"Everyone contributed well for us," Mo Valley coach Mick Patkalitsky said. "Our three guards sacrificed their game to feed the ball inside and were very unselfish."

The Lady Vikings were not about to go unheard from, however, as Karen Noel used quick steals off of a trapping press and long range shooting to pull her team back to within two points at the end of the first eight minutes 12-10.

The Mo Valley squad seemed to get more comfortable in breaking the press in the se-

cond quarter, which enabled them to increase their lead behind Gossar and Amy Lloyd, who combined for the team's 13 points in the frame for a 25-16 halftime advantage.

"Amy and Allison Lloyd and Tracey Jones did a very good job handling the ball out front," Patkalitsky said. "They were patient and didn't force anything."

Gossar again paced the Damsels in the third stanza picking up what points she didn't get off of passes from rebounds as Glendale couldn't find its way back from a third quarter score of 44-27 and wouldn't score at all in the final period.

"We had no way of getting back into the game," Lady Viking coach Rick Stackhouse said. "Especially when we didn't score in the fourth quarter."

"Gossar played very well. Even when we kept the passes from getting inside she would convert an offensive rebound."

Noel finished the game with a scrappy 15 points for the Vikings.

Backing Gossar's record setting effort for Mo Valley was Amy Lloyd with 12 points.

"It's good to win a game like this especially against a rival team," Patkalitsky said. "The girls are starting to play with more emotion and that's what we have to have to stay effective."

The junior varsity contest reversed the outcome as Glendale posted a 54-12 win. Lisa Callahan netted 24 points for the winners with Stacey Muse adding 11.
