Lady Vikes Have Quality, Not Quantity

After two years as an assistant, Ford has some talent on hand but must overcome a lack of experi-

ence by her reserves.

"We don't have much depth. We're very young. The five starters have to pull the slack. Hopefully what they do will rub off on the young kids," Ford commented.

Glendale's starting frontcourt figures to be junior Brenda Braniff, tallest player on the team at 5-8, and sophomore Jen

Wagner.

Ford will go with a three-guard attack, anchored by sophomore Sherri Frisco and seniors Lisa Callahan and Jenny Keith.

Producing a balance of inside and outside play is a key, accord-

ing to Ford.

We have to be able to get the ball inside and our guards have to be able to penetrate and make things happen. So far we haven't been able to do that," Ford said.

The Lady Viking guards will be

counted on to provide an up-tempo offense, according to Ford. "We want to run the floor."

After the five letter winners there is virtually no experience on the Glendale squad, but Ford said it is vital that the substitutes she does use make contributions.

"Nicole Smith (5-7 sophomore) and Jennifer Koteas (5-6 freshman) are my first two subs and they must come through,"

Ford noted.

In spite of the lack of depth, Ford is genuinely upbeat about the chances of her Lady Vikings entering the new season.

"If we execute well and come to win we should do very well. The potential is there for a good season if we execute," Ford said.

Glendale hits the court again Thursday night when they host the Bellwood-Antis Lady Blue Devils.
