valley League team on defense.

"They're definitely a good team," Glendale coach Andy Bloom said. "Of course, we have to consider this is their first year in A. They've been AA for years, so I would say they're a top A team."

Conemaugh Valley, which was 22-5 last season, showed plenty of firepower in carving out its 20th victory in 23 games, shooting 47.5 percent with 28 field goals in 59 attempts.

Senior guard Donna Podoletz was high with 20 points, several on fastbreaks, while sophomore power forward Jeanine Tyler muscled her inside way for 15 and junior center Teri Menett contributed 14.

They padded their totals in the fourth period when coach Don Roberts stayed with his regulars, making no substitutions and keeping the full-court

Conemaugh Valley tallied seven points in the last 1:14 of the first quarter to seize control at 18-7 and continually widened the gap after that.

Tiesi, the school's all-time scoring leader with 854 points, wound up with 14 and Karen Noel added 10 for the Lady Vikings,

who shot 26.8 percent, 15-for-56.

Conemaugh Valley out-rebounded Glendale 41-23 with Laura Pollino grabbing 11 and Tyler and Menett pulling down 10 apiece.

Bloom was neither disappointed nor discouraged by his team's effort.

"My kids played with pride," he said. "They kept their cool and didn't get totally upset with the way things were going."

"They kept hustling and trying to do what we intended to do. They played hard for 32 minutes, so I have no complaints."

"I'd like to thank the five seniors — Tiesi, Matthews, (Sue) Turchick, (Candace) Peterson and (Patty) Callahan — for the three years we worked together."

The Lady Vikings finished 9-13.

The Lady Blue Jays will move on to the semifinals on Thursday, when they will on the winner of tonight's game between Homer-Center and Blacklick Valley.
