Glendale then responded with baskets from Amy Kephart, Angie Frisco and Angie Kauffman to knot it up with about a minute left in the period.

Lutz then sank a foul shot to finish out the period with the Lady Cardinals ahead 7-6.

Lutz continued to keep Du-Bois Central in the game, scoring six of the Lady Cardinals eight points in the second period. Glendale, however, spread out the scoring with four points from Jean Terza and a basket from Bernie Depto off the bench.

A Depto layup just before the buzzer put the Lady Vikes up 33-10 heading into the locker room.

With major ground to make up, the Lady Owls came out shooting. Val Fry canned a layup midway through the third to cut the score to 37-15. However, Frisco hit her second trey of the night just before the end of the quarter to push Glendale's lead to 44-17.

With the game in hand, Bloom decided to sit his starting five.

"We got to rest some kids, and that could be important over the next few days," he remarked.


Thompson then cut it to 10-9 in the second quarter, but an Angie Frisco jumper at the 3:20 mark gave the Lady Vikes a
